

LISTEN TO HIM

Reflection

... listen to him (Matthew 17). All of us would like to believe that we are listeners. The truth however, is often we find ourselves misquoting what others have said or misunderstanding what is being communicated to us or ignore bits-and-pieces of what is said or have clouded what "we hear" with our own prejudices. Misinterpretation often arises from what we share because we really do not truly listen. This is the experience in today's Gospel. Peter, James, and John's listening is clouded by their perceptions, hopes, and expectations. Consequently, what they listen to is what they want to hear.

The disciples accompany Jesus up onto a mountain and experience Jesus transfigured before their eyes (Matthew 17). We are told that ... his face became as dazzling as the sun, his clothes as radiant as light. Suddenly Moses and Elijah appeared ... conversing with Jesus (Matthew 17). The disciples are so thrilled by what has just happened, that Peter presents a proposal to this awesome phenomena: ... if you wish, I will make three tents ... one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah (Matthew 17). As soon as Peter presents his idea, Moses and Elijah disappear, and from the clouds a voice is heard: ... This is my beloved on whom my favor rests. Listen to him (Matthew 17). What is most interesting about this scene is the admonition *listen to him*. This may not seem terribly significant until we realize the reverence the Hebrew people have for Moses and Elijah, and the lack of understanding and inability to really listen to what Jesus had been trying to communicate to them since they began to follow him. Their listening failed them and they could not hear the full impact of who Jesus really was. The disciples were so absorbed with the presence of Moses and Elijah, that they completely missed the voice from heaven saying, Jesus is the one who they should be listening to.

There are a myriad of voices that surround us today. Media in all its forms dominate our culture, society, and frame the way we listen and hear. There are countless people vying for our attention trying to tell us that they have exactly what we need to be satisfied and content in life: The best gourmet food, the newest drug to experiment with, the ideal automobile, the perfect house, the most secure avenue to a happy retirement, the "type" of people we should associate and be identified with, all of which will transform our lives from the ordinary to the extraordinary (similar to what Peter, James, and John believed) and transform us or transfigure us into the ideal image of what we have heard we should be.

Listening is truly the message of today's Gospel. We need to attune our ears to the voice of Jesus, rather than to the clamor of advertisers, programmers and techies that promise instant and immediate gratification by simply pressing the icon on our computer or iPad. It is too easy to fall victim to the promises that are thrown at us today. We are "programmed" to expect instant gratification. We find it hard to wait so we *listen to what the professions have to offer*, misunderstanding (as the disciples did) what God is offering and perceive that what God has to say is irrelevant and not germane to our lives. Too often, this is the reason we find our lives so pervaded by empty and broken promises, leaving us constantly searching for the "one thing" that will make us happy. We drift from this to that, but never find the right formula for what we desire. Listening is difficult today. It takes too long and involves an investment on our parts. We *just do not have time to listen!* Like Peter, James, and John we are often led by to a holy place, where God is revealed, where God's self-revelation can be experienced, where God offers us his Son as the ultimate relationship we will ever need in our lives, but because we do not listen and cannot hear, we find ourselves in the same place as the disciples: Afraid. Jesus response to our misguided inability to hear and listen is ... *rise ... and do not be afraid* (Matthew 17). Like the disciples, we too need to look up, listen, and see what the disciples experienced: ...*they saw no one else but Jesus alone* (Matthew 17) ... that is because there is no one else and nothing more that we need from God, but Jesus.

CAN WE PASS THE TRANSFIGURATION TEST?

What if The Transfiguration was a test, not of Jesus, but of the Apostles and us? Would they pass? Would we? Jesus did not take everyone with him up the mountain, but selected Peter, James and John. It is possible that our Lord had a particular reason for selecting those specific individuals. The Gospel passage suggests that all may have been involved, to some degree, in conversation with Moses and Elijah when the transfiguration occurred. Enigmatically, Peter suggests that the Apostles withdraw from the conversation and build tents. Peter's words and actions were somewhat in contradiction with one another.

In ordinary human relationships, one of the most significant moments comes when one member of the relationship takes the gamble and reveals "who" they truly are. How we handle that moment can determine the type and depth of the relationship from that moment on. Today's reading give us the sense that the Apostles were uncomfortable with the whole event, and when Peter suggested that they withdraw from the conversation, God the Father intervened and let them know in no uncertain terms just exactly who they were dealing with. Perhaps they did not truly grasp that Jesus was revealing his true self to them, and they became really rattled when the message finally struck home. Maybe the famous "Messianic Secret" was an admonishment to the Apostles that they were clueless and therefore should say nothing to anyone.

We tend to be uncomfortable with the term *intimacy*, because in our culture it characteristically implies physical intimacy; however, in a basic relational sense, it is the measure of the depth of the bond between individuals, and suggests how deeply one can trust another. When one reveals themselves to another, it becomes an intimacy test. "Am I safe with you?" is the important question. If the "Transfiguration" was an intimacy test, perhaps the Apostles did not pass. Would we?

Christian spirituality is the means by which we relate to Jesus. The point in our relationship with Jesus is what seems to be demonstrated in this particular event. Jesus is constantly revealing himself to us, in word, sacrament, and other ways, while demonstrating that we matter to him. Do we participate in that revelation, or are we so busy attending to extraneous matters that we miss the moment entirely? That is precisely the point of our Lenten reflection: *Now Is The Time* to deepen and nourish our relationship with Jesus. Do we allow ourselves the time to deepen our relationship? Do we allow ourselves the opportunity to truly listen and reflect on what's going on around us?

Our Parish Mission is coming up and we will be climbing up that mountain with Jesus, who may have something really special in store for us. Are we ready? Are we able? Are we willing to open ourselves to a deeper, more intimate relationship with Jesus this Lent? We demonstrate our openness by being present at Eucharist and maybe even more so by going out of our way to attend the mission. Hopefully, God the Father won't have to knock us over in order to catch our attention. *Now is the time for mercy, mutuality and mindfulness!*

One of the most exceptional aspects of Saint Angela Merici is the feeling of welcome and belonging: We are part of something much greater than any one person. Our parish connects us as neighbors, a community, and as a People of God and followers of Christ. The dedication of our people, the gifts, time, talent, and treasure that are shared so generously have created a faith community that is vibrant, alive, and filled with the Spirit of Christ.

Your Stewardship support for the Pastoral Services Appeal last year has allowed our Diocese to continue to foster the many ministries of Faith Formation, Outreach, and social and community activities. We were also able to continue to foster the ministries of our parish particularly with our parish outreach (Bread of Angels and the ACT Office) and our Youth, Jr. High, and Young Adult Ministries, (Steubenville, Pets for Vets, Winter Wonderland, Spiritual and Personal Growth Evenings for youth and young adults, and Adoration and Prayer and Praise evenings) which our parishioners have always held as a very high priority at each Parish Assembly in the last ten years. In addition, we were able to enhance and complete many upgrades of our site that were in need of our attention after fifty years: Complete the roof work in Saint John Vianney and in the Parish Center Offices as well as replace the air condition/heat systems, resurface and stripe the black-top of the parking lot on Fir Street, provide special parking spaces for our seniors for easy access to the church for mass, the care and enhancement of our landscaping and the painting of our site. We are currently in the process of completing the work on our Roland Digital Grand Piano and reviewing the options for an organ since the original instrument, because of age was evaluated as an extreme fire hazard. Repairing the organ would be more than purchasing another, and if moved (as planned to the Choir Area) would take up over half of the space needed for our choirs). Finally, we are in contact with the Diocese of Orange and the City of Brea to move forward with the LED Parish Signage on Walnut Avenue. These are a few of our projects that have transpired because of your support and care. Our vision for this PSA 2017 is to continue to support our Youth, Jr. High, and Young Adult Ministries and to supplement the purchase of an organ for our parish.

It is our belief that Saint Angela Merici has consistently been generous stewards when specific endeavors or projects for ministry and the life of the parish are warranted, so it is important to listen to your heart as we begin PSA 2017. Your pledge is very important to the work, ministry, and the growth of our parish. This year's presenters, Susie and Dave Beas, Chris Blake, and Carolyn Lamka will share their own personal faith journey and how Saint Angela Merici has enabled them and their families to embrace more intimately their Catholic-Christian identity. As you reflect on your pledge, remember all stewardship is returned to our parish once we have met our pledge-goal of One Hundred and Two Thousand Dollars) \$102,000.00 This year we are asking for each person (family) to pledge \$400.00 (Four Hundred Dollars) which is about \$33.00 a month or approximately \$8.25 a week.
