## ORDINARY TIME... AND OUR LENTEN PARISH MISSION

Last Sunday was the Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord Jesus. That marked the end of the Christmas season. Right after that we entered into Ordinary Time. The Feast of the Baptism signifies a transition in the life of Jesus: one from his infancy/hidden life to his public life and ministry. And with that, our liturgical calendar also transitions from Christmas into Ordinary Time—the season in which we hear about the public ministry of the Lord: his healing miracles, his preaching, his encounters with tax collectors and sinners and religious leaders, etc.

What is special about Ordinary Time is that it is anything but *ordinary*. Here it is necessary to call to mind the central mystery of all our liturgical celebrations: the Paschal Mystery, which is about the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Each season of the liturgical year (other than Ordinary Time) emphasizes a particular aspect of the Paschal Mystery. For example, in Advent we remember the two-fold coming of the Jesus: his first coming as a baby and his final coming as the Supreme Judge. The season of Christmas focuses on the birth of the Savior. In the Lenten season, especially in Holy Week, we emphasize the passion/death of Jesus. And the Easter season celebrates in a special way his resurrection from the dead... Now Ordinary Time does *not* just



focus on any one particular aspect of the Paschal Mystery, but on the totality of the Mystery. Having said all that, we must also remember that every single liturgical celebration is about the fullness of the Paschal Mystery, regardless of the season. Moreover, the different liturgical seasons of the year are connected; just as the different aspects of the Paschal Mystery are also intimately related. For instance, it would NOT be improper to speak about the death of Jesus during the Christmas season; or of his resurrection during Holy Week. This is because the different aspects of the Paschal Mystery (life, death, resurrection, etc.) always go together as one movement and cannot be separated... In the end, Ordinary Time is not just *ordinary*: it is also a very special season.

We shall go through Ordinary Time for just a few weeks until we come to the Lenten season. This year Lent starts very early: on February 10. We are very fortunate to have a parish mission this Lent with Fr. Tom McCarthy. **I would like to take this opportunity to invite ALL parishioners of St. Angela Merici to attend the mission talks.** The theme of the mission will be: *The Sacraments, the Treasures of Our Faith*. Fr. Tom will preach at all the masses on the first Sunday of Lent: February 13-14. His mission talks will be on Monday-Tuesday-Wednesday, February 15-17: both in the morning (9 AM) and evening (7 PM). You can come to either the morning or the evening sessions.

I really encourage all parishioners to come to his talks. Fr. Tom is a very dynamic speaker. He has given retreats and missions all over the country. Here in the Diocese of Orange, Fr. Tom has led missions at St. John Neumann my former parish, at St. Timothy in Laguna Niguel, and St. Columban in Garden Grove. Parishioners have found his talks very inspiring and helpful for their spiritual lives... We are still very much in this New Year. And shortly we shall begin the season of Lent. Please start your New Year and your Lenten season, especially in this **Jubilee Year of Mercy**, on a good note by attending our parish mission. May God bless you all!

## Response Procedures Quick Reference Guide

George Ullrich, our *Emergency Awareness Coordinator at Saint Angela* has created a detailed *Emergency Plan* for our parishioners in the event of a natural disaster. The next few weeks we will be presenting our *Parish Plan* in segments. Please take the time to review the document. Often we do not adequately prepare ourselves. Be pro-active and prepare! Be ready for unexpected so all of us will be knowledgeable of how to respond in an event of emergency.

### Second in the Series

#### ARMED ASSAULT OR INTRUDER

- Stay calm. Call 911 only when you're sure you will not be heard by intruder and provide exact location, nature of emergency, number, description and location of assailants and number of known victims. Remain in contact with law enforcement in order to provide updates. If possible, another staff member should call the NMUSD Superintendent's office at (714) 424-5031 and share initial details of the emergency.
- Upon first indication of an armed assault, personnel should immediately initiate the RUN, HIDE, ACT policy (see section 18. Protective Action – RUN, HIDE, ACT). Do not attempt to take your car. Walk several blocks away or go home.
  - Stay close to walls and avoid wide open areas
  - If there is shooting, run in a zig-zag pattern.
  - If possible, lock or barricade yourself in a room that has limited visibility from the intruder.
  - Quiet all individuals in the building and remain still.
  - Do not move until advised that it is safe to do so by law enforcement personnel or someone trusted.
- If taken hostage, be patient, cooperative, calm and quiet (look for an opportunity to escape).
  - Speak only when spoken to and give brief answers. Maintain eye contact.
- Be observant of the intruder's description and possible weapons or bomb, but don't be obvious.
- Stall for time, follow instructions of person with weapon and watch for possible chance to escape.
- Don't risk harm to yourself or others.
- If law enforcement notifies OLQA of an armed assailant or dangerous police activity in the area, personnel will initiate SHELTER-IN-PLACE, LOCKDOWN and/or EVACUATIONS (see section 17. & 18. Protective Actions).
- In a critical incident, law enforcement response will be immediate and focused on-site and staff should follow the directions of the law enforcement and Incident Leader.
- At the direction of the Incident Leader, the following steps may be taken;
  - Conduct a survey to account for all persons including staff, students and visitors.
  - Provide or render First Aid.
  - Assist in verifying the number of injured and potential casualties.



# Response Procedures Quick Reference Guide

(Continuation)

## AIRCRAFT CRASH

- Call "911" and provide the exact location (e.g., building or area), nature of emergency and number of known victims.
- The Incident Leader will initiate DUCK AND COVER, SHELTER-IN-PLACE, EVACUATE BUILDING, or OFF-SITE EVACUATION (See guide 17. & 18. Protective Actions).
- If EVACUATE BUILDING is initiated, evacuate the buildings using prescribed or safe routes to the Assembly Area. The Incident Leader will take attendance at the Assembly Area.
- If on OLQA property, secure the crash area to prevent unauthorized access.
- Determine number of persons injured or missing and extent of injuries.
- Assign volunteers to keep parking areas clear and direct emergency vehicles to the emergency site.
- Any affected areas will not be reopened until the Newport Beach Police Dept./Fire Dept., O.C. Health Dept. or appropriate agency provides clearance and the Incident Leader issues authorization.
- If it is unsafe to remain on the property, the Incident Leader will initiate an OFF-SITE EVACUATION if warranted by changes in conditions.

## MOTOR VEHICLE CRASH

- Call "911" and provide exact location (e.g., building, area), nature of emergency and number of known victims.
- The Incident Leader will initiate appropriate Immediate Protective Actions which may include DUCK AND COVER, SHELTER-IN-PLACE, EVACUATE BUILDING, or OFF-SITE EVACUATION (see guide 17. & 18. Protective Actions).
- If the Incident Leader issues the EVACUATE BUILDING action, use prescribed routes or other safe routes to the Assembly Area.
- In an EVACUATION, take attendance at the Assembly Area to account for missing individuals.
- Secure the crash area to prevent unauthorized access.
- Organize fire suppression activities until the Fire Department arrives.
- Check for injuries and provide appropriate first aid.
- Any affected areas will not be reopened until the Fire or Police Dept. provides clearance and the Incident Leader issues authorization to do so.
- The Incident Leader will initiate an OFF-SITE EVACUATION if warranted by changes in conditions.


## DISORDERLY CONDUCT OR SUSPICIOUS PERSON

- Disorderly Conduct or suspicious person may involve an individual exhibiting threatening, suspicious or irrational behavior. If the person is armed, refer to guide 3. ARMED ASSAULT OR INTRUDER.
- Inquire as to their purpose in visiting OLQA or if you can be of help.
- If suicidal thoughts are expressed:
  - Assume the threat is real and if by phone, try to determine their location without being direct. Provide phone number of caller to authorities if able to capture it.
  - Ask "Do you have a plan? How and when are you planning on doing it? Are you planning to do it now?"
  - If threat is real or immediate, call 911 or ask another person to call 911.
  - If threat is not immediate, don't be afraid to enter discussion in a quiet, but public space.
- If you're in the church and unable to deescalate the situation, notify a priest or Usher.
- If you're in the parish center and unable to deescalate the situation, seek the help of another staff member by using the code word "immediately" in your request.
- Attempt to isolate the person in a quiet, but public space. Deescalate emotions using the buddy system and CARE method:
  - CALM – Take time to listen; respond in a soft, even-toned and non-judgmental voice. Be friendly, supportive and approachable. Maintain eye contact and personal space. If agitated, talking and/or walking can release agitation, but don't touch; if sad, touch can be helpful, but be careful of parameters.
  - ASSESS – Is there danger present such as verbal threats, suicidal thinking, a weapon or means for harm?
  - RESPOND – If danger is present, push panic button or call 911 and solicit help from another person by using the code word "immediately". Stand up to keep situation in your control and ask open ended questions such as "How would you like me to help you?" Listen for feelings and empathize with them using statements such as "Let's work together to figure something out" or "That must be so hard, how can I help?" Determine if situation is urgent. Do not try to provide counseling or intervention if not trained.
  - EMPOWER – Listen to the story and affirm positive steps. Provide resources/referrals available, but let them determine what action to take.
- If you've tried to help and it appears you cannot help, use the panic button if you haven't already done so, then request the person step outside or leave the property. Avoid any hostile situations.
