

Reflection

... unless your righteousness exceeds that of the Scribes and Pharisees you will not enter the Kingdom of Heaven ... (Matthew 5). Ouch! The Scribes and Pharisees were the religious elite of Jewish life. They were the priests, the readers, and the theological scholars. They interpreted the Hebrew

Scriptures and taught how to integrate and apply them to the daily living of the Jewish community. For example, work on the Sabbath was forbidden, but how much work was forbidden? Could one cook food, light a fire or how far could one walk before it became work? This was the nature of the debate that accompanied their discussions and often their interpretation would trickle down as a ruling that overshadowed the lives of the people. The scholars of the law were often caught up in the minutia of making sure the rules were never, ever broken that they would impose regulations that would assure the law was maintained under all circumstances.

The Scribes and Pharisees were always posing questions to Jesus with an edge to trick or to catch him teaching others to break the law. In today's word we see how Jesus really gets worked up about the Pharisees and the Scribes. In essence he states, these are the ones who study the Law so closely day and night, researching how to follow it perfectly and states our righteousness should go beyond and even exceed the caretakers of the Law. Yikes! Jesus does not stop. He keeps going and reveals a more challenging dimension to the taste of the rules: ... *you have heard it said 'you shall not murder' but what I say is it is just as engender anger, hatred, and bearing a grudge (Matthew 5).* What Jesus is making very clear is that it does not matter if we are making the right sacrifices if we harbor resentment and unfinished business. Jesus does not stop and continues ... *you have heard it said carry out the vows you make to God. Do not swear by anything (Matthew 5).* In essence what Jesus is saying is it is not just your outward actions that make a difference. Don't swear by anything Jesus states. Just tell the truth, straight from your heart. *What is in your heart is what really matters!* What Jesus is doing is taking the rules and the imposed burdens of the Scribes and the Pharisees and shifting the emphasis from our actions to our intentions: ... *your righteousness must exceed that of the Scribes and Pharisees (Matthew 5)* because it is no longer just about what your body is doing, but your heart.

Jesus turns the observance of the Law into a great challenge to love: The kind of love that leads to reconciliation. A love that releases anger even toward our enemies. It is the kind of love that creates connection and understands that is not just about lustng after someone, but recognizing humanity in everyone. It is the kind of love that leads to mercy and compassion and recognizes when you are in the position of power you can either ruin someone's life or save it. It is the kind of love that creates honesty and vulnerability and allows us to tell the truth that does not hide behind laws and vows but dare to say what we mean and mean what we say. This is the life God begs us to choose. Life is hard and it is a challenge to live the love Jesus is advocating. It is certainly harder than a life of laws where we know who is in and who is out. It is a love beyond following the law to its finite detail. It is about choosing life over distrust, manipulation, objectification and heartbreak. It is about being honest and vulnerable, intentional, and compassionate. It is about loving right from the heart!



The real history of Valentine's Day is not comprised of roses, chocolates and pretty cards. Instead, crime, imprisonment and execution are at the genesis of our modern day love fest, dating back to the man whose martyrdom may have inspired the holiday. Our Valentine holiday likely comes from a priest during the Third Century under Emperor Claudius II. The Roman Empire was experiencing massive turmoil at the time. Dubbed by scholars, as the *Crisis of the Third Century*, this period saw the empire divide into three competing states, with the threat of invasion all around.

Claudius made the unpopular decision to ban marriage among young people, believing that unmarried soldiers fought better than married soldiers. With the Roman Empire hanging by a thread, Claudius needed all the brazen war power he could get. This is where Valentine comes in who believed marriage to be a God-given sacrament. Valentine began officiating marriages. He was eventually caught, imprisoned and tortured for

performing marriage ceremonies against the command of Emperor Claudius the Second. One of the men who was to judge him in line with the Roman law at the time was a man called Asterius, whose daughter was blind. He was supposed to have prayed with and healed the young girl with such astonishing effect that Asterius himself became Christian as a result. In the year 269 AD, Valentine was sentenced to a three part execution of a beating, stoning, and finally decapitation all because of his stand for Christian marriage. The story goes that the last words he wrote were in a note to Asterius' daughter. He inspired today's romantic missives by signing it. Tobin describes Valentine's fate: The priest was eventually beheaded and then named a martyr by the Church because he gave up his life to perform the Sacrament of Marriage for the sake of love and love of God. Valentine's martyrdom has not gone unnoticed by the general public. In fact, White Friars Church is one of three churches that claim to house the remains of Valentine. Today, many people make the pilgrimage to the church to honor the courage and memory of this Christian Saint. Valentine is also the patron saint of beekeepers and epilepsy, and of course is called upon to watch over the lives of lovers, but also for the plague, fainting and traveling. As you might expect, he's also the Patron Saint of engaged couples and happy marriages.

Brea Centennial Parade & Picnic

Brea is about to turn 100 so it's time to celebrate! The Centennial Parade & Picnic is a perfect outlet for lively, upbeat expressions of hometown friendship and pride!

Centennial Picnic



Non-stop entertainment and activities will make the Brea Centennial Picnic a historic gathering. On **Saturday, February 18**, the **Brea Sports Park** becomes the perfect setting for all of the outdoor fun from **11:00 AM to 4:00 PM**. During the festivities, churches from the Brea Ministerial Association including St. Angela's will provide hospitality with food booths offering **1917 prices**.

As the community gathers to celebrate the 100 year milestone, the USC Marching Trojan Band will close out the parade and kick off the afternoon. Live musical performances, acrobats, a classic car show, games and a children's petting zoo will allow for all ages to enjoy the festivities. There will also be several baseball games, including a re-enactment of the legendary Babe Ruth vs. Walter Johnson Brea exhibition match-up that took place in Brea in 1924.

On stage, entertainers include Surfin': A Tribute to the Beach Boys, plus the band, Yard Sale, a Brea Fest favorite. Brea's Korean Sister City will present a daring exhibition of acrobats representing Anseong. Performers for Hanno, Japan will be Taiko Drummers and Lagos de Moreno, Mexico will feature Folklorico. Brea's Youth Theatre will be onstage and the Brea Gaslight Chorus will roam the Park and add to the musical atmosphere. The Brea Ministerial Association has coordinated at least fifteen different community based churches to serve food, drinks and treats as well as games, a photo booth and a petting zoo. Souvenir merchandise; shirts, caps, magnets and patches, will be available for sale. There will be an opportunity to pick up information about Brea's unique history and alumni from Brea Olinda High School will be checking in to catch up with old friends. Guests are encouraged to bring folding lawn chairs or picnic blankets and make themselves comfortable for the afternoon. There will be no on-site parking, however, as a courtesy Beckman Coulter, Inc. has invited attendees to use their lot at the northeast corner of Birch and Kraemer. The Brea Sports Park is located at 3333 East Birch Street or you may park at St. Angela Merici Parish School located one block south on Walnut Ave.

Centennial Parade

Beckman Coulter will host public parking at their lot on the southeast corner of Kraemer Boulevard and Birch. A drum line from Brea Olinda High School will introduce catchy percussion for the marchers. The Villa Park High School Band and the USC Trojan Marching Band will turn up the volume with festive sounds during their parade segments. Other crowd favorites will surely be the 501st Legion/Southern California Garrison-Star Wars Re-enactment and the Wells Fargo Stagecoach with its sleek horses.

Last year on my own initiative I approached the Diocese of Orange and proposed a change of ministry from Saint Angela Merici. I was offered the Chaplaincy at Saint Joseph Hospital in Orange. I was quite excited about this prospect because I find myself spending time with many of our sick and homebound not only when an individual and family notifies the parish, but I also try to follow-up with a visit or call, or send a message, or a card especially if the illness is prolonged or if a person is dying. I also spend my free time with some of the retired or ill priests of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles supporting them in their need. Although my recovery from my shattered femur was quite amazing, my Orthopedic Surgeon and Therapist believed the demands of Hospital Ministry might be too much for me at that time. This past August-September 2016, I once again pursued on my own initiative the possibility of a change of ministry, and I am in the process with the Diocese of Orange reviewing other options for the upcoming year.


