

Reflection

Today's Gospel presents the followers of Jesus encounter with a stranger on the road to Emmaus. They were despondent. They have just witnessed the death of the one they thought would save them: ... we were hoping they told the stranger, that Jesus would be the one who would set Israel free (Luke 24). Instead they watched the so-called Messiah helpless to defend himself, slaughtered, and certainly not the savior of the world. Taking the road home was a nightmare.

This slow and whispered pace is something we can identify with because all of us have walked that path ourselves: A road filed with millions of lives and dreams that are shattered and tomorrow's hopes broken. Some of us manage to carry on, but others are unable. Some do know where they are or might stop by the wayside because they simply cannot go on. Similar to the two disciples on the road we have all walked the "street of broken dreams." Talking provides us with some consolation and cushions our pain: "If he just did not infuriate his enemies, the antagonisms would not have come to a head on Good Friday." In the end, all of Jesus followers fled in despair, except for a few women, yet it is in this precise moment that the Risen Lord joins them on their journey and encourages them to "express their pain." Jesus listens, but more importantly he enables them to overcome their despair by empowering them to move forward. They do not recognize him. Maybe because they did not expect to see him or they were blinded by their grief and disappointment, but the "stranger" continues to talk and ... *interprets for them every passage of Scripture which referred to him* (Luke 24), and they find their hearts warmed: ... were not hearts burning within us while he spoke to us (Luke 24). Jesus' very words and the breaking of the bread shared with one another opened their eyes to the proof that Jesus was still with them! Sometimes broken dreams remain broken, but when we see those dreams in a different way, from a different perspective, with a different attitude, then *Easter Happens!* (Luke 24).

The experience the disciples lived the previous week remained. Nothing was undone. The same dreams remained, but now those dreams were seen from a different perspective, from a different minds-eye, from a different way of understanding life. This is precisely how Easter happens. It is when everything seems lost that Jesus walks beside us opening our eyes and our minds (Luke 24) to the possibility that life is not meant to be a "dead-end tomb." Like the disciples, we do not always recognize Jesus or what he is trying to offer us (Luke 24), but maybe this is the point of today's story: Jesus continues to explain and open up the "scriptures for us" over and over again especially when everything seems to be going wrong until our eyes and minds understand how Easter provides us with the option that our pain does not have the final word, but it is the Risen Christ who can take the most horrific situation and turn our disappointments, if ever so slightly, so we can come to grasp and embrace the fact that God can reshape even the worst situations of life.

We often place God in "a box and seal it tightly" limiting not only our experience of God, but resurrection. Thank God that Easter Happens ... God bursts through the box of the disciples walking along the road to Emmaus and the road of our own personal broken dreams to become a new vision beyond our wildest imagination. Emmaus reminds us that we simply cannot settle for so little from ourselves and God. The Easter Proclamation is that God "does not stay put! Not even a box can keep Good Friday at bay: Easter does happen!"

Christ is Risen. Christ is Risen. Christ is Truly Risen!

Holy Oils

We were on the "oil team." At least that is what our badges said. We were representing the diocese In the packaging up of the Holy Oils for distribution through the parishes. This was a sacred duty and we took our jobs seriously and worked our line mechanically as we Poured, affixed lid, wiped thoroughly, Packaged up the three bottles consisting of:

The Oil of Catechumens,
The Oil of the Infirm, and
The Oil of Chrism,
Carefully.



We completed our mechanical duties and in an hour, with our allotted Oil, was Distributed completely in the bottles. We walked away with The fragrant Oil of Chrism Permeating our hands.

Oil of the Infirm



The Oil of the Infirm is used in the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick (formerly known as Extreme Unction). St. James wrote, "Is there anyone sick among you? He should ask for the priests of the church. They in turn are to pray over him, anointing him with oil in the Name of the Lord. This prayer uttered in faith will reclaim the one who is ill, and the Lord will restore him to health. If he has committed any sins, forgiveness will be his" (James 5:14-15).

A laying on of hands unifying the person with the Universal Church joining the sick with The Holy Spirit that comes, breathes upon them fulfilling desires to complete God and man a pure union.

Oil of the Catechumens

The Oil of Catechumens is used in connection with the Sacrament of Baptism. St. Hippolytus in his Apostolic Tradition (A.D. 215) wrote of an "Oil of Exorcism" used to anoint the candidates immediately before baptism. This practice still continues: In the current baptismal liturgy, the priest offers the prayer of exorcism and then anoints the person to be baptized on the chest, saying,

"We anoint you with the oil of salvation in the name of Christ our Savior; may He strengthen you with His power, who lives and reigns forever and ever." Anointing with the Oil of Catechumens following a prayer of exorcism may also take place during the period of the Catechumenate on one or several occasions. In both cases this anointing symbolizes the person's need for the help and strength of God to sever the bondage of the past and to overcome the opposition of the devil so that he may profess his faith, come to baptism, and live as a child of God.



Holy Chrism

Holy Chrism is different from that of the other oils: Here the Bishop breathes over the vessel of Chrism, a gesture which symbolizes both the Holy Spirit coming down to consecrate this oil, and the life-giving, sanctifying nature of the character of the sacraments for which it is used. It is a mixture of olive oil and balsam, an aromatic resin. This oil is linked with the sanctification of individuals. In the Old Testament times, the priest, prophets and kings of the Jewish people were anointed with this very fragrant oil.

During Sunday Eucharist, Baptisms and confirmations are Celebrated wholly.


