Sometimes we would accompany them as they made their trek for a new dwelling place for us to live, but as kids a house was a house. It is only as I looked back I can understand the reasons they placed a priority on all the amenities: The size of a room, the space, which area could use a make-over and how this parcel would meet our needs or serve our purposes. It was not just a house they were searching for, but a place to "create a home." It was an expression of their love, affection, and their affirmation of the importance of building a true dwelling place in which we could experience intimately what it meant to be a family.

Today's Gospel presents Jesus telling his disciples: ... *I go to prepare a place for you ... and I will come back again and take you to myself, so that where I am you also may be* (John 14). In the same way as my parents wanted more than just a place to live, but wanted to create a family dwelling, so Jesus desires to prepare a home within us. I do not believe he was referring simply to our "afterlife in heaven" or some far way future state of being, as much as it is his desire to draw us into an intimate and close relationship with God. *I am the way and the truth and life* (John 14) Jesus tells Thomas. There is no doubt that Jesus is expressing God's deepest hope to create and craft within us a place to intimately dwell deep within our lives. Where we need to distance ourselves however, is from Thomas, Philip, and the disciples' perception of God: ... *we do not know the way ... how can we know the way ... show us the Father and that will be enough* (John 14). Jesus response is a strong: ... *have I been with you for so long a time and you still do not know me?* (John 14). The disciple's response is understandable as is ours especially when Jesus may be leading us into uncharted territory that may not be clear, safe or where we do not want to go. It is more comfortable to keep God at bay rather than be drawn into the implications of what it means when we truly allow Jesus to begin to shape our inner lives. Perhaps this is the reason Jesus says: ... *I am the way, the truth, and the life* (John 14) because he wants to make it clear what really lies at the heart of his relationship with us is what he creates *within* us. This is where the "staying power" lays in our lives. Jesus prepares a place in us so that there will be no mistake and no doubt that our lives are nothing less than centered on God himself. The challenge before us is no different than it was for the disciples: Are we willing to allow Jesus into the very guts of our lives?

Our stumbling block is always fear. A troubled mind and heart of what will happen when we let Jesus into our lives is the greatest gamble, but Jesus assures us ... *have faith in God; have faith also in me* (John 14). This may sound rudimentary, but the truth is the more we allow God into our lives the more difficult it can be simply because "we know." Our awareness has been heightened. We are cognizant of the choices, the difference between what feeds life into us and what distances us from God, what engenders a cleavage between God and ourselves and what creates an intimate dwelling place for God in our hearts. Sometimes the immediate satisfaction of reaching for what we think we need now is more attractive than waiting for God to make a home in our lives; however, Jesus affirms that ... *you will do greater things than me* (John 14). Maybe the pivotal point of today's word is our willingness to overcome our hesitations and allow Jesus to prepare a place within us so we can accomplish even greater things in our lives, but what are these "greater things?" Jesus does not say. He gives us no hint. Possibly when he says ... *have faith in God and have faith in me* (John 14) he is referring to the moment we surrender ourselves to him and allow God to create a home in us is when we will be astonished, confounded, and overwhelmed of what we are capable of accomplishing. Perhaps this is part of the Easter mystery. The surprise that God believes in us more than we believe in ourselves and that he can imagine that we can do even greater things than God himself, but then this should not come as a surprise, not if God has found a dwelling place within us, because ultimately it is all about God and not about us!



## A MOTHER'S DAY REFLECTION

Today we celebrate Mother's Day and yet many of us may not be aware that the first Mother's Day was proclaimed on May 9, 1914 by President Woodrow Wilson through the efforts of Anna Jarvis of Philadelphia who wanted to remember her mother and all mothers. Anna's mother had been very active in working to improve the health of people and she convinced her mother's church

to celebrate Mother's Day on the anniversary of her mother's death. She campaigned for a national day and her efforts convinced Woodrow Wilson to designate this special occasion. Although, this is a "special day" in which we recall moms, for some this day can be very difficult because of their personal experiences. I found an article by Vinita Hampton Wright entitled, *Mother with child: A Mother's Day Reflection*, from U.S. Catholic Magazine and I have included excerpts for our prayer and reflection as we celebrate Mother's Day.

### *A Mother's Day Reflection: Motherhood In All Its Forms*

Some are not mothers by choice. Maybe the reasons are medical or maybe they have to do with the demands of a career or call by God or a ministry that would be hard on a family. Some are not mothers simply because life took a certain path that did not include motherhood and that decision was consistent with who they are and what they loved. Maybe some never married or arrived at a situation that was considered not healthy for the nurturing of children. Maybe major life events removed them from the motherhood track. Some are not mothers because of severe damage in their life. That damage could be abuse, debilitating depression, addiction, or other illness, or a condition of soul that has required most of their time and energy for the sake of healing and restoration. All of this got in the way of life that includes partnership and child-rearing. Some are not mothers despite every effort made to become one, trying for months or years to become pregnant or to finalize an adoption, but those plans were thwarted at every turn, through no fault of theirs. The only people who could possibly understand how desperate and abandoned they feel are those who have experienced this situation themselves. Whatever the reason for being childless, please know this: You are indeed a source of life to the world. You possess the ability to nurture others, and, if you free yourself to do so, you will be amazed at how fertile you actually are. There is no substitute for physical motherhood, and for one who longs to have children in her house, nothing else will do. Do not ever deny the grief of that. Do not minimize this burden of emptiness. Do not repress your desire to give birth. That very desire is a unique and particular energy of womanhood, for those who have children and those who have not.

As we celebrate Mother's Day, let us remember Motherhood has to do with protecting life while it is in formation, whether that is life in the womb or the living out life within a family or by one's self. Motherhood is about mentoring relationships whenever the need is identified and the mentor and mentee are willing. So, when we speak of motherhood and as we honor it today, we honor the transcendent gift of motherhood in all its forms. Happy Mother's Day to you-beloved of God, one who is blessed and who blesses others.

# Parish Life

## Work, School and Community : Give emergency kits to people who count on you (college students, elderly parents, etc.)

Put together basic emergency kits for people who may not be able to do so for themselves or for those who may not think of doing it for themselves. Show them what is in the kit and talk to them about disasters.

Make sure the kit meets their specific needs. For instance, if someone takes prescription medicine, include a list of medications and dosages. For a college student, make sure the kit is small enough to store in the space they have available.

### **College Students**

Talk to your college student about how you will stay in touch if a disaster occurs. Make sure they understand that cell phones may not work during a disaster. Choose an emergency contact who does not live near you or the college. Arrange with your student to call that person if they can't reach you during a disaster.


Visit the website for your student's college to find out about the school's disaster plans and procedures. Some colleges will provide a phone number that you can call in an emergency. If you don't find the number on the website, call the admissions office and ask. Add the number to your emergency contact list. Make sure your student knows to call you if there is an emergency on campus. Also, ensure your student is registered for any emergency notification system on their campus.

### **Insurance**

Talk to your insurance agent to find out if your policy covers your student's belongings while they are away at school. You may need to buy an additional renter's policy. Also check with your health insurance carrier to find out where your student can find covered healthcare at school.



## Your Marriage is Important




