### Reflection

Epiphany is alluring not because of the mysterious and enigmatic astrologers that take center stage in today's story, but because of the story's mythical reality. A myth is not concerned so much with historical accuracy or if and what really happened, as much

as it attempts to draw us into the experience of the story by revealing its deeper meaning. Not by giving us exact details, but by luring us into what is trying to be conveyed and communicated in it's mystical-allegory. All of us, at one time or another, have known that spark in our lives which draws us into a quest for the meaning of life and as a result, like those mysterious strangers from the east in today's Gospel, we find that we cannot remain where we are, but we are enticed to travel beyond ourselves seeking the meaning of the star that appears to us. Like the magi we too set out on a journey to discover the meaning of our lives and try to make sense of the cosmos we experience. Perhaps at one time or another along our journey, we may lose that spark or get side tracked or find that the wonder has faded and we are induced to "remain with the old," becoming stale in the winter cold. We begin to lose sight of God's star and the glimpse of something shinning bright in our lives, which shadows our quest toward God and prevents that wonderful grace that gives us a great sense of adventure. Life becomes something in which ... "there is nothing new under the sun, the moon, and the stars."

Today's feast is a wake-up call. It is a mythical reminder that as God's People we are called continuously on a quest for life and the story of these visitors to the Christ-Child is a way of conveying to us that the adventure is never at an end. God is forever calling us forward. The star is always there in our lives. It may have dimmed, we may not notice it or perhaps we may have even strayed from the route that the star is trying to lead us, but it is in fact precisely this wonderful story of dreams, camels, King Herod, the gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh, that announces that wherever we may find ourselves, God continues to invite us beyond ourselves. We adjoin ourselves to these mysterious figures from the east to renew once again the quest of understanding life and how God born into our experience gives us the impetus and spark to search for him once again.

There will always be uncertainty about whether the route we travel may be the right one or even the best for us, but risk always accompanies a journey. The Magi set out uncertain of where the star would take them, what they might confront, what they would have to face, and what they would eventually discover, but this did not deter them. They ventured out and discovered, to their amazement, the gift of God himself. We simply cannot be the Herods of today. There are too many of them around! Their fear is contagious and deceptive. It anesthetizes us and fools us to think that the best thing is to make sure nothing new and exciting upsets what we feel we have under our control. Like Herod, fear can destroy us. Herod was self-destructive and it led him to make choices that skewed his ability to embrace life. Today, once again, God places a star in our lives. We just need to refuse to be "a Herod" and not allow the Herods of today to deter us from looking up and noticing that God is still with us and continues to entice and invite us to something more surprising. The warning the astrologers received in a dream is the same message given to us today: ... do not return to Herod (Matthew 2). In other words, God does not want us to go back where we came from, but be willing to take a different route. Epiphany reminds us not to stick our heads in the clouds. God clears the sky so we are able to see the star, which becomes brighter with each passing day to those who are willing to follow it's lead until, at least, like the Magi; it comes to rest in the heart of God. What an unbelievable quest this can be! Are you ready? Get up ... now look up ... and let's get going...Now is the time!



### **Holy Innocents**

In the Second Chapter of the Book of Matthew is recorded the story of the Massacre of the Holy Innocents, during the reign of Herod the Great, the Governor of Galilee. Magi saw the Star of Bethlehem and went to Jerusalem asking where the new King of Jews may be found. Herold called the high priests to find out about this child, and was informed that it was prophesied that the child would be born in Judea. Herold sent for the Magi and told them to report back to him when they found the child so he too could worship him. It was revealed to the Magi in a dream not to return to Herold, so they returned home by another route. Meanwhile, Joseph who was visited by an angel in a dream, and was told of Herod's intention, took Mary and the child and fled to Egypt. Herod became enraged at the Magi's betrayal and or-

dered all innocent children two years and younger to be slaughtered.

This year, the Feast of the Holy Innocents was celebrated on Thursday, December 28th and the Feast of the Holy Family was celebrated on Friday, December 30th. It has been the tradition at Saint Angela to remember those individuals and families who have lost a child at one of these two feast days. Since the Feasts of the Holy Innocents and the Holy Family occured on a weekday, we recall the Feast of the Holy Innocents TODAY on the Feast of the Epiphany, at all the Eucharists. We will honor the memory of those individuals and families that have experience the loss of a child. Vigil candles will be placed near the Baptismal Font. Following the homily, individuals and families who have experienced the loss of a child, will be invited to ritually place a candle by the infant Jesus in the Crèche, as we recall, pray, and entrust to God, what is sometimes very hard to express in words. May God heal any family memories we have experienced through the loss of a child. This Christmas Season, no child, whether they have died or are no longer with us is ever forgotten.

#### The Feast of the Holy Innocents: A Prayer

Holy Innocents, you died before you were old enough to know what life means, pray for all children who die young that God may gather them into his loving arms. Holy Innocents, you were killed because one man was filled with hatred, pray for those who hate, that God may touch their hearts and fill them with love. Holy Innocents, you experienced a violent death, pray for all who are affected by violence that they may find peace and love. Holy Innocents, you were murdered by those who probably felt they were merely following orders, pray for all who act against their consciences that they may have the strength to do what is right. Holy Innocents, those around you certainly felt helpless to prevent your deaths, pray for all who feel helpless in their circumstances that they may cling to God for courage and hope. Holy Innocents, you died as infants and toddlers, pray for those who are in danger of dying or may be victims of abortion. Holy Innocents, your parents grieved for you with deep and lasting sorrow, pray for all parents who have lost young children that God may wrap a warm blanket of comfort around them. Holy Innocents, you did not know Jesus during your brief lives, but now you praise him for all eternity, pray for all those who do not know Jesus that they may open their minds to his voice and their hearts to his love. Holy Innocents, you who are now in heaven, pray for all of us that one day we may join you there to bask in God's love forever.






