



YEAR OF MERCY



I used to think God

Listening is something that we think we do well, but the truth is we are very selective about what we listen to and how we hear what is being said. Sometimes when we do not want to listen to something or what someone is saying *we pretend we just did not hear what was being said!* It's not that others do not repeat themselves two or three times, it is just that we act like the question was never posed. I honestly do not believe that we did not recognize what was being said, we just do not want to follow-through with what was being asked of us or we do not want to accept what was being told to us. Of course what tends to happen over time is that we learn to enhance these skills and the ability to *selectively hear what we want to hear and choose to imagine that what we do not want to hear was never said or expressed.*

In today's Gospel-word, tell says: *my sheep hear my voice ... and they follow me* (John 10). Unfortunately (and perhaps unintentionally) it is *not* that we do not hear Jesus' voice nor is it that we do not recognize his voice or understand what he wants, it is more that we simply are not so disposed to what he is asking of us! We are hesitant to follow because we are not too sure where we are being led to or we are reluctant to go because we know what it might mean and we are just not willing to surrender a part of our ourselves and our thinking that may ask something of us that we are afraid to face. Mercy invites us to follow, but mercy is undermined by a deep-seeded fear of listening and hearing. It seems Jesus' words get lost or sifted and we end up surrendering to the misleading allurements of an immediate gratification or pleasure that our culture and society is good at offering to us as an alternative. We *never hear* Jesus say: ...*I give them eternal life and they shall never perish* (John 10).

The allure of something that is momentary, easy, simple, and quick is more attractive rather than working out the challenges in life. We want our problems to simply go away. Jesus offers an answer to our difficulties, we just do like the route of facing up to what is going on and trying to work things through by allowing God to take hold of what really is shouting out and even screaming to be transformed and changed in our lives. To justify our choice of *not hearing* like the Jews in today's Gospel ... we *become filled with jealousy and with violent abuse* (Act 13). *Abuse is very often a response to the truth of something we just do not want to hear* and often results in the opposite of what we hoped to achieve: We become victims to the struggle of violence within ourselves or become the pawn of the jealousy of others giving in to a "culture of death" that can never reach deep enough into our lives and offer us what we really need to experience being set free.

Jesus' invitation is not a quick answer to the vicissitudes of life. Life is often complicated and often asks more than an easy solution. Jesus looks at the big picture of our lives and offers us what in the long-run will provide us with what we all hope for, dream of, and look forward toward. How often in hindsight have we expressed those infamous words: ... "if only I had listened ... or if only I had done what I was asked or told to do." Jesus is not just offering us heaven he is inviting us in mercy to a life that is fulfilling, that has depth, that is enriching, and he provides us with a healthy journey for our very souls, but like everything in life, the opportunities do not always repeat themselves. Listening and recognizing as well as clearing the clutter that clogs our ability to hear and see what is being offered is what is really at the heart of today's word. Perhaps part of the Easter gift of resurrection is the ability to hear ... to hear and to recognize the voice of mercy ... Jesus ... and then to follow ...

Dear Fellow Stewards of God's Ministry:

One thing my parents always taught me, and I am sure all of us have heard it over and over again when we were young is: *Say Thank You!* It seems easy, these three little words which often became a matter of habit; however to cultivate a grateful heart is more than "saying thank you" it is a long-life challenge that hopefully becomes integrated into our lives so that a sense of gratefulness becomes intention, deliberate, a gateway to loving and serving as Jesus did. In this *Year of Mercy*, we are reminded of the "great benefactor" who invites us to accept the risen Jesus into our lives ... even if we have been far away ... all we need do is take a step toward him; he awaits with open arms (Pope Francis). No matter how far we may feel we have created a distance within ourselves, others, and God, God never abandons us nor does his generous love ever fail us!

Our experience of *mercy* moves and empowers us to extend ourselves to others that they too may come to know the Risen Christ and the all inclusive mercy of our God, and also moves us to regenerate with a grateful heart the sharing of our time and treasure. This year's *Pastoral Services Appeal* is not simply about a pledge or the sharing of treasure, *it is a response to the mercy of God*. We have all walked the Road to Emmaus ... the road of broken dreams, shattered hopes, and unbelievable disappointments and brokenness. Like the disciples whose lives seem to hit rock bottom, soon discover that the Risen Jesus was with them through the shadows of their lives, and ... *their hearts filled with the joy* moved them to realize that the mercy of God is not ever lost or exhausted. Their stewardship was one of proclamation: *The Lord has Risen!* We are invited to share from our own experience of despair and lost hope how the Risen Christ has never abandoned us even in our darkest hour, and it is ... *opening the eyes of hearts*, like the

disciples on the Road to Emmaus we come to recognize the Risen Christ ... and say: ... *Thank you Jesus! Thank you, Lord!* As we journey together with *Gratitude*, we ask you to express the same mercy that we have all experienced, so others who still walk the road of Emmaus and seem lost and without hope will discover the Risen Christ by our support of *our Diocesan and Parish Ministries and the development of Youth, and the maintenance of our facilities in order to share the mercy of God beyond our Saint Angela Merici through the Pastoral Services Appeal (PSA)*.

Please consider responding in mercy and gratefulness by sharing \$101,000. Our Parish Assessment is \$350. After we have met our goal, all stewardship is returned to Saint Angela Merici. Reflect on your own walk to Emmaus and extend mercy to those who are still making that journey. Be the very ... *open arm of Jesus* ... *be the one who encourages someone to move toward Jesus* ... *be the one who assures our God never abandons anyone and it is His desire that no one is left on the side or excluded, or unloved.* The *Pastoral Services Appeal* is an avenue of *Gratefulness* that enables us lead others into the heart of God's mercy. Respond in Gratefulness. Respond in Mercy. Respond because we are apostles of mercy. Respond because by touching and soothing the wounds of today that affect the bodies and souls of many of our sisters and brothers, we profess Jesus and make him present and alive and allow others by the touch of his mercy to recognize Jesus and Lord and God!


Pope Francis' document: *Amoris Laetitia – The Joy of Love* will be presented in a series each week during the Year of Mercy. It is an easy-reading document and inspires us to become a People of Mercy. We are presenting *The Joy of Love* in its original English translation without commentary as an avenue of reflection and prayer during this Easter Time of Mercy.

The Joy of Love experienced by families is also the joy of the Church. As the Synod Fathers noted, for all the many signs of crisis in the institution of marriage, “the desire to marry and form a family remains vibrant, especially among young people, and this is an inspiration to the Church”.¹ As a response to that desire, “the Christian proclamation on the family is good news indeed”.²

The Synod process allowed for an examination of the situation of families in today’s world, and thus for a broader vision and a re-newed awareness of the importance of marriage and the family. The complexity of the issues that arose revealed the need for continued open discussion of a number of doctrinal, moral, spiritual, and pastoral questions. The thinking of pastors and theologians, if faithful to the Church, honest, realistic and creative, will help us to achieve greater clarity. The debates carried on in the media, in certain publications and even among the Church’s ministers, range from an immoderate desire for total change without sufficient reflection or grounding, to an attitude that would solve everything by applying general rules or deriving undue conclusions from particular theological considerations.

I must also say that the Synod process proved both impressive and illuminating. I am grateful for the many contributions that helped me to appreciate more fully the problems faced by families throughout the world. The various interventions of the Synod Fathers, to which I paid close heed, made up, as it were, a multifaceted gem reflecting many legitimate concerns and honest questions. For this reason, I thought it appropriate to prepare a post-synodal Apostolic Exhortation to gather the contributions of the two recent Synods on the family, while adding other considerations as an aid to reflection, dialogue and pastoral practice, and as a help and encouragement to families in their daily commitments and challenges.

This Exhortation is especially timely in this Jubilee Year of Mercy. First, because it represents an invitation to Christian families to value the gifts of marriage and the family, and to persevere in a love strengthened by the virtues of generosity, commitment, fidelity and patience. Second, because it seeks to encourage everyone to be a sign of mercy and closeness wherever family life remains imperfect or lacks peace and joy.

WITNESS TO WETNESS MYSTERY RITUAL



As twenty-first century Americans, many of us have been desensitized to the subtle impact symbols and metaphors can have on our experience of the gift and mystery of creation. Among the powerful realizations we encounter during our worship is the impact of simple things, such as bread, wine, water and light. These vitally important elements are so ubiquitous in our liturgical experience we often don't even think about them. During the Easter Season we will experience the complex sacramental, symbolic, metaphor of water, often without connecting consciously with what the ritual may be all about. We are invited to allow it to remind us of our Baptism, as the prayer of blessing suggests, but underlying that is a complex reality

we often overlook. The fundamental thrust of the reforms of the Second Vatican Council was to bring us to *full, conscious, active participation* in all the elements of the sacred liturgy. Do we allow ourselves to do that?

Most of us think of baptism as an event; We were baptized at some point in the past and are reminded of that event, even if we were infants at the time and have no direct recollection of it. With the traditional understanding of cleansing us from the effects of Original Sin, it's easy to think of Baptism in terms of being purely an event. However, it is possible that based on the new understanding of the primacy of Baptism in the lives of Christians, it may not be just an event but could also be much more than that. For instance, in the Epistle for the Easter Vigil (Rom. 6:3-11) St. Paul reminds us that through Baptism we die and rise with Christ. Baptism claims us for Christ, unites us with Christ and cleanses us from sin. Our Sprinkling Rite reminds us of the fact and action of our baptism, but ideally it also awakens us to realities way beyond the mere facts of a long ago moment we cannot directly remember, if we allow it to.

The *Sprinkling Rite* of Mass symbolizes the effects of God's love and mercy in freely washing away our sins—it is not the water itself that cleanses us, but the fact of God's love washing over us in an immense flow. It may be difficult to imagine a few drops of water adequately representing the flood of divine love and mercy that pours over us, but that's one of the things we are invited to engage with as the priest walks among us allowing us to feel the wetness. If we are in tune with the parched nature of our thirsty souls, we long for just a touch of that sweet moisture. As we experience the water, we are reminded again that we have been claimed for Christ and walk in the mystery and wonder of how pure that makes us, not of our own power but through the gift and wonder of God's mercy and love for us. Through dying and rising with Christ, we know that the painful, difficult and complicated moments of life all have meaning and purpose, whether or not we are aware of that purpose or meaning at any given time.

Another thing that remembering Baptism allows us to do is become aware again of the full nature of God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Baptism is very Trinitarian, which throughout the history of the Church has been a catechetical challenge to teach. Most of us have lost sight of the mystery of the Trinity, unless we fully engage the Sprinkling Rite and remember the intimate nature of our relationship with the Triune God through Baptism.

While the aforementioned aspects of Baptism are not mutually exclusive, the liturgy invites us to give full attention to one or another at different times. Sometimes, the focus is Paschal (dying and rising with Jesus), sometimes it is Purifying (cleansing of sin), and sometimes it is Sacramental (ratifying our initiation into the Church). Which one may be operative at any given moment might not be a matter of which we are fully conscious. Does that mean it doesn't matter, or does that mean we need to work on our consciousness? During the Easter Season we will have plenty of opportunity to consider the matter.
