

Reflection

All of us receive invitations to attend gatherings: Dinner, a game, a celebration, or to simply get together for a cup of coffee or a cocktail. Each of these requests for the "honor of our presence" whether it is expressed formally or if it is a casual spontaneous gesture, does not come without certain demands and obligations. For example, how are we to dress for the occasion? What do we need to bring?

Are we expected to bring a gift? Who will be there? Who will be treating? How will this affect my day, time, and other commitments? These unsaid expectations shape what is entailed once an invitation is extended. Embracing an occasion whether it is formal or spontaneous may stay our excitement by the prospect of what it means to be invited.

All of us would like to think that we have heard and accepted Jesus' invitation to a shared life with him. For the most part we have, however I wonder if we really have reflected that even Jesus' invitation comes with its demands. The reason I say this is because we are often taken-aback or surprised when we discover the ramifications of what it means to respond to Jesus. Following Jesus does have the prospect that we will be open to be transformed in the process of enfolding his call. There is no separation between the invitation and the demands that accompany it: ...Repent for the kingdom of heaven is at hand (Matthew 4), and sometimes this expectation of Jesus can throw a real curve into our perception of how we perceive what it means to follow Jesus. *Jesus' invitation always implies the need to change our lives from what we are to what Jesus wants us to become.* This is not an easy task!

Jesus extends an invitation to Peter and Andrew and the story tells us that ... *they left their nets and followed him* (Matthew 4), but I am not sure whether Peter or Andrew or even those of us listening to this account realize the ramifications of ... *leaving our nets* (Matthew 4). This small little reference has tremendous importance. The lives of Peter and Andrew will no longer be the same. Their livelihood will shift from being fishermen to become "fishers of others." One can hardly imagine how this might have turned their lives up-side-down, not to mention the effect on their families and those whose survival depended on their trade. I do not think it takes much imagination to piece together the scenario of how everyone reacted to the turn of events. We cannot presume everyone embraced Peter and Andrew's decision to accept Jesus' invitation. Their lives, their frame of reference will shift as a result of this change. Not everyone would have been as excited as Peter and Andrew at this prospect.

If this little reference does not underscore the expectation of a "change of life" when Jesus extends an invitation then we have clearly missed the point of what he is asking of us. Jesus' invitation seems to have the uncanny knack of consistently "asking more of us" than what we anticipated. Perhaps the challenge before us is to first ask ourselves exactly what Jesus is asking of us beyond the "invitation" and what it will take to get ourselves to "drop our nets," and anything it may canvas which prevents us from truly hearing what Jesus' invitation demands of us. No doubt if we start with these questions, then maybe Jesus' request to ... *come after me* (Matthew 4) might be clearer and the invitation may not seem so outrageous.



BEYOND THE MATTER OF MERCY

In the world of math and science, which is the prevailing paradigm in the West, we are locked into an endless cycle of causality, where the actions of today determine all possible future outcomes. Having just celebrated the Jubilee Year of Mercy, one of the things we may have realized is that mercy disrupts that unyielding yoke of cause and effect. *Mercy permits our potential to be vastly more than our past ought to allow. In the light of mercy, our past is not our potential.*

We suggested that *mercy is surrendering the right to be right*. When mercy is extended to any given situation, space is created within that moment, which allows hope to enter in and create alternative possibilities to any set of consequences. Mercy relieves the burden of validating our "rightness" and permits relationships to survive the lockstep consequences of cause and effect. In actuality, mercy allows us to matter and relationships to matter more than predetermined sets of prescribed outcomes. This notion is radical to some and upsets many people. In effect, the Year of Mercy put the exclamation point on our Parish 50th Anniversary theme of "I Matter."

As we enter into the post-jubilee period, perhaps it would be appropriate to realize that *Now Is The Time* for us to be, make, and know the difference we want to see in our world by practicing MERCY, MUTUALITY, and MINDFULNESS. Surrendering the right to be right is MERCY. Realizing that I Matter and You Matter, is the primary basis of MUTUALITY—in other words nobody is irrelevant and everyone is someone we should know and value. MINDFULNESS is based on the First Commandment: "Thou shalt have no other Gods before me." We have been conditioned to think of graven images and idolatry with this commandment—but in terms of our predilection to judgment and righteousness, perhaps it could easily refer to our inflated sense of self—mindfulness would then suggest being profoundly aware that we are not God, nor do we speak on behalf of God, however convinced we may be of our own veracity. This is a subtle but important aspect of being spiritually aware. Now is the time to realize the rich possibilities that are unfolding before us.

One of the things that modern physics has revealed is that the universe is highly relational. One of the discoveries is a phenomenon known as "entanglement." This is essentially a state where two subatomic particles come in contact with one another, after which they have a permanent linkage with one another and possibly influence one another forever. That sounds a great deal like a "relationship." If that is so, then from the Blessed Trinity to the quantum level of the universe, relationship is a fundamental characteristic of existence.

Considering the world we live in, then now is the time to truly understand the importance of relationship in dealing with ourselves, with one another and with God. MERCY, MUTUALITY, and MINDFULNESS may well become the basis for our human and spiritual relationships. As we begin the scriptural study of the Gospel of St. Matthew, this awareness may become increasingly important in unlocking an underlying message contained within the pages as they are proclaimed at mass. We might ask ourselves: *What is the relationship message God may be inviting me to explore in this passage?* Perhaps you may wish to put that question off for a while, but it may be more urgent than we presently realize. As we awake to the possibilities of this new year, we might consider that **NOW IS THE TIME.**




