

Reflection

The Temple and its surrounding complex on Jerusalem's Temple Mount was a very holy site to the Jews of antiquity. It was here where God's Holiest of Holy Presence abided. From the time of Solomon, this location had been a place of prayer, pilgrimage and sacrifice. It had undergone multiple attacks, desecrations, destructions and reconstructions. It was here that Mary and Joseph had presented their Son Jesus to the Lord God Almighty. It was here that Mary and Joseph found their twelve-year-old Son Jesus doing the Father's work. It was here that Jesus preached and prayed. It was truly Holy ground. Since many pilgrims came to this holy site to fulfill prescriptions of the law and to offer sacrifice, local merchants thought it an ideal location for doing business – changing money and selling sheep, oxen and birds for ritual sacrifices. In many ways these merchants were disrespecting the sacredness of the Temple for their own gains. We see even today at our own Christian and Marian Holy sites.

Well in today's Gospel Jesus again returns to Jerusalem and becomes rightfully angry at the sight of such commerce and chaos in his Father's house. He drives out the merchants and animals, spills the money and overturns tables. It must have been quite a sight! How had such a holy place been turned into a marketplace, a den of thieves?

All those merchants and Jewish pilgrims would have been familiar with the Ten Commandments which we heard in today's first reading. The first three go into great detail about respect for God the Father – that there be no other gods, that God's name not be taken in vain, and the Sabbath be kept holy as a sacred day of rest. They would have known love and care for one's neighbor would have mattered equally. Yet, the commandments were rejected, the Temple was defiled, the poor were ignored and the Messiah in their midst was condemned to death.

We too, live in a world in which commandments are broken and the sacred is profaned and disrespected. Right and wrong seems to be blurred at times. And integrity compromised for personal gain. Tragically we see the results of what happens when the sacred is profaned. Whether it's the sacredness of a Florida classroom or the sacredness of an immigrant family trying to remain together. All of us are called to look deep into our own lives to see how we've compromised the sacred, to think about ways in which we can draw deep within ourselves and resolve to "turn over some tables." When should we speak out against injustice? Where can we identify idolatry? In the privacy of our thoughts, how can we cast out the trivial and make room for the sacred? Let us resolve to begin with prayer – asking for Christ-like wisdom instead of human wisdom.

Dear friends,

There's been a couple projects that we've been working on lately and I thought you'd be interested in a quick update. As you're aware we had a successful "Fund a Need" campaign to raise money to replace our Church projector's, the sound system and lights in the church. Well the good news is, the new projectors have been installed and the current sound system is 90% installed. We hope to start working on the Church lighting system in the next month. Until then, we have a temporary lighting system installed to brighten up the sanctuary area. A big Thank You goes out to Jason Padilla, Ron Sled, John McEntee, Gary Schwab and Vince Vaccher for their help on this project.

Our school kids needed more room to play and study, so the big 20' and 40' containers that were by the school have been moved to free up space. The Boy Scouts did an admirable job in clearing out the eyesore behind the rectory garage to make room for the containers and trailer.

Recently, the Diocese did a Safety inspection of the Church grounds and several concerns were identified. The first was what I call the ficus Forest. Unfortunately, the one time beautiful ficus trees in front of the Church, have grown so big they've become a potential safety hazard. As you may know, the ficus tree has a huge root system. These roots have been tearing up our concrete foundations and plumbing systems. So, for safety reasons they need to be removed. An architect has also volunteered his time to propose some ideas to dress up the front area of the Church. This is very important as it's the first impression people will have of our community.


You'll also notice that windows have been installed on our Confessional doors. The windows were installed so that we would be in compliance with the Diocese' Safe Environment requirements. A big Thank you to Bill Morgan, Frank Waclawik and Frank Madrigal for their help on completing this project. The interiors of the confessionals are also in the process of being cleaned up...so if it's been awhile since your last confession please come on in and check it out. We'll leave a light on for you.

We're also in the process of upgrading our Chapel. Eventually, we'd like to replace the old carpeting, fix the cracks, paint the walls and build a more substantial and reverent altar. We're blessed to have a host of people involved in this upgrade.

It's also come to my attention, although we're a Catholic Church, we have no cross on the Church roof. Apparently, the cross was removed when the unsafe bell tower came down. So much of our Catholic tradition centers around the love God has shown us in the cross of Jesus Christ. So future plans include the placement of a cross on the Church roof.

And finally, I must say that one of the truly greatest blessings to all of us and to me is the fact that each and every one of these projects are being worked on and completed by our very own parishioners. That speaks volumes about the character and generosity of the community here at St Angela Merici. A big Thanks to all who've donated their time, talents and treasure!



Fr. Francis Benedict, O.S.B. **Abbot, 1992-2008**

FR. FRANCIS was born in 1948 and raised in the San Fernando Valley. He attended Queen of Angels Seminary and Alemany High School. In 1967 he joined (then) Saint Andrew's Priory and was sent to Loyola Marymount University to complete his undergraduate studies: he graduated with a BA in philosophy in 1972. He attended Mount Angel Seminary in Oregon from January of 1973 to May of 1976, where he wrote his master's thesis on the topic of spiritual direction, completing his MA in theology in 1977.

He was ordained to the priesthood on July 10th 1976 and served the monastic community as subprior from 1977-1979 and 1984-1982, as guestmaster from 1976-1978 and 1985-1992, and as novicemaster from 1978 to 1983 and 1984-1985. In order to maintain a link with Valyermo's missionary origins he assisted the Benedictine Missionary Abbey of Inkamana in South Africa as high school teacher, novicemaster, and director of vocations from January, 1983 to January, 1984. Upon his return to Valyermo in 1984 he began working with people in 12-Step Recovery programs, a ministry in which he continues to serve.

In 1984 the Oblate Program at Valyermo was restructured and invigorated through active cooperation between the monastic community and the oblates. One of the fruits of this work was the creation of several annual retreats emphasizing Benedictine spirituality for laity. Abbot Francis considers his work with the oblates one of his most important ministries.

In 1992 Saint Andrew's Priory was elevated to the status of abbey, and on May 15th Fr. Francis was elected the first abbot of Saint Andrew's Abbey. He served the community as abbot for sixteen years: his motto as abbot was: Confirm a Fratres Tuos / You will Strengthen Your Brethren.
