

May 22, 2016 Year of Mercy



The Holy Trinity

The doctrine of the Most Holy Trinity is the greatest mystery of the Christian faith. It is the mystery of the one God in three Persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Attempts have been made over the centuries to shed light on this, but it will forever remain a mystery. This brings us back to the basic point of all Christian theology: whatever we speak of God, no matter how well spoken and articulated, will always fall short of the ultimate mystery of God. We realize that we can only speak of God in human language because we do not have access to God's language: medieval people called this concept "analogical" language—that we can only talk about God analogically. And yet, human language, as limited and defective as it is, is the only language that we have when speaking about God, or just about anything. While we can never speak adequately about God, it does not mean that we cannot speak of God intelligibly, or that we cannot know God or have a relationship with him. On this Feast of the Holy Trinity. I would like to examine the "relational" aspect of the one Godhead: the relation of God to all creatures.

Catholics differ from Protestants a great deal when it comes to the question of the relationship between God and his creatures. The traditional Protestant approach is characterized by a strong emphasis on God's total and absolute "otherness." The

famous Swiss Protestant theologian Karl Barth (d. 1968) would speak of the "infinite qualitative distinction" between God and humanity, so much so that God can only be made known paradoxically as the *deus absconditus* (the hidden God). That is to say: God is the totally/wholly "other." There is an infinite gap between God and the created realm. In this sense, it is understandable that Protestants in general do not honor the Blessed Mother and the saints as Catholics do—although a few Protestants do actually have devotions to Mary.

How about the Catholic approach to the same question? We acknowledge much merit in the classical Protestant position. That infinite qualitative distinction still holds. And so, as much as we hold the saints in high regard, we still have to remember that they are mere creatures. However, Catholics also look at things differently. We say that the beauty of God can be reflected in the beauty of creation. From the book of Genesis, we learn that God created everything and God saw how "good" it was. Most importantly, God created humanity in his own "image and likeness." Even though that image has been marred by sin, it was never completely destroyed. Somehow that image of God can still be found in humanity. Therefore, one can see that there is a close connection between God and his creatures—despite whatever infinite gap there may be. For Catholics, creation does not lead us away from, but toward, God. And that is why our veneration of the Blessed Mother and the saints, along with our use of sacramentals such as holy water and images and statues, do not constitute idolatry. Rather, all these are means by which we can feel more connected to the Creator through what he has created.

On this Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, we reflect on our humanity's goodness and dignity. The Responsorial Psalm for today's Mass, Psalm 8, reminds us that God made us just a "little less than the angels" despite our unworthiness. We are also reminded of our own need to thirst and to long for God. This longing can be expressed most beautifully by St. Augustine in his autobiography *The Confessions*: "Oh God you have made us for yourself and our heart is restless until it rests in you."


















Dear Fellow Stewards of God's Ministry:


Our experience of *mercy* moves and empowers us to extend ourselves to others that they too may come to know the Risen Christ and the all inclusive mercy of our God, and also moves us to regenerate with a grateful heart the sharing of our time and treasure. This year's Pastoral Services Appeal is not simply about a pledge or the sharing of treasure, it is a response to the mercy of God. We have all walked the Road to Emmaus ... the road of broken dreams, shattered hopes, and unbelievable disappointments and brokenness. Like the disciples whose lives seem to hit rock bottom, soon discover that the Risen Jesus was with them through the shadows of their lives, and ... their hearts filled with the joy moved them to realize that the mercy of God is not ever lost or exhausted. Their stewardship was one of proclamation: The Lord has Risen! We are invited to share from our own experience of despair and lost hope how the Risen Christ has never abandoned us even in our darkest hour, and it is ... opening the eyes of hearts, like the

disciples on the Road to Emmaus we come to recognize the Risen Christ ... and say: ... Thank you Jesus! Thank you, Lord! As we journey together with Gratitude, we ask you to express the same mercy that we have all experienced, so others who still walk the road of Emmaus and seem lost and without hope will discover the Risen Christ by our support of our Diocesan and Parish Ministries and the development of Youth, and the maintenance of our facilities in order to share the mercy of God beyond our Saint Angela Merici through the Pastoral Services Appeal (PSA).

Our Parish assessment is \$101,000. Please consider responding in mercy and gratefulness by sharing \$350. Pope Francis' document: Amoris Laetitia — The Joy of Love will be presented in a series each week during the Year of Mercy. It is an easy-reading document and inspires us to become a People of Mercy. We are presenting The Joy of Love in its original English translation without commentary as an avenue of reflection and prayer during this Easter Time of Mercy.



The Sixth in the Series

Parents have a serious responsibility for this work of education, as the Biblical sages often remind us (cf. *Prov* 3:11-12; 6:20-22; 13:1; 22:15; 23:13-14; 29:17). Children, for their part, are called to accept and practice the commandment: "Honor your father and your mother" (*Ex* 20:12). Here the verb "to honor" has to do with the fulfilment of family and social commitments; these are not to be disregarded under the pretense of religious motives (cf. *Mk* 7:11-13). "Whoever honors his father atones for sins, and whoever glorifies his mother is like one who lays up treasure" (*Sir* 3:3-4).

The Gospel goes on to remind us that children are not the property of a family, but have their own lives to lead. Jesus is a model of obedience to his earthly parents, placing himself under their charge (cf. *Lk* 2:51), but he also shows that children's life decisions and their Christian vocation may demand a parting for the sake of the Kingdom of God (cf. *Mt* 10:34-37; *Lk* 9:59-62). Jesus himself, at twelve years of age, tells Mary and Joseph that he has a greater mission to accomplish apart from his earthly family (cf. *Lk* 2:48-50). In this way, he shows the need for other, deeper bonds even within the family: "My mother and my brothers and sisters are those who hear the word of God and do it" (*Lk* 8:21).

Jesus himself was born into a modest family that soon had to flee to a foreign land. He visits the home of Peter, whose mother-in-law is ill (cf. *Mk* 1:30-31) and shows sympathy upon hearing of deaths in the homes of Jairus and Lazarus (cf. *Mk* 5:22-24, 35-43; *Jn* 11:1-44). He hears the desperate wailing of the widow of Nain for her dead son (cf. *Lk* 7:11-15) and heeds the plea of the father of an epileptic child in a small country town (cf. *Mk* 9:17-27). He goes to the homes of tax collectors like Matthew and Zacchaeus (cf. *Mt* 9:9-13; *Lk* 19:1-10), and speaks to sinners like the woman in the house of Simon the Pharisee (cf. *Lk* 7:36-50). Jesus knows the anxieties and tensions experienced by families and he weaves them into his parables: children who leave home to seek adventure (cf. *Lk* 15:11-32), or who prove troublesome (*Mt* 21:28-31) or fall prey to violence (*Mk* 12:1-9). He is also sensitive to the embarrassment caused by the lack of wine at a wedding feast (*Jn* 2:1-10), the failure of guests to come to a banquet (*Mt* 22:1-10), and the anxiety of a poor family over the loss of a coin (*Lk* 15:8-10).

In this brief review, we can see that the word of God is not a series of abstract ideas but rather a source of comfort and companionship for every family that experiences difficulties or suffering. For it shows them the goal of their journey, when God "will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, nei-ther shall there be mourning nor crying nor pain any more" (*Rev* 21:4).





It has been the policy on civil three day holidays and liturgical holidays since the early days of the founding of the parish to

Increasingly there has been confusion over the time of Eucharist on a civil holiday. *In order to standardize the holiday Eucharist, beginning with Memorial Day, May 30th, and all other civil threeday holidays, Eucharist will be celebrated at 8:00 AM instead of 9:00 AM (The policy of no 6:30 AM Eucharist on three-day a holiday will be retained).* We hope this change will eliminate any confusion for those who attend Eucharist on weekdays.
