

## Reflection

Death seems to be theme of this week's word. Ezekiel speaks of "dry bones" and Paul's focus is on "spirits," while John tells a story of a "four day old corpse." Death certainly appears to be at the core of this week's word; however, the central issue is not what our first impressions might lead us to believe. It is not death as much as it is an attempt to

draw us out from death to life by highlighting the notion that the way we choose to hear the word, literally becomes a matter of life or death! (Romans 8). The Prophet Ezekiel conveys a wounded Israel... *I will open your graves and have you rise from them* (Ezekiel 37). It is understandable the reason behind Ezekiel's word may escape us, after all the phenomenon he speaks about is not something within the realm of our experience. Once the graves of those who have died are closed they remain closed! If and when we hear about a grave being opened, it is to re-examine a decaying corpse, not to awaken the body and raise the person from the dead. Once dead, the dead remain dead in our experience; however, the truth is that many of us may be "more dead than we like to think." Often our hearts have become a grave yard. It is hard to admit that we have evolved into living, walking cemeteries, walking shrouds, and talking tombs. Often we do not recognize that we have become experts in "covering up the stench" in our lives.

The raising of Lazarus from the tomb may appear at first glance to be a spectacular event (after all when was the last time we experience someone raised from the dead); however if we look very closely at the Gospel story we will notice it offers very few details: There are no revelations from Lazarus about the after-life. The texts offer no description of how the on-lookers may have grasped what had just occurred. There are no cries of recognition from Lazarus. No embrace for the revived brother. No word of gratitude to Jesus. Even Lazarus is silent. Not a single word from him. We would imagine that "raising someone back to life" would stir a myriad of responses, but that does not seem to be case. Perhaps the reason behind this "lack of elated responses" is because although Lazarus seems to be the central figure in the story, the real focus is Jesus. This story is not so much about "raising a dead corpse" as much as it is about coming to believe. It is about our faith and this is amplified as the story comes to a close: ... now many of the Jews who had come to Mary and seen what Jesus had done began to believe in him (John 11). The writer does not want us to be distracted with a mere curiosity about "how someone was brought back from dead," as much as like Lazarus, finding ourselves unbound and released from the wrappings of death.

Jesus cries out to us in a loud voice: ... Come out! (John 11), yet to be released from the wrapping that binds us we have to embrace the stench and the rot that exists in our lives. We need to lay claim to the "death" that keeps our hearts in a receptacle of human remains. Too often we believe that there is nothing we can do about the perennial garbage that exists within us, but God does not desire that we remain dead tombs, but *living temples* (Romans 8), of Christ. The word offers us the power not to simply surrender to death, but to choose to embrace the shadows that pervade our minds and hearts that we may hear Jesus confront what is decaying in our lives and unbind, untie, and release us from the grip of death. Will we remain in the tomb or will we hear Jesus' cry: Come out! Truly the choice is a matter of life or death...

## LAZARUS

When you raise someone from the dead it's difficult to look beyond the facts of just how amazing that is! Jesus raised his friend Lazarus from the dead, and you would think that would rebound to his everlasting fame, but apparently not. The significance of Holy Week obliterated such an amazing event and drove it into the forgotten past, until John The Evangelist wrote about it many years later. Beyond the significance of raising Lazarus, John also paints a picture of Jesus within his social network that in many ways is no less amazing. As people who like a good story, we tend to focus more on events than relationships. Perhaps in that predilection we might be missing important matters.

In this passage, we see Jesus in a complex relationship with the Apostles (who agree to face the dangers of returning to Judea with him). We see that Jesus had a familiar ongoing relationship with Mary, who was the one who had anointed him with perfumed oil and dried his feet with her hair. Jesus was also apparently very fond of Mary's bother, Lazarus and her sister Martha as well. Ultimately, we also see Jesus in relationship with the Father, and finally Jesus acknowledging a relationship with the onlookers. All of that seems to indicate a complex network of relationships at a variety of levels.

Now is the time for us to focus on our relationship with Jesus, who raises the dead, but also who weeps at the misfortune of his friends. One gets the sense that the unfolding events are as much about demonstrating relational dynamics as they are about power dynamics. Of course, Jesus in conjunction with the Father, has the power to raise Lazarus from the dead. What really comes through in this passage is how much the people in relationship with Jesus matter to him. That is the only thing that reasonably explains all the evident emotion John writes about. Scholars theorize about all manner of justifying such emotions, but quite simply don't get how much Jesus cares about all the people in the passage.

Within this passage, we witness the relational dynamics of mercy, mutuality and mindfulness on the part of Jesus. In relationship with the Father, Jesus specifically mentions how the Father "hears" Jesus, whether he uses words or not. Listening to the other person is the hallmark of significant relationship. Returning Lazarus to life is amazing, but doing so in order to heal the complex demands of relationship seem equally amazing. So much of life revolves around the ongoing wounds of relationship, perhaps this event is not merely a long ago demonstration of healing power, but an acknowledgement of the fundamental importance of relationship to the nature and use of that healing power.

Many families experience relationships that may be as dead as Lazarus. Can they be restored? Certainly, there's the element of healing physical death present in this story, but there well could be the element of healing relational death as well. As our Lenten Journey turns toward Holy Week, perhaps now is the time to address those long buried relationships that could benefit from mercy, mutuality and mindfulness.

One of the most exceptional aspects of Saint Angela Merici is the feeling of welcome and belonging: We are part of something much greater than any one person. Our parish connects us as neighbors, a community, and as a People of God and followers of Christ. The dedication of our people, the gifts, time, talent, and treasure that are shared so generously have created a faith community that is vibrant, alive, and filled with the Spirit of Christ.

Your Stewardship support for the Pastoral Services Appeal last year has allowed our Diocese to continue to foster the many ministries of Faith Formation, Outreach, and social and community activities. We were also able to continue to foster the ministries of our parish particularly with our parish outreach (Bread of Angels and the ACT Office) and our Youth, Jr. High, and Young Adult Ministries, (Steubenville, Pets for Vets, Winter Wonderland, Spiritual and Personal Growth Evenings for youth and young adults, and Adoration and Prayer and Praise evenings) which our parishioners have always held as a very high priority at each Parish Assembly in the last ten years. In addition, we were able to enhance and complete many upgrades of our site that were in need of our attention after fifty years: Complete the roof work in Saint John Vianney and in the Parish Center Offices as well as replace the air condition/heat systems, resurface and stripe the black-top of the parking lot on Fir Street, provide special parking spaces for our seniors for easy access to the church for mass, the care and enhancement of our landscaping and the painting of our site. We are currently in the process of completing the work on our Roland Digital Grand Piano and reviewing the options for an organ since the original instrument, because of age was evaluated as an extreme fire hazard. Repairing the organ would be more than purchasing another, and if moved (as planned to the Choir Area) would take up over half of the space needed for our choirs). Finally, we are in contact with the Diocese of Orange and the City of Brea to move forward with the LED Parish Signage on Walnut Avenue. These are a few of our projects that have transpired because of your support and care. Our vision for this PSA 2017 is to continue to support our Youth, Jr. High, and Young Adult Ministries and to supplement the purchase of an organ for our parish.

It is our belief that Saint Angela Merici has consistently been generous stewards when specific endeavors or projects for ministry and the life of the parish are warranted, so it is important to listen to your heart as we begin PSA 2017. Your pledge is very important to the work, ministry, and the growth of our parish. This year's presenters, Susie and Dave Beas, Chris Blake, and Carolyn Lamka will share their own personal faith journey and how Saint Angela Merici has enabled them and their families to embrace more intimately their Catholic-Christian identity. As you reflect on your pledge, remember all stewardship is returned to our parish once we have met our pledge-goal of One Hundred and Two Thousand Dollars) \$102,000.00 This year we are asking for each person (family) to pledge \$400.00 (Four Hundred Dollars) which is about \$33.00 a month or approximately \$8.25 a week. You may pledge on the envelopes provided in the pews or on the parish website or you may want to take a pledge envelope home and pray and discern about your stewardship support. Your response to God's generosity will certainly be evident in the experience of Church at Saint Angela Merici. Please pledge. Pledge now. Pledge to make a difference.
