Reflection

We live in a time in which so many claim to possess the truth: Politically, nation after nation proclaims the truth of their intentions. Extreme religious zealots believe terrorism is the only true avenue to express their conviction that they possess the truth. Commercials portray themselves in such a way that "experts" are enlisted to testify to the truth of their product, and even our own culture has raised relativism

to such a height that many of us believe that "everything is equal" and that the truth is variable depending on the circumstances, the situation or our personal preferences.

Jesus promises to be with us in a new way: ... *I will ask God to give you another Paraclete to be with you always ... the Spirit of Truth* (John 14). The truth whether it comes from God or not is something that is both welcomed, but also viewed with some hesitancy. We often skirt around it, deny it or even try to bury it. Truth is a strange mix and so is our reaction to it, but it may not be as strange when we realize that the truth often throws light on the half-truths of our lives. Truth is often the avenue that reveals something about ourselves, our circumstance, our way of thinking, our way of being, that we have chosen to tuck away for a myriad of reasons. Facing the truth is something we are not prone to embrace. So we avoid it, which of course only makes it worse. We need not look far at what happens with a "small innocent lie" that escalates in time to something we need to constantly be vigilant about in order to keep "the truth" believable, or how about our denial of our addictions such as alcohol, drugs, food, or inappropriate behavior? The more we avoid the truth, the worse it gets, and it is not only about hiding the truth, as it is also about continuing to allow the way we do things to manifest itself and reach new heights that effect ourselves and others which often reaches a point that attempts to retrieve the truth of our lives almost seem impossible. The truth is, when we ignore the truth, it becomes bigger than ourselves.

Jesus says ... *those who obey the commandments are the ones who love me and they who love me will be loved by God ... and I will reveal myself to them* (John 14). When Jesus speaks about love the focus is on one who reveals. To love is to reveal and to reveal is to live in truth. It is impossible to love when we hide or disguise the truth in our lives. Living half truths implies living half-loves, and when we live half-loves we are living deceitful lives. Living deceitful lives ultimately destroys our inner self and any hope of authentic relationship with another person or with God. The word tells us that Jesus is revealed in the truth. Truth is not simply a matter of being honest, because as people of faith who say we believe, the truth is about our willingness to stand in the truth of Jesus in such a way that what we say, what we do, and who we are is the lived-truth of what it means to dwell in the heart of God. The challenge of the truth lays in our willingness to "stand in truth" so that the truth will reveal not only what we need to change in our lives, but make visible the Risen Christ in who we are.

Jesus promises ... *not to leave us orphans* (John 14). He promises to be with us in a new way, but sometimes we do feel like orphans simply because the truth is we do not act like we really believe in God. Half-truths have skewed our awareness and capacity to realize and embrace this "new way" of living in truth that is being offered by Jesus. The effects can be disastrous, simply because it gives the impression to others that we do not have the sense that we stand for something. When everything is relative, and the truth is "everything goes" and when we have a "cafeteria mentality of our faith" in which we can pick and choose the truth then why bother to believe? Whatever we choose and whatever we do is acceptable. We can simply do whatever we want to do. To say we live in the truth of the resurrection is not only saying "we believe that God raised Jesus from the dead," but it is about becoming a people who believe in the truth of who we are. Maybe "actions do not" speak louder than words, but who we are is the crux by which others (through us) can ever experience the existential reality of the resurrection. We must first be convicted in our hearts with the truth of our lives, so recognizing within ourselves the conversion that is being called forth, we will then be the impetus that allows ourselves and others to be truly transformed by the life and truth of Jesus Christ.

Parish Life

Work, School and Community : Give emergency kits to people who count on you (college students, elderly parents, etc.)

Put together basic emergency kits for people who may not be able to do so for themselves or for those who may not think of doing it for themselves. Show them what is in the kit and talk to them about disasters.

Make sure the kit meets their specific needs. For instance, if someone takes prescription medicine, include a list of medications and dosages. For a college student, make sure the kit is small enough to store in the space they have available.

College Students

Talk to your college student about how you will stay in touch if a disaster occurs. Make sure they understand that cell phones may not work during a disaster. Choose an emergency contact who does not live near you or the college. Arrange with your student to call that person if they can't reach you during a disaster.


Visit the website for your student's college to find out about the school's disaster plans and procedures. Some colleges will provide a phone number that you can call in an emergency. If you don't find the number on the website, call the admissions office and ask. Add the number to your emergency contact list. Make sure your student knows to call you if there is an emergency on campus. Also, ensure your student is registered for any emergency notification system on their campus.

Insurance

Talk to your insurance agent to find out if your policy covers your student's belongings while they are away at school. You may need to buy an additional renter's policy. Also check with your health insurance carrier to find out where your student can find covered healthcare at school.
