FEAST OF THE BODY & BLOOD OF CHRIST

MAY 29, 2016
YEAR OF MERCY



Today's word focuses on the notion of nourishment: In Genesis ... *Melchizedek presents Abram with bread and wine* (Genesis 14), Paul speaks about the nourishment that is Christ (1Corinthians 11), but it is the Gospel that draws us into an interesting scenario. I believe what makes this particular story so interesting is the privy we have been accorded to the inner circle of Jesus and his disciples and are able to engage in the interaction and dialogue between them. Jesus leaves nothing to the imagination. He lays out the particulars very clearly and without reserve.

The disciples present to Jesus a real dilemma: The crowd Jesus healed would not disperse. They hung around and it was getting toward night. The disciples' response to this huge crowd makes sense: *...dismiss them so that they can go to the surrounding villages and farms and find lodging and provisions ... for we are in a deserted place ...* (Luke 9). Jesus' response comes as a surprise: *... give them some food yourselves* (Luke 9). It does not take much to imagine the disciples response because it would certainly be similar to our own: "Come on, Jesus! Look where we are ... we do not want to get saddled with this crowd and have to look after them all night long," but Jesus immediately challenges their resistance by *empowering them in mercy to make a difference. He literally gives them the option to turn the situation around, which only goes to show us how much God believes we are capable of doing when he hands us something to care for.* It is so natural for the disciples and ourselves to think that "Jesus will take care of it," but in this case he hands that power over to the disciples (as he often does with us) but like the disciples we resist the gift of taking God into our hands to initiate a change.

Mercy in this story twists this simple theme around from a nice parable about Jesus feeding the people to feeding others with the nourishment *they need* verses what we need in our lives. What the disciples needed was to "get rid of the crowd," what Jesus had in mind was to get the disciples to see beyond what is logical and makes sense to embrace the power he was giving them to "feed the crowd" because it was not just what the crowd needed (literally something to eat), but perhaps more importantly, for the disciples an eye-opener to understand that he was giving them the power to transform what they needed (getting rid of the crowd) to understand that the crowd's need would *transform themselves!* But atlas, like us, the disciples just did not get it. So, Jesus showed the disciples *what they could have accomplished themselves* if they were not so consumed with only what makes sense: *... he asks what is available and takes the five loaves and two fish and feeds the crowd to their satisfaction* (Luke 9).


It is very interesting that the story says: *... when the leftovers were picked up, they filled twelve wicker baskets* (Luke 9). At first glance we might think (again logically) the story was bringing home the point just how much Jesus was able to accomplish ... over and above what we need, but how about looking at this fragment of the story from a different perspective? Maybe there was so much left over because Jesus was hoping that the disciples (and ourselves) would finally understand how much he is entrusting to us. How much he is relying on us. How much he expects of us. *How much faith he has in us.* He leaves the fragments so we might take up what we resisted previously and make use of the gift of being empowered to make a nourishment-difference in others, and perhaps more importantly find ourselves being changed in the process. *Can you imagine how much the disciples might have been completely "made over" if they had taken up the invitation of Jesus to feed the crowd themselves with the five loaves and two fish and discover to their amazement that they had fed the entire crowd?*

The Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ is not merely about Jesus' nourishment for us or "receiving communion" or reverencing the Eucharist. It is this of course, but also more. It is about being transformed by the Body and Blood of Christ and realizing how much in the feeding of the Eucharist we are sincerely changed and are able to be transformative agents in the lives of others. Eucharist is about community. Jesus wanted the disciples to understand this, *not dismiss it*, because it is precisely in community that "Eucharist happens," and not just happens but, becomes the impetus of mercy which offers the nourishment that makes a difference, and enables us to truly understand that Eucharist is literally "given to us" to alter our way of perceiving things and believe, embrace and take up the fragments that are left over so we might continue the mission of Jesus' nourishment of building up a community: The Community of the Body and Blood of Christ.

LOVE IN MARRIAGE

All that has been said so far would be insufficient to express the Gospel of marriage and the family, were we not also to *speak of love*. Indeed, the grace of the sacrament of marriage is intended before all else “to perfect the couple’s love”.¹⁰⁴ Here too we can say that, “even if I have faith so as to remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. If I give all I have, and if I deliver my body to be burned, but have not love, I gain nothing” (*1 Cor 13:2-3*). The word “love”, however, is commonly used and often misused.

“Faithful to Christ’s teaching we look to the reality of the family today in all its complexity, with both its lights and shadows... Anthropological and cultural changes in our times influence all aspects of life and call for an analytic and diversified approach.” “Equal consideration needs to be given to the growing danger represented by an extreme individualism which weakens family bonds and ends up considering each member of the family as an isolated unit, leading in some cases to the idea that one’s personality is shaped by his or her desires, which are considered absolute”. “The tensions created by an overly individualistic culture, caught up with possessions and pleasures, leads to intolerance and hostility in families.” Included is today’s fast pace of life, stress and organizational structures often militate against permanent decisions. We also encounter widespread uncertainty and ambiguity. Freedom of choice makes it possible to plan our lives and to make the most of ourselves, when these factors affect our understanding of the family, it can come to be seen as a way station, helpful when convenient, or a setting in which rights can be asserted while relationships are left to the changing winds of personal desire and circumstances.

We need a healthy dose of self-criticism. Then too, we often present marriage in such a way that its unitive meaning, its call to grow in love and its ideal of mutual assistance are overshadowed by an almost exclusive insistence on the duty of procreation. Nor have we always provided solid guidance to young married couples, understanding their timetables, their way of thinking and their concrete concerns. We have long thought that simply by stressing doctrinal, bioethical and moral issues, without encouraging openness to grace, we were providing sufficient support to families, strengthening the marriage bond and giving meaning to marital life. We also find it hard to make room for the consciences of the faithful, who very often respond as best they can to the Gospel amid their limitations, and are capable of carrying out their own discernment in complex situations. We have been called to form consciences, not to replace them.



Dear Fellow Stewards of God's Ministry:

One thing my parents always taught me, and I am sure all of us have heard it over and over again when we were young is: *Say Thank You!* It seems easy, these three little words which often became a matter of habit; however to cultivate a grateful heart is more than “saying thank you” it is a life-long challenge that hopefully becomes integrated into our lives so that a sense of gratefulness becomes intentional, deliberate, a gateway to loving and serving as Jesus did. In this *Year of Mercy*, we are reminded of the “great benefactor” who invites us to *accept the risen Jesus into our lives ... even if we have been far away ... all we need do is take a step toward him; he awaits with open arms* (Pope Francis). No matter how far we may feel we have created a distance within our selves, others, and God, God never abandons us nor does his generous love ever fail us!

Our experience of mercy moves and empowers us to extend ourselves to others that they too may come to know the Risen Christ and the all inclusive mercy of our God, and also moves us to regenerate with a grateful heart the sharing of our time and treasure. This year's *Pastoral Services Appeal* is *not* simply about a pledge or the sharing of treasure, *it is a response to the mercy of God*. We have all walked the Road to Emmaus ... the road of broken dreams, shattered hopes, and unbelievable disappointments and brokenness. Like the disciples whose lives seem to hit rock bottom, soon discover that the Risen Jesus was with them through the shadows of their lives, and ... *their hearts filled with the joy* moved them to realize that the mercy of God is not ever lost or exhausted. Their stewardship was one of proclamation: *The Lord has Risen!* We are invited to share from our own experience of despair and lost hope how the Risen Christ has never abandoned us even in our darkest hour, and it is ... *opening the eyes of hearts*, like the

disciples on the Road to Emmaus we come to recognize the Risen Christ ... and say: ...*Thank you Jesus! Thank you, Lord!* As we journey together with *Gratitude*, we ask you to express the same mercy that we have all experienced, so others who still walk the road of Emmaus and seem lost and without hope will discover the Risen Christ by our support of *our Diocesan and Parish Ministries and the development of Youth, and the maintenance of our facilities in order to share the mercy of God beyond our Saint Angela Merici through the Pastoral Services Appeal (PSA)*.

Our Parish assessment is \$101,000. Please consider responding in mercy and gratefulness by sharing \$350. PSA envelopes will be available in the pews or you may go to the Parish website and pledge on line. After we have met our goal, all stewardship is returned to Saint Angela Merici. Reflect on your own walk to Emmaus and extend mercy to those who are still making that journey. Be the very ... open arm of Jesus ... be the one who encourages someone to move toward Jesus ... be the one who assures our God never abandons anyone and it is His desire that no one is left on the side or excluded, or unloved. The Pastoral Services Appeal is an avenue of Gratefulness that enables us to lead others into the heart of God's mercy. Respond in Gratefulness. Respond in Mercy. Respond because we are apostles of mercy. Respond because by touching and soothing the wounds of today that affect the bodies and souls of many of our sisters and brothers, we profess Jesus and make him present and alive and allow others by the touch of his mercy to recognize Jesus and Lord and God!


