

# Reflection



tent, perceptions are important. All of us have had the experience of being judged or have come to our own conclusion about others based merely on a perception. We have all experienced at one time or another feeling diminished based on the perceptions of others or have made others feel, think, or believe that they do not matter due to our preconceived judgments of them. Perceptions can at times be cutting, hurting, alienating, divisive, and the source of many ruined reputations and relationships.

In today's Gospel we are presented with a blind man and it is the Pharisees, his neighbors and sadly, even his parents who betrayed him and transformed him by their perceptions, judgments, and attitudes into a non-mattering entity: ...you were born totally blind in sin ... isn't this the one who used to sit and beg, ... no, he just looks like him ... we know he is our son ... ask him, he is of age he can speak for himself ... they said this because they were afraid (John 9). It is amazing how far our perceptions can blind us even if others are trying to do good: ... This man (Jesus) is not from God because he does not keep the Sabbath (John 9).

Today's story personifies our own way of responding to the perceptions we have embraced without even giving any thought that our judgments make us no different from the Pharisees, the townspeople, and the man's parents whose own perceptions prevented them from defending their son. Like the Pharisees and the townspeople the incident with the blind man sends ripples through the perceptions they have always held as "the way things are." This man was born blind. He now can see. What happened? "Our perceptions say this cannot be." It does not make sense and it does not fit into our understanding of the way things are supposed to be. Greed is at the heart of the Pharisees. They were the teachers of the law, but they too could not move beyond their perceptions of the Sabbath to something that was obvious: A blind man can now see! The blind man's parents say ... ask him yourself (John 9). When faced by authority they were pushed to the point of betraying their own son and turning their back on him. A judgmental attitude only serves to highlight how "the truth" can be tempered when the perceptions we have are being threatened by an alternative perspective we refuse to see.

Perceptions would not be a problem if the Pharisees, the townsfolk, and the man's parents did not assert their rightness: The Pharisees claim to know. The neighbors believe they know. The blind man's parents know and we know the biases that exist in our lives, but our own greediness, judgmental perceptions, and the habitual thinking depletes the truth, like the Pharisees, neighbors, and the parents, and moves us to insist that our perceptions are right, so we claim we know (John 9). We are certain without a doubt that we see, so our sins remain (John 9). To admit that we may be blind or our perceptions may be off base can be horrifying because we are faced with the truth that those who we believe do not matter, do! Perhaps the need to be right for many of us, is far more important than admitting that our perceptions have blinded us to the truth and our held beliefs have only served to reduce others to the lowest common denominator. Jesus refuses any part of this perception. He believes that now is the time to dismantle our perceptions to make sure we know mattering is important. He restores the identity, dignity, and meaning of the man born blind that had been robbed by those who say they see and exposes to the consternation of the Pharisees, the neighbors, and the man's parents their hypocrisy. Might Jesus be revealing our own sightlessness as well?

## THE WORLD BORN BLIND

The Gospel of John is a complex composition that constantly refers back to the famous prologue ... *In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God...* (John 1). Jesus reiterates one of the initial themes from the prologue in Chapter 9 when he says: *I am the light of the world.* John suggests that there is an ongoing struggle between light and darkness, with the obvious reference of blindness to darkness. The Man Born Blind is a story of an unnamed blind man who Jesus heals. Interestingly, the man does not ask to be healed, Jesus just does it. In itself, this is an extraordinary action, which dispels the formulae that people consider to be pre-conditions for a miracle. Jesus brings light to this man's darkness, just as he brings light to this world's darkness.

The fact that the blind man was unprepared for such a miracle is never mentioned in the text. How much like life. Are we ever prepared for the insertion of the Divine into our world order? Most of the story unfolds outside the presence of Jesus, who obviously keeps tabs on the ongoing events, since he was aware when the individual was cast out of the assembly. How that is so is not made clear in the text. There is a great deal not made clear in the text: 1) Who were "the Jews?" 2) Where was the assembly held? 3) By what authority were they empowered to conduct such an inquisition, and so forth. The lack of specifics in this story suggests strongly that there's a great deal more to this story than just the compelling narrative of the blind man.

As Jesus suggests at the onset, ...*it is so that the works of God might be made visible through him [the blind man].* All that unfolds is revelation of a much larger story that may be more about us than the characters in the story. This is made more clear at the end, when the Pharisees inquire, *Surely we are not also blind are we?* Perhaps the condition of the world is that we all are born into blindness of a sort—perhaps not total but locked into rigid perceptions that do not permit us to see beyond the limits we impose on the possibilities of life, the world, ourselves and others. Maybe the blind man is a means for us to look at ourselves and ask questions about our limited awareness. We tend to think we're pretty aware of what's going on, but if we allow this passage to speak to us, perhaps it may hit pretty close to home. Jesus suggests strongly to them that rigid perceptions are in itself a sin.

Science has demonstrated that even fully sighted people tune out a great deal of the world around them. That is simply how our nervous system is wired. Jesus is not suggesting that being human, in itself is a sin. *The "sin" is the arrogance and rigidity from thinking our perceptions of the world and others are totally valid.* The Pharisees believe that the world must fit into their system of belief, and cannot believe in a world of actual evidence. That is why they became divided. We too become conflicted when our rigidity is confronted with novel elements or events that do not fit into our pre-fabricated categories of possibility. Jesus provides the element of the unexpected. Are we grateful? Are we shocked? Are we scandalized? Must we remain blind while thinking we see? Now is the time to ask such questions.

One of the most exceptional aspects of Saint Angela Merici is the feeling of welcome and belonging: We are part of something much greater than any one person. Our parish connects us as neighbors, a community, and as a People of God and followers of Christ. The dedication of our people, the gifts, time, talent, and treasure that are shared so generously have created a faith community that is vibrant, alive, and filled with the Spirit of Christ.

Your Stewardship support for the Pastoral Services Appeal last year has allowed our Diocese to continue to foster the many ministries of Faith Formation, Outreach, and social and community activities. We were also able to continue to foster the ministries of our parish particularly with our parish outreach (Bread of Angels and the ACT Office) and our Youth, Jr. High, and Young Adult Ministries, (Steubenville, Pets for Vets, Winter Wonderland, Spiritual and Personal Growth Evenings for youth and young adults, and Adoration and Prayer and Praise evenings) which our parishioners have always held as a very high priority at each Parish Assembly in the last ten years. In addition, we were able to enhance and complete many upgrades of our site that were in need of our attention after fifty years: Complete the roof work in Saint John Vianney and in the Parish Center Offices as well as replace the air condition/heat systems, resurface and stripe the black-top of the parking lot on Fir Street, provide special parking spaces for our seniors for easy access to the church for mass, the care and enhancement of our landscaping and the painting of our site. We are currently in the process of completing the work on our Roland Digital Grand Piano and reviewing the options for an organ since the original instrument, because of age was evaluated as an extreme fire hazard. Repairing the organ would be more than purchasing another, and if moved (as planned to the Choir Area) would take up over half of the space needed for our choirs). Finally, we are in contact with the Diocese of Orange and the City of Brea to move forward with the LED Parish Signage on Walnut Avenue. These are a few of our projects that have transpired because of your support and care. Our vision for this PSA 2017 is to continue to support our Youth, Jr. High, and Young Adult Ministries and to supplement the purchase of an organ for our parish.

It is our belief that Saint Angela Merici has consistently been generous stewards when specific endeavors or projects for ministry and the life of the parish are warranted, so it is important to listen to your heart as we begin PSA 2017. Your pledge is very important to the work, ministry, and the growth of our parish. This year's presenters, Susie and Dave Beas, Chris Blake, and Carolyn Lamka will share their own personal faith journey and how Saint Angela Merici has enabled them and their families to embrace more intimately their Catholic-Christian identity. As you reflect on your pledge, remember all stewardship is returned to our parish once we have met our pledge-goal of One Hundred and Two Thousand Dollars) \$102,000.00 This year we are asking for each person (family) to pledge \$400.00 (Four Hundred Dollars) which is about \$33.00 a month or approximately \$8.25 a week. You may pledge on the envelopes provided in the pews or on the parish website or you may want to take a pledge envelope home and pray and discern about your stewardship support. Your response to God's generosity will certainly be evident in the experience of Church at Saint Angela Merici. Please pledge. Pledge now. Pledge to make a difference.
