**JULY 17, 2016
YEAR OF MERCY**

As I read this wonderful story about Martha, I could not help but think, wow, if anyone lived within shouting distance of Martha and needed a “party planner,” Martha would be right there organizing, rushing around, making sure details were addressed and everything was in order. Even Jesus noticed how meticulous Martha was: ... *Martha was burdened with much serving* (Luke 10). I believe most of us can easily identify with Mary because “everyone” seems to be “busy” nowadays even to the point that “our work” has become our “second marriage,” and if we are not busy, others are quick to say: ... “the answer to your problem is you need to ‘keep busy!’”

Don't Lose Sight of what's Important!



Of course, the pundits’ response to all this activity is that we should be more like Mary in today’s Gospel story, and yet as I was thinking about it, I realize the ability to be busy is a true blessing when we think of the alternatives. Many of us know others who were very busy-people until they encountered some physical disability and were forced to re-adjust their whole way of living (having to sell their home and leave behind what is familiar and move to a skilled-nursing facility or into an assisted living apartment). This can very often be debilitating and the psychological effect on one’s well being can be devastating because they are unable to do things that once kept them busy and feeling alive. I can remember when I broke my femur in four places. I not only suffered a physical disability, but as an active person I was psychologically challenged thinking I would never be “busy” again. I do believe in the following saying that does have some truth to it: ... *it is better to wear out than to rust out* ... in other words, we may be busy, but at least we are able to keep moving especially if we are left with few other options. I think most of us hope we will be able to “stay busy” all of our lives.

There is of course a negative side of being busy: Consider the *busy body* whose main business seems to be everybody else’s business or how about continually getting connected to someone’s voice mail because so and so is soooo busy and how about those who are too busy to answer their phones or avoid spending time with you so their only means of communication is texting? Keeping busy is one thing, but “keeping busy” for its own sake is another. Being busy also shows its negative side when it is blended with the words of Jesus to describe Martha: ... *Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things* ... (Luke 10). I do not believe Jesus was criticizing Martha (she was undoubtedly good at what she did), as much as what she was doing became the source of her anxiety and worry and ended up complicating her activities. Martha’s over-worrying was the cause of losing sight of ... *her part* (Luke 10) in the bigger picture of being a great hostess. We often are good at what we do, but somehow in all the clutter we lose sight of the significance of what we are doing and the gift that underlies our busy lives is lost in our stress, anxiety, and worry. Jesus’ praise of Mary is not a criticism of Martha, as it was to point out that Mary did not allow things to get in the way or distract her from what was truly important at the moment. In other words, this was a party. Martha did not forget it was a festive occasion, she just forgot the guests at the party, whereas Mary knew it was gathering of friends, and did not forget that when one extends an invitation the most important part of a party are the people!

The lesson here is not about those who are constantly busy verses those who have wonderful management skills, as it is how often do we find ourselves distracted above and beyond what is necessary so much so that we lose sight of the reason we are doing what are doing. Stress will inevitably arise in our busy lives no doubt, but we cannot allow ourselves to be sidetracked or lose sight of what is truly important in the present moment so much so that the gift we possess which probably makes what we are doing a success becomes lost ... *when only one thing is important* (Luke 10) and that is whatever we are doing and how busy we may be, tending to all the details of work or play, we cannot lose sight of what is truly important are the people.

We will re-clean Olson Hall and initiate a walk-through inspection and review of the site to touch up any areas that might need attention prior to the beginning of the academic year. Thank you for your patience during our Maintenance Week, and a huge thanks to Facilities and Sunny Hills for their time and generous care!





Every household is different. Is there an infant or young child in your home? Does someone in your family have a medical condition that requires medication? Do you have a pet? Before disaster strikes, talk to your family about your household's unique needs. Make a list of special items you may need in a disaster.

Have the ability to communicate with family members during a disaster.

Have a phone with a cord and a car charger for your cell phone standing by in case of a power failure. Phones with cordless handsets won't work in a disaster because they need more electricity than they can get from the phone jack. **Develop a plan for how your family will stay in touch during a disaster.** Develop a plan so you can stay in touch with your family in a disaster. **Program In Case of Emergency (ICE) numbers into all family cell phones.** If you are hurt and can't talk, first responders and hospital staff may not know how to contact your family right away. If you have a cell phone, you can provide the phone numbers for your emergency contacts to first responders and hospital staff.



Pope Francis' document: *Amoris Laetitia – The Joy of Love* will be presented in a series each week during the Year of Mercy. It is an easy-reading document and inspires us to become a People of Mercy. We are presenting *The Joy of Love* in its original English translation without commentary as an avenue of reflection and prayer during this Liturgical Year of Mercy.

The Fourteenth in the Series



The Family and the Church

“With inner joy and deep comfort, the Church looks to the families who remain faithful to the teachings of the Gospel, encouraging them and thanking them for the testimony they offer. For they bear witness, in a credible way, to the beauty of marriage as indissoluble and perpetually faithful. Within the family ‘which could be called a domestic church’ (*Lumen Gentium*, 11), individuals enter upon an ecclesial experience of communion among persons, which reflects, through grace, the mystery of the Holy Trinity. ‘Here one learns endurance and the joy of work, fraternal love, generous – even repeated – forgiveness, and above all divine worship in prayer and the offering of one’s life’ (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1657)” The Church is a family of families, constantly enriched by the lives of all those domestic churches. “In virtue of the sacrament of matrimony, every family becomes, in effect, a good for the Church. From this standpoint, reflecting on the interplay between the family and the Church will prove a precious gift for the Church in our time. The Church is good for the family, and the family is good for the Church. The safeguarding of the Lord’s gift in the sacrament of matrimony is a concern not only of individual families but of the entire Christian community.”

The experience of love in families is a perennial source of strength for the life of the Church. “The unitive end of marriage is a constant summons to make this love grow and deepen. Through their union in love, the couple experiences the beauty of fatherhood and motherhood, and shares plans, trials, expectations and concerns; they learn care for one another and mutual forgiveness. In this love, they celebrate their happy moments and support each other in the difficult passages of their life together... The beauty of this mutual, gratuitous gift, the joy which comes from a life that is born and the loving care of all family members – from toddlers to seniors – are just a few of the fruits which make the response to the vocation of the family unique and irreplaceable,” both for the Church and for society as a whole.

All that has been said so far would be insufficient to express the Gospel of marriage and the family, were we not also to *speak of love*. For we cannot encourage a path of fidelity and mutual self-giving without encouraging the growth, strengthening and deepening of conjugal and family love. Indeed, the grace of the sacrament of marriage is intended before all else “to perfect the couple’s love.” Here too we can say that, “even if I have faith so as to remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. If I give all I have, and if I deliver my body to be burned, but have not love, I gain nothing” (*1 Cor 13:2-3*). The word “love”, however, is commonly used and often misused.



Dear Fellow Stewards of God's Ministry:

One thing my parents always taught me, and I am sure all of us have heard it over and over again when we were young is: *Say Thank You!* It seems easy, these three little words which often became a matter of habit; however to cultivate a grateful heart is more than “saying thank you” it is a life-long challenge that hopefully becomes integrated into our lives so that a sense of gratefulness becomes intentional, deliberate, a gateway to loving and serving as Jesus did. In this *Year of Mercy*, we are reminded of the “great benefactor” who invites us to *accept the risen Jesus into our lives ... even if we have been far away ... all we need do is take a step toward him; he awaits with open arms* (Pope Francis). No matter how far we may feel we have created a distance within our selves, others, and God, God never abandons us nor does his generous love ever fail us!

Our experience of mercy moves and empowers us to extend ourselves to others that they too may come to know the Risen Christ and the all inclusive mercy of our God, and also moves us to regenerate with a grateful heart the sharing of our time and treasure. This year's *Pastoral Services Appeal* is *not* simply about a pledge or the sharing of treasure, *it is a response to the mercy of God*. We have all walked the Road to Emmaus ... the road of broken dreams, shattered hopes, and unbelievable disappointments and brokenness. Like the disciples whose lives seem to hit rock bottom, soon discover that the Risen Jesus was with them through the shadows of their lives, and ... *their hearts filled with the joy* moved them to realize that the mercy of God is not ever lost or exhausted. Their stewardship was one of proclamation: *The Lord has Risen!* We are invited to share from our own experience of despair and lost hope how the Risen Christ has never abandoned us even in our darkest hour, and it is ... *opening the eyes of hearts*, like the

disciples on the Road to Emmaus we come to recognize the Risen Christ ... and say: ...*Thank you Jesus! Thank you, Lord!* As we journey together with *Gratitude*, we ask you to express the same mercy that we have all experienced, so others who still walk the road of Emmaus and seem lost and without hope will discover the Risen Christ by our support of *our Diocesan and Parish Ministries and the development of Youth, and the maintenance of our facilities in order to share the mercy of God beyond our Saint Angela Merici through the Pastoral Services Appeal (PSA)*.

Our Parish assessment is \$101,000. Please consider responding in mercy and gratefulness by sharing \$350. PSA envelopes will be available in the pews or you may go to the Parish website and pledge on line. After we have met our goal, all stewardship is returned to Saint Angela Merici. Reflect on your own walk to Emmaus and extend mercy to those who are still making that journey. Be the very ... open arm of Jesus ... be the one who encourages someone to move toward Jesus ... be the one who assures our God never abandons anyone and it is His desire that no one is left on the side or excluded, or unloved. The Pastoral Services Appeal is an avenue of Gratefulness that enables us to lead others into the heart of God's mercy. Respond in Gratefulness. Respond in Mercy. Respond because we are apostles of mercy. Respond because by touching and soothing the wounds of today that affect the bodies and souls of many of our sisters and brothers, we profess Jesus and make him present and alive and allow others by the touch of his mercy to recognize Jesus and Lord and God!
