# Reflection

LET GOD



As difficult as it may be to accept, the truth is, the whole process of life is a lesson about learning how to let go. It is a hard and difficult challenge. Life is so complicated, enmeshed, inter-related, and is often blurred from one experience to another and it is not so easy to distinguish whether any aspect of our lives actually stand on its own. As a result, we often “hold on to things and people” because we are afraid that letting go may impact the big picture of our lives or we may discover we could lose something we value. For example, our world promises us a greater sense of life if we would only “tuck here or remove this or think this or don’t eat that ... or associate ourselves with certain individual-types or be known by this person or behave or respond in such a way that gives the impression we have gone through an entire make-over of our appearance. All these suggestions are not bad in themselves, but the emphasis seems to have very little to do with the essence of who “we are” our values, what we hold as a true priority in our lives nor does it address our attitudes about others and how we see the world and what we are willing to let go of in order to reflect a greater authenticity of ourselves and to those who we share life.

Perhaps the question at hand is: What do we hold on to so tight in life because somehow we think it will “last forever” and what is that gnawing feeling in our gut that tells us we need to let go because it stands in the way of God truly giving us what we really need. All of us hunger for life (Deuteronomy 8, 1Corinthians 10, John 6), but more often we go after the stuff that does not have a lasting effect. What appears good, lasts but a moment, and in time it fades and we find ourselves more diminished to the point of starving. The Jews quarreled among themselves about how Jesus could be the ... *living bread that came down from heaven* (John 6) because they could not let go of the embedded mind-frame of what is truly important is what you “cannot see.” Jesus says: ... *my flesh is true food and my blood true drink ... whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in them* (John 6). Jesus was trying to teach them the lesson of “letting go” of their way of living and thinking that held them hostage. He was offering them a life that would fulfill their every hunger and thirst so they would never be famished again. Unfortunately, they were so enmeshed in their beliefs they could not see the bigger picture Jesus was offering them.

So often we too settle for the mediocre. We go after the things that will fulfill our hopes and dreams for the moment, but cannot possibly deliver when it comes to the bigger picture of our lives. It is only when we learn it is not what is on the outside that is important, but what we “consume” spiritually that will ultimately transform us both inside and out, and it is only when we are willing to let go of the mistaken impression that we are God ( ... *don’t forget the Lord your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt* ... Deuteronomy 8) in which we think that we are the sole ones in control of our lives and that the prime determinate of our destinies, then we will come to experience the life that Jesus offers: ... *the one who feeds on me will have life because of me ... for this is the bread that came down from heaven ... whoever eats this bread will live forever* (John 6). The Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ is not simply about changing (like we so cavalierly change what we are going to wear on a particular day) nor is it merely about death and the afterlife, as much as it is about the opportunity to let go of the mind set and life style that continues to fool us into believing that the stuff of this world can ever deliver its promises. Jesus’ response is it cannot: .... *unlike your ancestors who ate and still died, whoever eats this bread will live forever ... (John 6).*



Cigars, a pipe ... weekend Bar-B-Qs, Sunday outings, a sailboat, the morning paper, poker night ... are but a few of the memories I have of my dad. How quickly memories once again rise with something as simple as catching a glimpse of a sailboat, or the excited sounds that accompany a family gathering in a park or the fragrance of someone puffing away on their cigar or pipe. Something so simple can open up an array of many memories of times long past. Please do not be mistaken, the memories of my father were not perfect. He was flawed, prone to mistakes, sometimes stern and periodically difficult to agree with. Although perfection eludes him, he has managed to lasso gentleness and a saturation of tender compassion, "so uncharacteristic" of what most of us associate with a man: He was occasionally "velvet" and other times seemed to be "made of steel." I can remember for

example, one day being in my room and then hearing a voice coming from the living room. It sounded like my dad was speaking to someone, but I knew no one was at home except him and I. Sneaking "behind the curtain" I discovered my dad praying. I never saw my dad pray ... I did not even know he knew how to pray or bothered to pray, but there he was talking to God and saying the rosary. This is one of the hidden secrets I have to this day allowed him to keep as his personal and private confidence. I never shared with him what I discovered. Another time when I was visiting home and getting ready to leave, my dad did something that totally "blew me away" ... he jumped up and ran to the front door, blocking it with his arms spread out and said ... "do you really need to leave now!"

When I was young I often misread my dad's motives and decisions. Now that I am older I have seen his directions boomerang back to me with a clarity that explains what I once misunderstood. My dad was an Ornamental Horticulturist. His profession was very systematic which one needs to be when handling cross-pollination and manipulating to create a new color for a rose (something I never agreed with)! Since I was wired by God so differently I can honestly admit we often did not see eye-to-eye on a lot of things! Dad was successful, made a great income and was well respected; however these accomplishments that many men "burn the tread off their lives to obtain" was not something that seduced him to think that these accomplishments validated a life-well-lived and guaranteed the respect we all crave. Success outside the home would never compensate or be a negotiating point to compromise his relationship to each of us in the family.

This Sunday people all over are celebrating Father's Day. For many, this day will bring great satisfaction as we honor the man we call Dad, Father, Daddy, or other "pet names" who has been a role model or even a hero to us. For others, it is a day when we feel sorrow because our father may be deceased. It is a good day to remember that just because our dad is not walking the earth does not mean his influence ceases to exist. Regrettably, many find that Father's Day is not a celebration, but a painful reminder of what could have been. Whether we experienced the love of a good earthly father, we can be assured that we *all* have a heavenly one, which may be hard to embrace if our experience with fatherhood only elicits images of negativity, however, even the heartache from an abusive, neglecting or absentee dad can be a propellant to steer us into becoming to others what our father may never have been for us. Truly, by the grace of God we can transform our pain within to assure we do not become a carbon copy of what was negligent in our lives.

Perhaps on this Father's Day, recalling the heritage of our faith can be an avenue of support and healing for us as we celebrate this special remembrance day: Abraham, "our father in faith," who trusted God. Joseph of Galilee who married Mary despite the unusual circumstances and dared to be righteous and that "just man." Jairus, whose daughter was dying and came to Jesus and witnessed his trust that God could help and it did not matter that he had wealth and prestige, and finally the father who had two sons and the one who strayed and then struggled to understand such extravagant love in the face of failure and infidelity. All these stories remind us of the extraordinary circumstances that surround the diverse and myriad images of our fathers and serve to provide us with the assurance whatever our experience has been, God is in every circumstance and memory of our dad: To heal the brokenness of a shattered life or to continue to deepen the blessings we have received. Let us not only pray for our dads today, but for ourselves, that whatever memories are generated on this day might be touched by God's hand in whatever way we need most.

# **Santarem Miracle**

## **The Feast of the Body & Blood of Christ**

In 1225 there was a woman living in Santarem, who was very unhappy with her marriage. She went to a sorceress. The sorceress promised the wife that her husband would return to his loving ways, if the wife would bring her a Consecrated Host.

This of course greatly frightened the woman, because she knew it was sacrilege, but nevertheless she finally gave in. She went to Mass at the Church of St. Steven, and received Communion, but did not consume the Host. Instead, she left the Church immediately, and took the Host out of her mouth, putting It into her veil. She then went to see the sorceress.

Along the way, the Host began to bleed inside the veil. The wife was not aware of it until a passersby brought it to her attention, thinking she herself was bleeding. Panic struck the woman and instead of going to the sorceress' house, she rushed home. She then put the bloody veil containing the Host into the bottom of a trunk, not knowing what else to do. When her husband came home, she said nothing.

Later in the night they were awakened by mysterious bright rays of light coming from the trunk, penetrating the wood and illuminating the entire room. The wife then confessed her sin to her husband and both of them knelt in adoration for the remaining hours until dawn, when the parish priest was summoned.

The bloody Host was taken in procession to the Church of St. Stephen, where it was encased in wax (to contain the blood and the Host) and secured in the tabernacle. Sometime later when the tabernacle was opened, another miracle was discovered. The wax that had encased the Host was found broken into pieces, and the Host was found miraculously enclosed in a crystal pyx, along with the precious Blood. This was later placed in a gold and silver pear-shaped monstrance with a "sunburst" of 33 rays, which still contains it today.

Miraculously, after 750 years, the precious blood still remains in liquid form, defying the natural laws of science. The Host is somewhat irregularly shaped, resembling real flesh with delicate veins running from top to bottom, where a quantity of blood is collected in the crystal.


