

ELEVENTH SUNDAY OF THE LITURGICAL YEAR

JUNE 12, 2016
YEAR OF MERCY



One of the Pharisees, Simon, invited Jesus to dine with him. He enters Simon's home and reclines at the table. Suddenly, an unnamed woman appears on the scene. According to the story she was known to be a "sinner." Note it does not state what her "sin" was! (Careful! Do not presume!) She has with her an alabaster jar filled with perfume. Weeping, she begins pouring her tears over Jesus' feet and wipes them with her hair and then anoints Jesus' feet with perfume. It is interesting that there seems to be no discomfort on Jesus' part with the gesture of this woman, but the opposite response is not true with Jesus host, Simon: ... *when the Pharisee saw this he said to himself, 'If this man were a prophet, he would know who and what sort of woman this is who is touching him.* (Luke 7). What makes this scene so intriguing may not be so obvious. Despite what we may think, Jesus was *not* trying to draw attention to the woman. She did this herself by touching and anointing Jesus! Rather, it seems to me, Jesus wants to make sure Simon and ourselves understand something more profound. It might be easy for us to see in Jesus' words praise for the woman and an indictment of Simon, but I do not believe that is what Jesus is trying to do. I think what Jesus was attempting was

to state the obvious (which was not apparent to Simon and may not be the case with ourselves either). *Jesus was making a statement of fact not of judgment.* He juxtaposes the images of Simon and the woman as two ways of being and these images are not just meant for Simon and the woman, but ourselves as well. It seems to me, all of us live in a continuum between Simon and the women. At times we have been Simon; other times we are the woman or we have been both, and perhaps, that is where most find ourselves.


It seems to me we are most like Simon when we become rigid, narrow and codify life. When we see rules and beliefs as more important than people. We exemplify Simon when we believe Jesus sees, thinks, and acts like us or when we pretend to be someone we are not and are sure we are right and others are wrong, which only feeds into our excessive confidence and arrogance about our place and position. Whenever we are Simon, life becomes hardened and closed. We offer no water, no kiss, no oil. Truly, at those moments we are neither present nor available to the fullness of life as it lays before us; however, when we are like the woman and do not allow our lives to be determined by the judgment of others or ourselves and do not see perfectionism and the need for approval as something that governs our lives, but rather we craft ourselves to see, think, and act like Jesus, living without pretense without the need to be right, control or be the winner and are disposed to becoming vulnerable, authentic and transparent. Whenever we are the woman in our lives we are willing to change and grow.

The woman sees life in a way Simon cannot: Life is personified by, revealed in, and made available through Jesus. *It cannot be possessed only received.* Simon and the woman in many ways do shape our lives in a particular direction that often determines who we are and how we relate to others and ourselves. *It is less a choice as much as it is conscious change.* It is a whole new way of being and it is grounded in forgiveness. The difficulty however, is for us, all too often, forgiveness is associated with the experiences, words, actions, and feelings of the past. We make them concrete and the defining characteristic by which we identify ourselves or another and then project the past as a future reality and when we do this we begin to set boundaries and limits on what we or others can and cannot be. That is precisely what Simon has done. He knows this women's past and that is how he sees her today and how he will see her tomorrow and the day after. The woman knows the same history, but something has shifted. In the presence of Jesus she refused to be bound by the past. She refuses to allow her feelings, failings, stares, the thoughts, the reputation, the voices and the judgments to shape who she is. A new way of being and living has poured forth from this woman in the encounter she experienced at a simple dinner in which Jesus was invited. Jesus offers us forgiveness, but it is *not* simply just another chance to make another choice, a better choice, or to do it differently, as it is the freedom to be different, to no longer be bound by the past. Something Simon could comprehend. Jesus makes it very clear that the basis of being saved is faith. No one receives forgiveness based on deeds of righteousness and this astounds Simon's guests: ... *who is this man who even forgives sins ...* (Luke 8). Those who recognize God's forgiveness will love much and that love which turns one's self and personal gain to the person who is loved. It is the experience of being released. In the continuum of life we, like Simon and the woman, face *not a choice, but a willingness to consciously change.* It is the freedom to emerge *out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life!* The word of Jesus today is for everyone: *Your sins are forgiven go in peace* and how we understand Jesus' words will determine where we stand in the continuum of faith and life.

We are presenting *The Joy of Love* in its original English translation without commentary as an avenue of reflection and prayer during this Easter Time of Mercy.

The Ninth in the Series



Men “play an equally decisive role in family life, particularly with regard to the protection and support of their wives and children... Many men are conscious of the importance of their role in the family and live their masculinity accordingly. The absence of a father gravely affects family life and the upbringing of children and their integration into society. This absence, which may be physical, emotional, psychological and spiritual, deprives children of a suitable father figure.” Yet another challenge is posed by the various forms of an ideology of gender that “denies the difference and reciprocity in nature of a man and a woman and envisages a society without sexual differences, thereby eliminating the anthropological basis of the family. This ideology leads to educational programs and legislative enactments that promote a personal identity and emotional intimacy radically separated from the biological difference between male and female. Consequently, human identity becomes the choice of the individual, one which can also change over time.”

It is a source of concern that some ideologies of this sort, which seek to respond to what are at times understandable aspirations, manage to assert themselves as absolute and unquestionable, even dictating how children should be raised. It needs to be emphasized that “biological sex and the sociocultural role of sex (gender) can be distinguished but not separated.”⁴⁶ On the other hand, “the technological revolution in the field of human procreation has introduced the ability to manipulate the reproductive act, making it independent of the sexual relationship between a man and a woman. In this way, human life and parenthood have become modular and separable realities, subject mainly to the wishes of individuals or couples.”⁴⁷ It is one thing to be understanding of human weakness and the complexities of life, and another to accept ideologies that attempt to sunder what are inseparable aspects of reality. Let us not fall into the sin of trying to replace the Creator. We are creatures, and not omnipotent. Creation is prior to us and must be received as a gift. At the same time, we are called to protect our humanity, and this means, in the first place, accepting it and respecting it as it was created.

I thank God that many families, which are far from considering themselves perfect, live in love, fulfill their calling and keep moving forward, even if they fall many times along the way. The Synod’s reflections show us that there is no stereotype of the ideal family, but rather a challenging mosaic made up of many different realities, with all their joys, hopes and problems. The situations that concern us are challenges. We should not be trapped into wasting our energy in doleful laments, but rather seek new forms of missionary creativity. In every situation that presents itself, “the Church is conscious of the need to offer a word of truth and hope... The great values of marriage and the Christian family correspond to a yearning that is part and parcel of human existence.”



Dear Fellow Stewards of God's Ministry:

One thing my parents always taught me, and I am sure all of us have heard it over and over again when we were young is: *Say Thank You!* It seems easy, these three little words which often became a matter of habit; however to cultivate a grateful heart is more than “saying thank you” it is a life-long challenge that hopefully becomes integrated into our lives so that a sense of gratefulness becomes intentional, deliberate, a gateway to loving and serving as Jesus did. In this *Year of Mercy*, we are reminded of the “great benefactor” who invites us to *accept the risen Jesus into our lives ... even if we have been far away ... all we need do is take a step toward him; he awaits with open arms* (Pope Francis). No matter how far we may feel we have created a distance within our selves, others, and God, God never abandons us nor does his generous love ever fail us!

Our experience of mercy moves and empowers us to extend ourselves to others that they too may come to know the Risen Christ and the all inclusive mercy of our God, and also moves us to regenerate with a grateful heart the sharing of our time and treasure. This year's *Pastoral Services Appeal* is *not* simply about a pledge or the sharing of treasure, *it is a response to the mercy of God*. We have all walked the Road to Emmaus ... the road of broken dreams, shattered hopes, and unbelievable disappointments and brokenness. Like the disciples whose lives seem to hit rock bottom, soon discover that the Risen Jesus was with them through the shadows of their lives, and ... *their hearts filled with the joy* moved them to realize that the mercy of God is not ever lost or exhausted. Their stewardship was one of proclamation: *The Lord has Risen!* We are invited to share from our own experience of despair and lost hope how the Risen Christ has never abandoned us even in our darkest hour, and it is ... *opening the eyes of hearts*, like the

disciples on the Road to Emmaus we come to recognize the Risen Christ ... and say: ...*Thank you Jesus! Thank you, Lord!* As we journey together with *Gratitude*, we ask you to express the same mercy that we have all experienced, so others who still walk the road of Emmaus and seem lost and without hope will discover the Risen Christ by our support of *our Diocesan and Parish Ministries and the development of Youth, and the maintenance of our facilities in order to share the mercy of God beyond our Saint Angela Merici through the Pastoral Services Appeal (PSA)*.

Our Parish assessment is \$101,000. Please consider responding in mercy and gratefulness by sharing \$350. PSA envelopes will be available in the pews or you may go to the Parish website and pledge on line. After we have met our goal, all stewardship is returned to Saint Angela Merici. Reflect on your own walk to Emmaus and extend mercy to those who are still making that journey. Be the very ... open arm of Jesus ... be the one who encourages someone to move toward Jesus ... be the one who assures our God never abandons anyone and it is His desire that no one is left on the side or excluded, or unloved. The Pastoral Services Appeal is an avenue of Gratefulness that enables us to lead others into the heart of God's mercy. Respond in Gratefulness. Respond in Mercy. Respond because we are apostles of mercy. Respond because by touching and soothing the wounds of today that affect the bodies and souls of many of our sisters and brothers, we profess Jesus and make him present and alive and allow others by the touch of his mercy to recognize Jesus and Lord and God!
