

# KENOSIS

THE EMPTYING OF CHRIST

## Reflection

Passion-Palm Sunday begins with the crowds delighting, cheering, and shouting for Jesus as he enters Jerusalem: *Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!* (Matthew 21); however, it becomes apparent very quickly he was not going to be the king they had envisioned, and it does not take long before they turn on him: ...*Crucify him!* (Matthew 26). Suddenly, the shouts of praise and the swaying and waving of palms radically shifts to a passionate cry

against Jesus. Opposing enforcers become allies and the conspiracy comes full circle when Pilate draws water from the basin (Matthew 26). This very act makes it clear that both the political and the religious leadership washed their hands of the whole matter. The passion does not stop there; it delves into the very heart of Jesus' personal life. Even those closest to him scatter and abandon him. Short sightedness, selfishness, jealousy, greed, pride, and self-interest dominate the moment. It is humanness at its very worse (Matthew 26).

The Passion story reminds us of ourselves. We like to think we are strong in our faith like Peter: ...*Lord, I am prepared to face death for you ...* (Matthew 26), but Peter is a reminder that any similarities about remaining stout hearted crumbles when we are confronted in that one pivotal moment when the chips are against us. It is then that the words of Jesus resonate loud and clear: ...*I tell you Peter, before the rooster crows, you will deny me three times* (Matthew 26). In today's way of thinking, it is hard to accept the fact that we would betray Jesus. We often cushion our conscience by reframing our betrayal more as a failure or not living up to the expectations of our faith, yet the truth is, we have denied Jesus. Perhaps our greatest denial is our denial itself.

It is very clear that our faith has its moments. Sometimes we are dauntless in our belief, but there is also an adumbrate side that we do not readily admit about ourselves and the passion story makes no bones about it, there are variances in our stance with God. It is the Gospel which makes it clear that God knows our weakness. He knows we will join the crowd and turn against him, he knows like those who are closest to him we will abandon him, he knows we will join Peter in rejecting him, but nevertheless it is precisely in the midst of these betrayals of passion that God's commitment to us is revealed:

*Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance he humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross ...*

Philippians 2

The passion is truly the image of human history, and the temptation we encounter is similar to the crowds and those who were closest to Jesus who abandon him: We are more comfortable being spectators rather than participants in a passionate journey into the heart of God. Passion-Palm Sunday is the entry into the very depth of God, who reveals that despite everything empties himself into our human experience. The passion is not simply a narration of how Jesus was driven to the cross. There is a greater depth we often fail to recognize and that is the believable investment of God for us. It is having the audacity to embrace the truth that God is greater than our sins and failures and mercy surpasses our deprivations. It is to know that in the midst of a broken world, God literally spills his very guts out for us, so we may realize how much we really mean to him. Our re-living of this Passion-Palm does not displace our sin, but rather it highlights that in the midst of our betrayals we boldly proclaim that it is in the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus that God makes it very clear just how much he is invested in our lives.



## THE WONDROUS LOVE?

*What wondrous love is this, O my soul! O my soul! What wondrous love is this! O my soul! What wondrous love is this! That caused the Lord of bliss! To send this precious peace, To my soul, to my soul! To send this precious peace To my soul!*  
(American Folk Hymn)

All eyes were on him. He was the object of their affection. He mattered for a few hours. Then, when it all went wrong, he didn't matter at all. Was he even the main event at his own death, a death he shared with taunting strangers. The world is a cruel place, filled with disdain and indifference. Did the life and death of Jesus matter? Do I matter? Does anything or anybody matter? Our feeble assent is drowned in an ocean of indifference on Palm Sunday, except for a lonely, broken voice, uttered through parched and quivering lips, more entreaty than command, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do."

Jesus mattered in the good times, when the crowd was chanting and acclaiming his achievements; however, as the crowds thinned and the applause faded, so did his friends and companions. In the end, a few women and a boy shared his inglorious end, and God knows they didn't matter to anyone. Who can assert, with any assurance, *my life matters* when even the Son of God counted for so little to the Roman Empire, the Jewish people, or even his own companions? In the end, it was indifference that triumphed on that Friday afternoon. An indifference that confronts us with harsh realities on Passion/Palm Sunday.

The evidence that we matter cannot be found in the external world. Just ask Jesus. *Faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things unseen.* (Hebrews 11:1) Our personal significance is a statement of faith, evidenced only in the heart according to the biblical definition. The lust of the world is to rob us of any claim that our lives might have meaning or significance. "Who do you think you are?" is a taunt many of us have endured whenever we strive for something worthwhile. Most of us are living the Stations of the Cross, falling and rising, only to face an ignominious end. The world wants us to stay down, just like it wanted Jesus to stay down, but he picked himself up and struggled onward—as we must. Palm Sunday is the remembrance of the passion and death of our Lord, but it is also a reminder of our struggle as well. With every fiber of our being, we struggle onward because we know that our lives matter to him who struggled onward for us. Our struggle is his struggle, and his struggle is ours.

Even though we don't hear about the Thief on the Cross (often referred to as St. Dismas) in the text of Matthew, we can feel his presence. He did not "deserve" to be significant to Jesus, but he was. So many strive to be significant through their personal efforts, and many resent the generosity of heart that Jesus displayed to that unrepentant sinner. What wondrous love is this, displayed to one so undeserving? ask the righteous. God's love and mercy are profligate, given freely. Fortunately, we are all covered under the entreaty of Jesus, *Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do.* None deserve such a gift, such a love. So, if we realize how significant we are to God, we can say with all conviction, the answer to the question *What Wondrous Love Is This?* is simply, God's love for me.

One of the most exceptional aspects of Saint Angela Merici is the feeling of welcome and belonging: We are part of something much greater than any one person. Our parish connects us as neighbors, a community, and as a People of God and followers of Christ. The dedication of our people, the gifts, time, talent, and treasure that are shared so generously have created a faith community that is vibrant, alive, and filled with the Spirit of Christ.

Your Stewardship support for the Pastoral Services Appeal last year has allowed our Diocese to continue to foster the many ministries of Faith Formation, Outreach, and social and community activities. We were also able to continue to foster the ministries of our parish particularly with our parish outreach (Bread of Angels and the ACT Office) and our Youth, Jr. High, and Young Adult Ministries, (Steubenville, Pets for Vets, Winter Wonderland, Spiritual and Personal Growth Evenings for youth and young adults, and Adoration and Prayer and Praise evenings) which our parishioners have always held as a very high priority at each Parish Assembly in the last ten years. In addition, we were able to enhance and complete many upgrades of our site that were in need of our attention after fifty years: Complete the roof work in Saint John Vianney and in the Parish Center Offices as well as replace the air condition/heat systems, resurface and stripe the black-top of the parking lot on Fir Street, provide special parking spaces for our seniors for easy access to the church for mass, the care and enhancement of our landscaping and the painting of our site. We are currently in the process of completing the work on our Roland Digital Grand Piano and reviewing the options for an organ since the original instrument, because of age was evaluated as an extreme fire hazard. Repairing the organ would be more than purchasing another, and if moved (as planned to the Choir Area) would take up over half of the space needed for our choirs). Finally, we are in contact with the Diocese of Orange and the City of Brea to move forward with the LED Parish Signage on Walnut Avenue. These are a few of our projects that have transpired because of your support and care. Our vision for this PSA 2017 is to continue to support our Youth, Jr. High, and Young Adult Ministries and to supplement the purchase of an organ for our parish.

It is our belief that Saint Angela Merici has consistently been generous stewards when specific endeavors or projects for ministry and the life of the parish are warranted, so it is important to listen to your heart as we begin PSA 2017. Your pledge is very important to the work, ministry, and the growth of our parish. This year's presenters, Susie and Dave Beas, Chris Blake, and Carolyn Lamka will share their own personal faith journey and how Saint Angela Merici has enabled them and their families to embrace more intimately their Catholic-Christian identity. As you reflect on your pledge, remember all stewardship is returned to our parish once we have met our pledge-goal of One Hundred and Two Thousand Dollars) \$102,000.00 This year we are asking for each person (family) to pledge \$400.00 (Four Hundred Dollars) which is about \$33.00 a month or approximately \$8.25 a week. You may pledge on the envelopes provided in the pews or on the parish website or you may want to take a pledge envelope home and pray and discern about your stewardship support. Your response to God's generosity will certainly be evident in the experience of Church at Saint Angela Merici. Please pledge. Pledge now. Pledge to make a difference. Pledge to witness to your gratefulness to God and the desire to see us continue to faithfully fulfill our Gospel-mission as a Parish Faith Community. Now is the Time!
