

Reflection

Today's Gospel finds the disciples gathered behind closed doors and they had good reason to be afraid: Perhaps the Synagogue officials might be searching for them. They were in a state of shock. Jesus' death seems to be something they just could not fathom, and his absence only served to feed into their fears. It is obvious they felt they had very few options available to them other than to hide and lock themselves behind closed doors and windows that were absolutely shut tight. Their fear is familiar to all of us. Each of us at one time or another have experienced moments when we wanted to "hide" behind closed doors and lock it tight out of fear. Personal fear is sometimes more threatening than we realize because all of us attempt to shelter ourselves, cover-up or hide our insecurities behind a myriad of excuses. We pretend in order to mask what we refuse to acknowledge. The imagery of a "locked door" only serves to highlight a very basic human response to fear. Like our own, the fear of the disciples was complex, nagging, and very palatable. Only one week after Easter we are presented with a portrait that seems to be absent of any glory or the warmth of Jesus who was reassuring at the tomb with the women.

Thomas was the one who was not hiding out with the other disciples. The story does not say where he was or what he was doing, but we can speculate the fear the other disciples were experiencing was not haunting Thomas and yet, he is forever known as the "doubting Thomas." A skeptical hesitation who is not all eager to surrender his life to a supposedly Risen Christ, and yet this doubting Thomas is not without his own fears, it simply finds its way to the surface when he says : ... unless I put my finger into his nail marks and put my hand into his side I will not believe ... (John 20). Let us not be deceived. Thomas was afraid, but he has "masked" it in an appearance (as many of us do) in his bold proclamation. Thomas' hidden fear is that death is death, and despite Easter, things are just not going to be any different. So why hide? Let us just get on with life, but Thomas is really not moving forward, his fear is pushing him backwards, and this is clearly illustrated in his expression of a wavering faith, if not the absence of faith. Thomas' situation is more complex and even richer than the simple summary indicating that Thomas was a doubter, because it is precisely in the midst of Thomas' unbelief, Jesus breaks in ... Peace be with you! (John 20). It is Jesus who reveals to Thomas and us that our tombs may very well be the "gateway to life" and just a damp, dark, refuge for us to hide! Easter is the reminder that the Risen Christ confronts us with the grace of closure. Some phases of life end and there are things that simply cannot be retrieved. Some things fade before we are ready to see them go. Some situations terminate before their time. Some moments may leave us grieving beyond all telling, but what the Risen Jesus is saying is when we begin to realize that life moves from one stage to another, from one moment to another, from one kind of presence to another, we can begin to embrace the new life that comes from our loss. Jesus allowed his death and resurrection so that one way of life would end and another could begin. The appearance of the Risen Jesus is now new, entirely transformed by the revolutionary event of Christ rising. Easter does not make our difficulties go away, it does not make problems vanish, it does not make the challenges any easier, it is not the avoidance of death, but what it does is give these experiences another shape, another color, another hue, so our response to life's vicissitudes will not hold us hostage by our fears.

Like Thomas, we are often "held back" by our old ways of being, thinking, and believing. We refuse to believe that things could be different. We want resurrection, we desire Easter, but we are unwilling to embrace the change and transformation, the transition from one way of understanding life to another in order to experience a greater depth of living. Once Thomas faced this fear he was able to come to resurrection and allow Christ to take him from unbelief to belief, from death to life. One week after Easter if we still see people and situations in the same way as we always have, then perhaps like Thomas we have yet to come to that Easter moment in which Jesus says: ... put your finger here and see my hands and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe! (John 20). Today, Jesus offers us the same consoling welcome: ... peace be with you! (John 20), all we need is to be willing like Thomas to allow Christ to take us from our old way of living to the new life of Easter!



DOUBT DELIVERS DEPTH TO THE DEVOUT

A familiar adage of former President Ronald Reagan was “Trust but verify,” that probably was the attitude of the Apostle Thomas who has since become known as “Doubting Thomas.” Without direct experience of a mysterious event, like the Resurrection of Jesus, how can we, or anyone, just merely accept such an extraordinary claim at face value? Thomas is much like us, because we are reluctant to embrace things as true without explicit validation of their veracity. We seek “certainty,” which is the point of “trust but verify.” When it comes to relationship, trust is the verification of the veracity of the other person. In important relationships however, we trust the account of the other person, because we know the person claiming such an event to be reliable. We deem them to be trustworthy. Relationships build trust and trust builds relationships. As we focus on the Resurrection, **Now is the time** for our acceptance, gratitude, trust and surrender to the mystery of our relationship with God through the amazing events of the Resurrection. We trust the relationship of those who knew Jesus personally and told us about this amazing event. Because of the “truth” of the Resurrection, we have the basis of an ongoing relationship that transcends all boundaries and limitations. That is our faith!

An idea that seems enlightening and amusing is based on the flippant question of: “What keeps the world moving?” The answer is: **two stripes of paint**. What saves most people, most of the time, from oblivion (through a head-on collision in their automobile) is simply the two stripes of paint in the center of the highway. Actually, it isn’t the paint itself that prevents disaster, it is TRUST. We trust that other people will cue into the wisdom of those simple lines and respect the boundary they represent. **Trust keeps the world moving**. Our whole economic order is also based on faith and trust. Because we cannot verify, in any concrete way, the events of the Easter story, we must accept the words of Jesus, *Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed* (John 20).

In a rational, scientific age, faith and trust may seem like an extravagant waste of our intellectual resources. Our skeptical age challenges us to question everything, and nowadays even “facts” are considered dubious. Since the time of Augustine, people have sought to reconcile the demands of faith and reason. The verification of mystery does not lie in a field bounded by Heisenberg’s Uncertainty Principle and Gödel’s Incompleteness Theorem. The verification we seek is bounded by an empty tomb and eyewitness encounters of fishermen and farmers twenty centuries ago. Thomas invites us to experience and examine the wounded Christ all around us, even today. The eyes of faith will reveal much, but like the Letter to the Hebrews states: “Faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things unseen.” (Hebrews 11:1) If doubt leads to faith, then let us doubt deeply. Let us not grow indifferent to doubt just because it is difficult. Doubt can lead to a rich harvest of faith if we trust the one who draws us into relationship of mercy, mutuality and mindfulness.


