# ASCENSION

CHRIST IS RISEN! ALLELUIA! MAY 8, 2016 MOTHER'S DAY-YEAR OF MERCY

#### Ascension, Sending Forth, and the Eucharist



Traditionally we say that the Ascension of the Lord takes place forty days after his resurrection from the dead (see Acts of the Apostles 1:1-3, 9-10). So the Feast of the Ascension should have taken place on Thursday. But here in our diocese, and in many dioceses in the US (a few exceptions being the ones in the East Coast), it is transferred to the nearest Sunday. Anyway, was it really forty days? In the Gospel of Luke (24:50-53) which we have for this Ascension Sunday, it seems that resurrection and ascension happen on the same Sunday evening! And the author of St. Luke's Gospel was also the one who wrote the Acts of the Apostles! In a way, numbers and chronology can be misleading. Biblical numbers tend to be more symbolic; and sometimes, not to be taken literally. What is really at stake about the Ascension, at least according to Luke, is that it marks the end of Jesus' time on earth and the beginning of the mission of the Church. In that sense, Jesus "commissions" his disciples. He sends them forth to continue his work of preaching the Good News to all people and nations after his time on earth is over—knowing in reality that Jesus still stays with his people until the end of time.

The idea of "sending forth" is essential to our faith. Abraham the father of faith was sent from his father's country to an unknown land (Gen 12). The Gospels also end with some kind of sending. For example, John 20:21

states: "As the Father sent me, so I send you." The early disciples of Jesus were sent to proclaim the Gospel. However, we can also safely predict that it was not easy for them to be sent. Any kind of sending presupposes some kind of dying. We are sent, not to impose our identity on others, but to discover who we are with and for the others. And that may mean a "dying" to who we are. The first mission of the early Church (i.e., the mission of the early disciples of Jesus) was one to proclaim the Gospel to the Gentiles. In that process, the early disciples painfully discovered the loss of their own identity that was solely Jewish. As the first followers of Jesus slowly became "Christians," they slowly experienced the death of their privileged Israelite heritage as the Church opened itself to Gentile (non-Jew) believers. We take things for granted these days: we cannot even imagine the magnitude and the seriousness of the situation back in the early Church between Jewish and Gentile Christians.

Nevertheless, the point here is that any sending is difficult. The apostles of Jesus were tempted just to stay in Jerusalem. That would have been a lot more comfortable. But the Lord sent them forth. Despite whatever hesitations they might have had, they did go. Traditions tell us that they all went on their separate ways to proclaim the Gospel. Each one of them also met his terrible martyred fate—with the exception of John the Apostle. For example, Peter was crucified in Rome; Thomas went to India and was martyred there; etc. Any kind of sending, indeed, implies some kind of death, sometimes real death...

In these weeks of May, a lot of parishes around the world are also hosting first communion celebrations for the children. The Eucharist is also a sending forth. The traditional name for the Eucharist is the *Mass*. I always ask the first communion children the root meaning of the word *Mass*. Of course, their answers—though not incorrect in themselves—do not take the word to its original meaning. The word itself is taken from the last line of the old Tridentine (Latin) rite: *Ite, misa est*—which, translated, literally means: "Go, it has been *sent*." And as I explain again and again in these first communion celebrations, the word *mass* is related to the word *missionary*. Both come from the Latin verb *mittere*: to send. A missionary is someone who is sent. And when we go to Mass, we do not go to stay at the church, but to be dismissed from it. We go to in order to be *sent* back out into the world. We are sent out to do the work that Jesus commissioned his followers to do after his Ascension: to proclaim the Gospel to the world.

#### A MOTHER'S DAY REFLECTION



Today we celebrate Mother's Day and yet many of us are not aware the first Mother's Day was proclaimed on May 9, 1914 by President Woodrow Wilson through the efforts of Anna Jarvis of Philadelphia who wanted to remember her mother and all mothers. Anna's mother had been very active in working to improve the health of people and she convinced her mother's church to celebrate Mother's Day on the anniversary of her mother's death. She campaigned for a national day and her efforts convinced Woodrow Wilson to choose this special day. In this *Year of Mercy*, I thought it important to be aware of the women who find this day very difficult because of personal experiences. I found an article by Vinita Hampton Wright entitled, *Mother with child: A Mother's Day Reflection*, from U.S. Catholic Magazine and have included excerpts for prayer and reflection as we celebrate Mother's Day in this *Year of Mercy*.



#### A Mother's Day Reflection for the Year of Mercy

Some are not mothers by choice. Maybe the reasons are medical or maybe they have to do with the demands of a career or call by God or a ministry that would be hard on a family. Some are not mothers simply because life took a certain path that did not include motherhood and that decision was consistent with who they are and what they loved. Maybe some never married or arrived at a situation that was considered healthy for the nurturing of children. Maybe major life events removed them from the motherhood track. Some are not mothers because of severe damage in their life. That damage could be abuse, debilitating depression, addiction, or other illness, or a condition of soul that has required most of their time and energy for the sake of healing and restoration. All of this got in the way of life that includes partnership and childrearing. Some are not mothers despite every effort made to become one, trying for months or years to become pregnant or to finalize an adoption, but those plans were thwarted at every turn, through no fault of theirs. The only people who could possibly understand how desperate and abandoned they feel are those who have experienced this situation themselves. Whatever the reason for being childless, please know this: You are indeed a source of life to the world. You possess the ability to nurture others, and, if you free yourself to do so, you will be amazed at how fertile you actually are. There is no substitute for physical motherhood, and for one who longs to have children in her house, nothing else will do. Do not ever deny the grief of that. Do not minimize this burden of emptiness. Do not repress your desire to give birth. That very desire is a unique and particular energy of womanhood, for those who have children and those who have not. Motherhood has to do with protecting life while it's in formation, whether that is life in the womb or the life of a struggling ministry or the life of a family that has been battered by circumstances. Motherhood is about a mentoring relationship, and mentoring happens whenever the need is identified and the mentor and mentee are willing. So, when we speak of motherhood or as we honor it, honor the transcendent gift of motherhood in all its forms. Happy Mother's Day to you-beloved of God, one who is blessed and who blesses others.

Pope Francis' document: Amoris Laetitia — The Joy of Love will be presented in a series each week during the Year of Mercy. It is an easy-reading document and inspires us to become a People of Mercy. We are presenting The Joy of Love in its original English translation without commentary as an avenue of reflection and prayer during this Easter Time of Mercy.



#### The Fourth in the Series

The couple that loves and begets life is a true, living icon – not an idol like those of stone or gold prohibited by the Decalogue – capable of revealing God the Creator and Savior. For this reason, fruitful love becomes a symbol of God's inner life (cf. *Gen* 1:28; 9:7; 17:2-5, 16; 28:3; 35:11; 48:3-4). This is why the Genesis account, following the "priestly tradition," is interwoven with various genealogical accounts (cf. 4:17-22, 25-26; 5; 10; 11:10-32; 25:1-4, 12-17, 19-26; 36). The ability of human couples to beget life is the path along which the history of salvation progresses. Seen this way, the couple's fruitful relationship becomes an image for understanding and describing the mystery of God himself, for in the Christian vision of the Trinity, God is contemplated as Father, Son and Spirit of love. The triune God is a communion of love, and the family is its living reflection. Saint John Paul II shed light on this when he said, "Our God in his deepest mystery is not solitude, but a family, for he has within himself fatherhood, sonship and the essence of the family, which is love. That love, in the divine family, is the Holy Spirit." 6 The family is thus not unrelated to God's very being. 7 This Trinitarian dimension finds expression in the theology of Saint Paul, who relates the couple to the "mystery" of the union of Christ and the Church (cf. *Eph* 5:21-33).

In speaking of marriage, Jesus refers us to yet another page of Genesis, which, in its second chapter, paints a splendid and detailed portrait of the couple. First, we see the man, who anxiously seeks "a helper fit for him" (vv. 18, 20), capable of alleviating the solitude which he feels amid the animals and the world around him. The original Hebrew suggests a direct encounter, face to face, eye to eye, in a kind of silent dialogue, for where love is concerned, silence is always more eloquent than words. It is an encounter with a face, a "thou," who reflects God's own love and is man's "best possession, a helper fit for him and a pillar of support," in the words of the biblical sage (*Sir* 36:24). Or again, as the woman of the Song of Solomon will sing in a magnificent profession of love and mutual self-bestowal: "My beloved is mine and I am his... I am my beloved's and my beloved is mine" (2:16; 6:3).

This encounter, which relieves man's solitude, gives rise to new birth and to the family. Significantly, Adam, who is also the man of every time and place, together with his wife, starts a new family. Jesus speaks of this by quoting the passage from Genesis: "The man shall be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one" (*Mt* 19:5; cf. *Gen* 2:24). The very word "to be joined" or "to cleave," in the original Hebrew, bespeaks a profound harmony, a closeness both physical and interior, to such an extent that the word is used to describe our union with God: "My soul clings to you" (*Ps* 63:8). The marital union is thus evoked not only in its sexual and corporal dimension, but also in its voluntary self-giving in love. The result of this union is that the two "become one flesh", both physically and in the union of their hearts and lives, and, eventually, in a child, who will share not only genetically but also spiritually in the "flesh" of both parents.



Dear Fellow Stewards of God's Ministry:

One thing my parents always taught me, and I am sure all of us have heard it over and over again when we were young is: Say Thank You! It seems easy, these three little words which often became a matter of habit; however to cultivate a grateful heart is more than "saying thank you" it is a life-long challenge that hopefully becomes integrated into our lives so that a sense of gratefulness becomes intentional, deliberate, a gateway to loving and serving as Jesus did. In this Year of Mercy, we are reminded of the "great benefactor" who invites us to accept the risen Jesus into our lives ... even if we have been far away ... all we need do is take a step toward him; he awaits with open arms (Pope Francis). No matter how far we may feel we have created a distance within our selves, others, and God, God never abandons us nor does his generous love ever fail us!

Our experience of *mercy* moves and empowers us to extend ourselves to others that they too may come to know the Risen Christ and the all inclusive mercy of our God, and also moves us to regenerate with a grateful heart the sharing of our time and treasure. This year's Pastoral Services Appeal is not simply about a pledge or the sharing of treasure, it is a response to the mercy of God. We have all walked the Road to Emmaus ... the road of broken dreams, shattered hopes, and unbelievable disappointments and brokenness. Like the disciples whose lives seem to hit rock bottom, soon discover that the Risen Jesus was with them through the shadows of their lives, and ... their hearts filled with the joy moved them to realize that the mercy of God is not ever lost or exhausted. Their stewardship was one of proclamation: The Lord has Risen! We are invited to share from our own experience of despair and lost hope how the Risen Christ has never abandoned us even in our darkest hour, and it is ... opening the eyes of hearts, like the

disciples on the Road to Emmaus we come to recognize the Risen Christ ... and say: ... Thank you Jesus! Thank you, Lord! As we journey together with Gratitude, we ask you to express the same mercy that we have all experienced, so others who still walk the road of Emmaus and seem lost and without hope will discover the Risen Christ by our support of our Diocesan and Parish Ministries and the development of Youth, and the maintenance of our facilities in order to share the mercy of God beyond our Saint Angela Merici through the Pastoral Services Appeal (PSA).

Our Parish assessment is \$101,000. Please consider responding in mercy and gratefulness by sharing \$350. PSA envelopes will be available in the pews or you may go to the Parish website and pledge on line. After we have met our goal, all stewardship is returned to Saint Angela Merici. Reflect on your own walk to Emmaus and extend mercy to those who are still making that journey. Be the very ... open arm of Jesus ... be the one who encourages someone to move toward Jesus ... be the one who assures our God never abandons anyone and it is His desire that no one is left on the side or excluded, or unloved. The Pastoral Services Appeal is an avenue of Gratefulness that enables us to lead others into the heart of God's mercy. Respond in Gratefulness. Respond in Mercy. Respond because we are apostles of mercy. Respond because by touching and soothing the wounds of today that affect the bodies and souls of many of our sisters and brothers, we profess Jesus and make him present and alive and allow others by the touch of his mercy to recognize Jesus and Lord and God!


