The lure of the summer months often finds us venturing to far-a-way places for weeks or to a local destination for a day and yet if there is one thing we will certainly encounter it is those flashing signs, the orange cones and those irritating directional arrows! It can be very frustrating that we find ourselves driving ten miles east in order to arrive at our destination just two miles to the west! So despite what we may think the surest sign that summer is here is not the hot weather, our vacation plans or the extra time to sit on our patio relaxing sipping on a lemonade; the one thing that says summer is here is the inevitable Detour Sign!

Despite all the misdirection, detours are not restricted to summer months. We too are capable of getting sidetracked, stalled, and re-routed in our lives. Very often we start out with good intentions and the next thing we know we are diverted. We zig-zag here and there and we end up somewhere else. We see no greater example of this than in today's Gospel: *Jesus is resolutely determined to journey to Jerusalem* (Luke 9), and runs into those who want to accompany him: ... *I will follow you ... but first let me say farewell to my family* (Luke 9). Jesus' response is direct and makes it clear just how difficult it is to follow him: .... *Foxes have dens and birds of the sky have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to rest his head ...* (Luke 9). Jesus' implication is that our "intentions may be noble at the onset," but we often find ourselves easily distracted or we find ourselves coming up with delayed excuses or a reason that will deter us from facing our hesitancy to follow him.

Jesus' invitation forces us to come face-to-face with the truth that following him is not simply about "following the leader." More importantly it seems to me, Jesus is inviting us to a journey that will lead to an authentic conversation in our lives: .... *no one who sets a hand on the plow and looks back to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God* (Luke 9). Perhaps this the reason sometimes a detour can be very attractive to us. Who among us cannot help "looking back?" We might even question Jesus' reasoning with reminiscing. After all, even Elisha asked Elijah: ... *let me kiss my father and mother good-bye and I will follow you* (1 Kings 19), but what I believe Jesus wants us to realize is that it is not simply about a willingness to follow him, as much as it is to be resolute about the implications of following Jesus. There are no compromises, shortcuts, stalling, or excuses. With Jesus it is all or nothing (Luke 9)... Not quite what we might anticipate when we say we will follow Jesus. Suddenly, the attractiveness of venturing out with Jesus begins to become less exciting than we initially thought it might be and the attractiveness is dulled when we fully realize the implications of saying "yes."

It cost Jesus everything to fulfill his journey. It would be naive for us to think following him would be anything less. There is a cost. We cannot simply say ... *I will follow you wherever you go* (Luke 9) and then begin to set stipulations, addendums, or clauses that will shape our journey to fit our comfort level. There are no GPS short-cuts here! *Following Jesus means buying into the route he sets for us*, and if we cannot live with the fact that the journey becomes the venue for a change of mind and heart, then we may have to confront the inevitable truth that we may be fooling ourselves and perhaps fess-up to the stark reality that we ... *just may not be fit for the kingdom of God* (Luke 9).

## June Mercy Sunday – Entrusting our dads in mercy ...

What does it mean to be a good dad? Once it might have meant providing for and protecting the family. For a new generation of American fathers however, the definition of what it means to be a good dad increasingly also includes washing the dishes, making dinner or taking the kids to school. Now, the expectation for good or bad, is both parents are breadwinners and caregivers. As we celebrate *June Mercy Sunday* we hold in mercy our dads and share a few thoughts and reflections of what some our dads believe it means to *just be a dad*:


- Requires that you know there's a difference between protecting and preventing. Involves the transition from being someone who was selfish, to one who is selfless.
- Causes me to accept the fact that it's really no longer about me anymore.
- *Asks that I always keep in mind the greater good is far more important than the perceived greatness of having goods.*
- Involves being able to walk a mile in pint sized shoes.
- *Means that just as soon as you've figured some aspect of parenting out, you have to learn another one as the kids keep changing too.*
- Involves knowing that your kids are watching and listening to everything you do or say.
- *Teaches you how to survive with less sleep, since your kids will get you up during the night when they are younger and keep you up at night once they are older.*
- Means that you make mistakes along the way, and that while you think you've just ruined your child for life in the process, you discover they're actually more resilient than you think.
- *Requires you to remember that once upon a time you did the same senseless and stupid things as a kid that your kids do today, and yet you somehow still survived.*
- Prepares you for hearing the word "again" each and every time you do something with the kids that is fun for them, but physically draining for yourself.
- *Quickly teaches you that no matter how many times you say "just this once" it will have no bearing whatsoever on how many times you'll be asked to do it.*
- Has one particular advantage over being a mom in that stress induced gray hairs on dads are actually viewed as positive and distinguished.
- *Nowadays requires that you are just as skilled with a spatula as you are with a screwdriver.*
- Is at the same time both the scariest accomplishment I have ever achieved (or ever will achieve) as well as the greatest accomplishment ever...by far!

Pope Francis' document: *Amoris Laetitia – The Joy of Love* will be presented in a series each week during the Year of Mercy. It is an easy-reading document and inspires us to become a People of Mercy. We are presenting *The Joy of Love* in its original English translation without commentary as an avenue of reflection and prayer during this Liturgical Year of Mercy.

## The Eleventh in the Series



### The Sacrament of Matrimony

Scripture and Tradition give us access to a knowledge of the Trinity, which is revealed with the features of a family. The family is the image of God, who is a communion of persons. At Christ's baptism, the Father's voice was heard, calling Jesus his beloved Son, and in this love we can recognize the Holy Spirit (cf. *Mk* 1:10-11). Jesus, who reconciled all things in himself and redeemed us from sin, not only returned marriage and the family to their original form, but also raised marriage to the sacramental sign of his love for the Church (cf. *Mt* 19:1-12; *Mk* 10:1-12; *Eph* 5:21-32). In the human family, gathered by Christ, 'the image and likeness' of the Most Holy Trinity (cf. *Gen* 1:26) has been restored, the mystery from which all true love flows. Through the Church, marriage and the family receive the grace of the Holy Spirit from Christ, in order to bear witness to the Gospel of God's love". The sacrament of marriage is not a social convention, an empty ritual or merely the outward sign of a commitment. The sacrament is a gift given for the sanctification and salvation of the spouses, since "their mutual belonging is a real representation, through the sacramental sign, of the same relationship between Christ and the Church. The married couple are therefore a permanent reminder for the Church of what took place on the cross; they are for one another and for their children witnesses of the salvation in which they share through the sacrament".<sup>64</sup> Marriage is a vocation, inasmuch as it is a response to a specific call to experience conjugal love as an imperfect sign of the love between Christ and the Church. Consequently, the decision to marry and to have a family ought to be the fruit of a process of vocational discernment.

"Mutual self-giving in the sacrament of matrimony is grounded in the grace of baptism, which establishes the foundational covenant of every person with Christ in the Church. In accepting each other, and with Christ's grace, the engaged couple promise each other total self-giving, faithfulness and openness to new life. The couple recognizes these elements as constitutive of marriage, gifts offered to them by God, and take seriously their mutual commitment, in God's name and in the presence of the Church. Faith thus makes it possible for them to assume the goods of marriage as commitments that can be better kept through the help of the grace of the sacrament... Consequently, the Church looks to married couples as the heart of the entire family, which, in turn, looks to Jesus".<sup>65</sup> The sacrament is not a "thing" or a "power", for in it Christ himself "now encounters Christian spouses... He dwells with them, gives them the strength to take up their crosses and so 57 follow him, to rise again after they have fallen, to forgive one another, to bear one another's burdens".<sup>66</sup> Christian marriage is a sign of how much Christ loved his Church in the covenant sealed on the cross, yet it also makes that love present in the communion of the spouses. By becoming one flesh, they embody the espousal of our human nature by the Son of God. That is why "in the joys of their love and family life, he gives them here on earth a foretaste of the wedding feast of the Lamb".<sup>67</sup> Even though the analogy between the human couple of husband and wife, and that of Christ and his Church, is "imperfect",<sup>68</sup> it inspires us to beg the Lord to bestow on every married couple an outpouring of his divine love.

## Dear Fellow Stewards of God's Ministry:

One thing my parents always taught me, and I am sure all of us have heard it over and over again when we were young is: *Say Thank You!* It seems easy, these three little words which often became a matter of habit; however to cultivate a grateful heart is more than “saying thank you” it is a life-long challenge that hopefully becomes integrated into our lives so that a sense of gratefulness becomes intentional, deliberate, a gateway to loving and serving as Jesus did. In this *Year of Mercy*, we are reminded of the “great benefactor” who invites us to *accept the risen Jesus into our lives ... even if we have been far away ... all we need do is take a step toward him; he awaits with open arms* (Pope Francis). No matter how far we may feel we have created a distance within our selves, others, and God, God never abandons us nor does his generous love ever fail us!

Our experience of mercy moves and empowers us to extend ourselves to others that they too may come to know the Risen Christ and the all inclusive mercy of our God, and also moves us to regenerate with a grateful heart the sharing of our time and treasure. This year's *Pastoral Services Appeal* is *not* simply about a pledge or the sharing of treasure, *it is a response to the mercy of God*. We have all walked the Road to Emmaus ... the road of broken dreams, shattered hopes, and unbelievable disappointments and brokenness. Like the disciples whose lives seem to hit rock bottom, soon discover that the Risen Jesus was with them through the shadows of their lives, and ... *their hearts filled with the joy* moved them to realize that the mercy of God is not ever lost or exhausted. Their stewardship was one of proclamation: *The Lord has Risen!* We are invited to share from our own experience of despair and lost hope how the Risen Christ has never abandoned us even in our darkest hour, and it is ... *opening the eyes of hearts*, like the

disciples on the Road to Emmaus we come to recognize the Risen Christ ... and say: ...*Thank you Jesus! Thank you, Lord!* As we journey together with *Gratitude*, we ask you to express the same mercy that we have all experienced, so others who still walk the road of Emmaus and seem lost and without hope will discover the Risen Christ by our support of *our Diocesan and Parish Ministries and the development of Youth, and the maintenance of our facilities in order to share the mercy of God beyond our Saint Angela Merici through the Pastoral Services Appeal (PSA)*.

***Our Parish assessment is \$101,000. Please consider responding in mercy and gratefulness by sharing \$350. PSA envelopes will be available in the pews or you may go to the Parish website and pledge on line.*** After we have met our goal, all stewardship is returned to Saint Angela Merici. Reflect on your own walk to Emmaus and extend mercy to those who are still making that journey. Be the very ... open arm of Jesus ... be the one who encourages someone to move toward Jesus ... be the one who assures our God never abandons anyone and it is His desire that no one is left on the side or excluded, or unloved. The Pastoral Services Appeal is an avenue of Gratefulness that enables us to lead others into the heart of God's mercy. Respond in Gratefulness. Respond in Mercy. Respond because we are apostles of mercy. Respond because by touching and soothing the wounds of today that affect the bodies and souls of many of our sisters and brothers, we profess Jesus and make him present and alive and allow others by the touch of his mercy to recognize Jesus and Lord and God!

**YEARLY MAINTENANCE AT SAINT ANGELA MERICI**

We have always taken some time to assure that our site is cleaned, upgraded, and restored. This year we will be cleaning the carpets in the Parish Center Offices and the Ministry Offices as well as in the Church and Adoration Chapel. We will also be cleaning and waxing the offices that have linoleum.
