

FIFTEENTH SUNDAY OF THE LITURGICAL YEAR

JULY 10, 2016 YEAR OF MERCY

Love ... love we say ... is what makes the world go 'round ... We all desire love, to share it and to receive it; and most of us believe we are motivated by good intentions of care, compassion, mercy, and love. Yet, love may not be as much a "natural" attribute as we may think. Many of us have personal experience as a parent or have noticed a baby or a young child when they desire something and their needs are not met immediately: They cry or scream and if that does not work, then there is always a tantrum! At a young age we all had to learn that the "world does not revolve around us!" We cannot assume this personal world-view is something natural. Love is learned, modeled, and integrated slowly throughout our lifetime. The Book of Deuteronomy may seem to contradict this notion: ...it is not too mysterious and remote for you ... it is obvious ... it is already in your mouths and in your hearts (Deuteronomy 30) ... and yet if this were totally true, then the lawyer in today's Gospel would not have questioned Jesus in such a fashion and it would not have been necessary for Jesus to share the parable in today's Gospel.



It is interesting that the lawyer asks Jesus ... what should I do (Luke 10) and Jesus, at the end of his story states: ... go and do (Luke 10), but I think there is something far deeper being implied by Jesus than merely keeping busy doing good things. Too often love is associated with being nice, polite or cheering people up. I think it is clear from the characters in Jesus' story that he is driving home more than the notion of being nice. It is more a matter of what we do or what we choose not to do. The priest simply pretended he did not notice the beaten man; the Levite crossed to the other side of the road to avoid him, but we are told it is a Samaritan (a foreigner, a stranger, an enemy of the Jewish people) who was ... moved with compassion (Luke 10). The important word here is moved because the story continues to state that the foreigner gave the instructions ... take care of him, and I will repay you back (Luke 10). Many of us do and accomplish many wonderful things, but with an attitude of a pay-back or out of guilt or what others might say or an obligation. The story does not indicate there was anything the foreigner would gain from such a gesture. As a matter of fact, if other Samaritans or even if some of the Jewish people heard that a foreigner "handled or touched one of their own," this Samaritan might have become a target of criticism and perhaps violent rejection; however, the point of the story is to shift our understanding of love from doing, to what might be our inner attitude and motivation. The Samaritan-foreigner broke the social, cultural, and personal boundaries and responded from within rather than merely from appearances.

Paul reminds us in Colossians ... Christ is primary (Colossians 1) in everything especially in our personal lives. He is the motivator, the core value, the reason within that eventually should seep its way from the depths of what we say we are all about to the "doing of our lives." Any other motivation is simply self-serving and selfish:... in him all things hold together ... for in him we are pleased to dwell and through him all things are reconciled. (Colossians 1)

I believe looking deeply into our motivations and to self-examine the reasons behind "what we do" is tremendously difficult. We like to think our responses to others are pure, but Jesus' story exemplifies that often our motivations and actions are multi-layered and we need to be intentionally authentic when we go about doing good. We are to be assured that we are not merely fulfilling our own needs or interests. Jesus wants us to gauge ourselves and make sure that who we are and what we do is grounded in God and not on what "makes us look good." I suppose this is what makes the scholar of the law's question so difficult because Jesus' response to the lawyer takes the form of a "foreigner, a stranger, a person outside the fold" when he defines love. It is hard enough for all of us to hear someone we know question our motivation, but it is perhaps even more difficult to take it in when it is "someone who we do not readily accept" or a stranger, but that is exactly what Jesus does in today's story not only to get our attention, but to define how he understands what it means to love.










Pope Francis' document: Amoris Laetitia — The Joy of Love will be presented in a series each week during the Year of Mercy. It is an easy-reading document and inspires us to become a People of Mercy. We are presenting The Joy of Love in its original English translation without commentary as an avenue of reflection and prayer during this Liturgical Year of Mercy.



The Thirteenth in the Series

Here I feel it urgent to state that, if the family is the sanctuary of life, the place where life is conceived and cared for, it is a horrendous contradiction when it becomes a place where life is rejected and destroyed. So great is the value of a human life, and so inalienable the right to life of an innocent child growing in the mother's womb, that no alleged right to one's own body can justify a decision to terminate that life, which is an end in itself and which can never be considered the "property" of another human being. The family protects human life in all its stages, including its last. Consequently, "those who work in healthcare facilities are reminded of the moral duty of conscientious objection. Similarly, the Church not only feels the urgency to assert the right to a natural death, without aggressive treatment and euthanasia."

The Synod Fathers also wished to emphasize that "one of the fundamental challenges facing families today is undoubtedly that of raising children, made all the more difficult and complex by today's cultural reality and the powerful influence of the media." "The Church assumes a valuable role in supporting families, starting with Christian initiation, through welcoming communities." At the same time I feel it important to reiterate that the overall education of children is a "most serious duty" and at the same time a "primary right" of parents. This is not just a task or a burden, but an essential and inalienable right that parents are called to defend and of which no one may claim to deprive them. The State offers educational programs in a subsidiary way, supporting the parents in their indeclinable role; parents themselves enjoy the right to choose freely the kind of education – accessible and of good quality – which they wish to give their children in accordance with their convictions. Schools do not replace parents, but complement them. This is a basic principle: "all other participants in the process of education are only able to carry out their responsibilities in the name of the parents, with their consent and, to a certain degree, with their authorization." Still, "a rift has opened up between the family and society, between family and the school; the educational pact today has been broken and thus the educational alliance between society and the family is in crisis."

The Church is called to cooperate with parents through suitable pastoral initiatives, assisting them in the fulfillment of their educational mission. She must always do this by helping them to appreciate their proper role and to realize that by their reception of the sacrament of marriage they become ministers of their children's education. In educating them, they build up the Church, and in so doing, they accept a God-given vocation.

Dear Fellow Stewards of God's Ministry:

One thing my parents always taught me, and I am sure all of us have heard it over and over again when we were young is: Say Thank You! Make a list of special items you may need in a disaster.


Have the ability to communicate with family members during a disas-

Program In Case of Emergency (ICE) numbers into all family cell phones. If you are hurt and can't talk, first responders and hospital staff may not know how to contact your family right away. If you have a cell phone, you can provide the phone numbers for your emergency contacts to first responders and hospital staff.


