

The Year of Mercy

Misera et Misericordia: John 8:1-11

Our Gospel reading for this 5th Sunday of Lent is the story about the woman caught in adultery, taken from St. John's Gospel, 8:1-11. The content and style of this passage, according to many biblical scholars, would fit better in the context of St. Luke's Gospel. Luke gives us some of the most memorable stories about God's mercy (e.g., the famous parable of the prodigal son, proclaimed last Sunday); and John 8:1-11 would be perfectly in line with this "Lucan" theme. In the first Christian millennium in the East, Greek commentators on the Gospel of John mentioned nothing about this particular passage; and such a passage did not appear in the standard Greek texts until the 10th century. In the West, St. Jerome (4th cent.) did include it in his famous translation of the Bible into Latin—the *Vulgata*. Nevertheless, apart from the questions of origin and authorship, this passage is among the most beautiful ones found in the Gospels.



Mosaic Law concerning Adultery: Leviticus 20:10 orders the death penalty for both the man (who commits adultery with his neighbor's wife) and the adulteress wife—although the manner of the penalty is not spelled out. Deuteronomy 22:21 does specify stoning as the penalty for infidelity on the part of the woman who was betrothed. In our current passage John 8:1-11, we are to assume that Jesus and the Pharisees operate under this understanding of the Law of Moses. What about the woman's partner/lover? Presumably he must have escaped... According to the late biblical scholar Raymond Brown, there was a tradition that about the year 30 the Romans stopped allowing the Sanhedrin (the supreme judicial council of the Jews) to impose any form of capital punishment. With this historical detail in mind, perhaps the Pharisees attempt to trap Jesus with their question concerning the adulteress woman. If he decides to let her go, then he would obviously violate the Law of Moses. If he agrees that she be stoned, that would go against his message of love; and Jesus would also get into trouble with the Romans.

Clearly Jesus is trapped. But his clever one-liner solves the whole situation: "Let the one who is without sin be the first to cast a stone at her." Eventually they all depart, leaving Jesus alone with the woman. Now comes the ultimate moment of truth for the adulteress: Jesus speaks to her as a human to a human. She is no longer the object under investigation, but a regular human person. Whereas the Pharisees would not even allow her physical life, Jesus gives her back that life—and even offers her the possibility of a new life in the right relationship with God: "Go and sin no more." This story is ultimately about *MERCY*, the theme of our Jubilee Year. However, there might have been some objections against this passage because it may present a very "lax" portrait of Jesus in regards to the sins of the flesh. Jesus obviously is not condoning the sins of adultery. He does not approve of the woman's prior actions. But through his words and actions, Jesus wants teach the Pharisees—those who are zealous for the letter of the law—to go beyond the letter of the law for the spiritual well being of the woman in question.

This story also challenges us NOT to use religion to trap people in their sinfulness. The purpose of religion is to liberate people, to give them the possibility of a fresh beginning; and not to leave them trapped in their past. Sometimes the ultimate law of love/mercy has to take precedence even over traditional values... Coming back to the scene of Jesus alone with the woman after all had left: St. Augustine (5th cent.) had this most famous one-line commentary, in his terse Latin pun: "*Relicti sunt duo, MISERA ET MISERICORDIA*—" that is, "only two remained: the MISERABLE [woman] and MERCY Incarnate."

Into the Heart of Mercy

Lent is a Time of Pruning and Reconciliation *Pope Francis*

Everyone says to himself: ‘When was the last time I went to confession?’ and if it has been a long time, don’t lose another day! Go, the priest will be good. And Jesus, (will be) there, and Jesus is better than the priests - Jesus receives you. He will receive you with so much love! Be courageous, and go to confession.”



Someone can say, (as the popular thinking) “I confess my sins only to God.” Yes, you can say to God, ‘forgive me,’ and say your sins, but our sins are also against our brothers, against the Church. This is why it is necessary to ask forgiveness of the Church and of our brothers, in the person of the priest. While the celebration of the sacrament is personal, it is rooted in the universality of the Church, which accompanies us on the path of conversion. Forgiveness is not something we can give ourselves. One asks forgiveness, one asks it of another person,

and in confession, we ask forgiveness from Jesus. Forgiveness is not a result of our efforts, but is a gift. It is a gift of the Holy Spirit who showers us with mercy and grace that pours forth unceasingly from the open heart of Christ crucified and risen.

Many people feel ashamed at the idea of confessing their sins and might say, “but Father, I am embarrassed!” Don’t be afraid of confession. When someone is in line for confession he feels all these things - even shame - but then, when he finishes confessing, he leaves (feeling) free, great, beautiful, forgiven, clean, happy. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a sacrament of healing. When I go to confession, it’s for healing: Healing the soul, healing the heart because of something that I did to make it unwell.

In the biblical story of Jesus healing a *Paralyzed Man*, we see the “profound link” between “forgiveness and healing,” since “the Lord Jesus is revealed at the same time as the physician of soul and body,” and in the *Parable of the Prodigal Son*, who sought his father’s forgiveness and was welcomed home with open arms. I say to you, God loved us and invites us to be reconciled with God and to return to him, in order to return to ourselves. Every time we go to confession, God embraces us.

Response Procedures Quick Reference Guide

Tenth in the Series

George Ullrich, our *Emergency Awareness Coordinator* at Saint Angela has created a detailed *Emergency Plan* for our parishioners in the event of a natural disaster. Please take the time to review the document. Often we do not adequately prepare ourselves. Be pro-active and prepare! Be ready for unexpected so all of us will be knowledgeable of how to respond in an event of emergency.

Protective Action – EVACUATE

BUILDING:

General Evacuation procedures

(for all buildings)

- Call 911 and provide the exact location, nature of emergency, description of suspicious person(s) and number of known victims.
- An administrator may use the following announcement on the PA system. "YOUR ATTENTION PLEASE. WE NEED TO INSTITUTE AN EVACUATION OF ALL BUILDINGS. ALL INDIVIDUALS SHOULD REPORT TO (DESIGNATED AREA)." If the PA system is not available, use other means to deliver instructions. Stay calm, convey reassuring comments that the situation is under control and give clear directions.
- In the event of a fire/smoke alarm or smell of gas, evacuate the premises first. Then, if no fire or smoke is obvious and if it's safe to do so, assign two people to inspect the facilities for the cause of the alarm.
- In the event of power failure or darkness, use emergency kit flashlights/light sticks to direct people to the evacuation area.

Emergency backpacks are in each office.

- Follow evacuation maps posted in your area.
- Proceed to the nearest safe aisle or hallway to exit.
- If in the Parish Center or church, proceed to the school field and wait for further instruction.
- While evacuating, look for other personnel who may be injured or unaware of the situation.
- The Incident Leader will take attendance once staff is assembled in a safe location.
- Once assembled, stay in place until further instructions are given.
- Do not proceed to your vehicle until instructed to do so in order to keep lanes open for emergency vehicles.

Protective Action – EVACUATE

BUILDING

Evacuation of the church or hall during Mass

- Call 911 and provide the exact location, nature of emergency, description of suspicious person(s) and number of known victims.
- The celebrating Priest will instruct everyone to evacuate the church and proceed to the outside gathering space and grass area to wait for further instruction from the ushers.
- The head usher will direct the other ushers or trained volunteers to:
 - o Put on orange safety vests indicating to evacuees their leadership position.
 - o Locate the portable loud speaker in the usher room closet.
 - o Lead evacuees to the evacuation area - use of a portable loud speaker is highly recommended. The following message should be repeated to evacuees: "**Proceed to the outside gathering space and grass area. Do not go to your cars.**"
 - o Clear parking lot lanes for emergency vehicles – use portable loud speaker if possible
 - o Look for and direct emergency vehicles to emergency site.
 - o Assist those evacuees having restricted mobility.
- After everyone has been evacuated, and only if it is safe to do so, the head usher or their designee should make one last inspection to ensure no one has been left behind.
- The head usher should follow the reporting procedures under "Communications".

Response Procedures Quick Reference Guide

Continuation

Evacuation of Religious Education and Youth Ministry

- Call 911 and provide the exact location, nature of emergency, description of suspicious person(s) and number of known victims.
- Classroom teachers should pick up roll sheet/ phone list, cell phone if available and red emergency backpacks (located in each classroom).
- Follow the general evacuation and emergency procedures.
- At the evacuation area, all individuals must remain seated and quiet in their classroom groupings.
- Roll should be taken to account for all children
- In the event an individual is identified as missing, assign a volunteer to return to the classroom areas - if safe to do so - and search for the missing individual(s). Make sure an adult remains in charge of the children at all times in the evacuation area.
- Begin notification of parents through use of cell phones.

Protective Action – RUN, HIDE, ACT

- Call 911 and provide the exact location, nature of emergency, description of suspicious person(s) and number of known victims.
- **RUN**, look for children or others who require assistance and evacuate from the area of concern if an escape route is accessible and encourage other persons to do the same. Evacuate regardless of others decisions to stay. Leave belongings behind and assist others in escaping if possible. Avoid being under a desk, in a closet and/or in the corner of a room. Other items to consider:
 - Escape in a safe direction and away from sounds of gunshots or explosions.
 - Stay low while peeking around corners before running down a hall.
 - When encountering law enforcement, keep hands visible, raise hands and say "Friendly". Follow their instructions and point direction only if asked.
 - Prevent individuals from entering the area where incident is occurring.
 - Do not attempt to move wounded individuals.
 - Proceed to a safe area and call 911 to notify law enforcement of your location.

- Proceed to a safe area and call 911 to notify law enforcement of your location.
- **HIDE** in a safe place and barricade all doors if evacuation/escape is not possible. Other items to consider:
 - Close your locked door.
 - Block and secure the door by moving heavy objects/furniture against the door and holding it with your feet while prone. Maintain low body profile to minimize exposure to gunfire.
 - Silence cell phones and other devices and remain quiet.
 - Turn off lights, close blinds and stay out of the shooter's view.
 - Once your area is safe, staff may use the following PA announcement to alert others: "LOCKDOWN, LOCKDOWN, THIS IS (YOUR NAME) IN (YOUR LOCATION)."
 - Any staff member can call 911 to advise law enforcement of the general area of the perpetrator(s).
- **ACT** to incapacitate and/or overwhelm the active shooter when facing imminent injury or death. Other items to consider:
 - Staff member should commit to stopping the threat.
 - Yell, throw items to distract and/or charge the shooter to overtake and/or delay while time is provided for other persons to run.
- When "RUN, HIDE, ACT" procedures are initiated, other campus facilities such as the school, parish center and church should be notified.


Protective Action – ALL CLEAR

- An administrator may wish to use the following announcement on the PA system. "YOUR ATTENTION PLEASE. IT IS NOW OK TO RETURN TO YOUR OFFICE AND RESUME NORMAL OPERATIONS. THANK YOU FOR YOUR COOPERATION." If the PA system is not available, use other means to deliver instructions.
- This action signifies the emergency is over.


