

TENTH SUNDAY OF THE LITURGICAL YEAR SUMMERFEST WEEKEND JUNE 5, 2016 YEAR OF MERCY





Greek philosophy and literature have shaped a good part of Western civilization. Even as Christians, we are greatly indebted to the Greeks. We certainly have learned a lot from ancient authors such as Socrates, Plato, Aristotle, Homer, Hesiod, Sophocles, etc. I myself have always been fascinated by ancient Greek/Roman mythologies. However, I also find them depressing because there is a certain kind of *fatalism* in Greek tragedy. If one were fated or destined to be doomed, no matter what he does, that terrible fate awaits him. For example, one can think of the tragic story of Oedipus the King, who was fated to kill his father, among other things: as much as he wanted to avert his terrible destiny, he was doomed and there was no way out. This theme is very common in Greek tragedy. And for this reason, Greek tragedy is quite *tragic*.

Fortunately, Christianity does not fall into this endless abyss of despair. There is always a way out, even from the most dire circumstances. Our readings for this 10th Sunday of Ordinary Time (Year C) remind us of the importance of the

virtue of "hope." The first reading is taken from the first book of Kings (ch. 17). Elijah the prophet was sent during the drought to a "pagan" widow in Sidon. She and her son only had enough food for one meal before they die. And yet the prophet of God demanded that she bake him a cake to eat! In the ancient world, widows were among the most vulnerable people. That is why the Old Testament prophets would condemn any act of injustice against the vulnerable, especially widows and orphans. But the paradox about the widow in question is that when one hits rock bottom and can no longer give, it is then that one is *really* asked to give. And as always, the Lord provides. We learn that through the pleading of Elijah, God did indeed provide enough food for the widow and her son. Even later when the son fell grievously ill, God would restore him to health; thus, averting the terrible consequence that could have fallen on the poor widow—having lost her son after the death of her husband.

The Gospel reading, the famous narrative about the widow of Nain, only appears in the Gospel of Luke (7:11-17). The story itself is somewhat similar to that of the first reading: except that the only son of this widow in the town of Nain had already died. One could only imagine the dire state of this poor woman—having lost her husband, and now her only son. Essentially she lost *everything*. She had no financial security, and no one to rely on. When Jesus saw that, his heart was moved with pity. In his mercy, he restored life to the young son of the widow. Again, as in the case of the widow of Zarephath in the land of Sidon, in this most hopeless situation, the Lord is able to bring about a good ending.

What do these two stories tell us about God? Imagine for a moment that if these scripts were written by the ancient Greek poets, the ending would have been very predictable: these two widows would surely have met their terrible fates. However, our God is always greater. Our God always gives us hope. God is always able to bring about a favorable ending, even out of the most dismal circumstances. And that is easy to see: if God created the universe from nothing (*creatio ex nihilo*), the same God can surely provide hope to his people even in the most hopeless situations. That is the POWER of God! And that is Good News for us! We do not have to be mired in hopelessness, but always look forward to a future full of hope with our God.



Dear Fellow Stewards of God's Ministry:

One thing my parents always taught me, and I am sure all of us have heard it over and over again when we were young is: Say Thank You! 

The Eighth in the Series

Some Challenges

The responses given to the two pre-synodal consultations spoke of a great variety of situations and the new challenges that they pose. Many of the respondents pointed to the problems families face in raising children. In many cases, parents come home exhausted, not wanting to talk, and many families no longer even share a common meal. Distractions abound, including an addiction to television. This makes it all the more difficult for parents to hand on the faith to their children. Other responses pointed to the effect of severe stress on families, who often seem more caught up with securing their future than with enjoying the present. This is a broader cultural problem, aggravated by fears about steady employment, finances and the future of children.

Drug use was also mentioned as one of the scourges of our time, causing immense suffering and even breakup for many families. The same is true of alcoholism, gambling and other addictions. The family could be the place where these are prevented and overcome, but society and politics fail to see that families at risk. We see the serious effects of this breakdown in families torn apart, the young uprooted and the elderly abandoned, children who are orphans of living parents, adolescents and young adults confused and unsupported." I would like to stress the fact that, even though significant advances have been made in the recognition of women's rights and their participation in public life, in some countries much remains to be done to promote these rights. I think particularly of the shameful ill-treatment to which women are sometimes subjected, domestic violence and various forms of enslavement which, rather than a show of masculine power, are craven acts of cowardice. The verbal, physical, and sexual violence that women endure in some marriages contradicts the very nature of the conjugal union. There are those who believe that many of today's problems have arisen because of feminine emancipation. This argument is not valid, "it is false, untrue, a form of male chauvinism." The equal dignity of men and women makes us rejoice to see old forms of discrimination disappear, and within families there is a growing reciprocity. If certain forms of feminism have arisen which we must consider inadequate, we must nonetheless see in the women's movement the working of the Spirit for a clearer recognition of the dignity and rights of women.


