Reflection

All of us dream, desire, wish, and hope for more in life, yet the irony is that once we “receive, get, or buy” what “we have always wanted,” it rarely fully satisfies our expectations: “Gee, it’s not like I thought it would be ... or I do not feel or think it has provided me with what I thought I would ‘get’ from it.” The real problem is something else appears on the scene that piques our interest and then ... we are off again dreaming

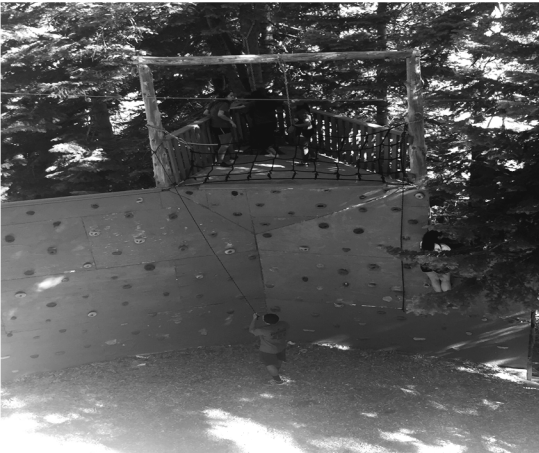
how to replace what we have! The most recent example we have today is our cell phones, pads, and other technical gadgets that flood our market and tickle our interest. It seems we are always anticipating the next model even though what we have works perfectly fine. I am always amazed how the shopping channels attempt to mesmerize how we just cannot “live without their product!” One night I was not able to sleep so I flipped on the television. Yes, I gave in! I purchased a watch. The only problem is I do not wear a watch! Today, it is still in its original box, unopened, unused, and no, I have not re-gifted the watch to anyone! The lure on television was so intense and because I could not sleep I gave in and added one more item I have no use for! We all try to “improve ourselves.” We tuck, pull, and attempt to transform and achieve the “look we want” (whether it be physical or material) until the next new product hits the shelves or the internet and we are off again. Perhaps this is the reason Ecclesiastes hits us hard when we hear the writer say: ... *Vanity of vanities ... all things are vanity* (Ecclesiastes 1).

Today’s word shares a story about a man who simply could not be satisfied with what he achieved in life and continued to work and build endlessly using all his energy and life to create bigger and better bins to hold all of his things. I think it’s not too far fetched to transfer this notion to our cars, homes, clothing, and things we believe “we need.” There is however something deeper in this story than just the accumulation of stuff. Perhaps it has more to do with our need to satisfy our deep sense of well-being. It seems purchasing products and looking marvelous is a wonderful substitute for what we believe can truly make us happy and satisfy our deepest desires. I suspect all this accumulation in our lives (and in the life of the man in the Gospel story) says volumes about our trust in God. When we substitute “things or personal pride” with God we are basically saying we are not quite sure God will give us what we believe we really need in our lives. Perhaps this is the reason Jesus says: ... *you fool ... all these things ... to whom will they belong* (Luke 12). There is nothing so big, so grand, or over the top that can ever fill us with what we need. Only God can do that, but this notion is so difficult for us to embrace because God does not seem to give us what we think we need when we need it.” It is so much easier to “make over ourselves or buy this or that” even if it just makes us feel better only for a moment.

I think the only ... *bountiful harvest* (Luke 12) that will every satisfy us is what God provides for us. This does not mean we cannot possess things or enjoy what we have and desire more, but today’s Gospel warns us about putting all our chips into “more and bigger,” thinking it will be the answer to what is lacking in our lives. It may be trite, but the old axiom is true: “ ... we cannot take it with us” and it is real fallacy to think we can ... *rest, eat, drink, and be merry* (Luke 12) all through life. True contentment and authentic happiness does not come about in the “things in life we acquire to fill in the gaps,” but is only possible when we embrace the notion that the only harvest that can give us the bounty we all so much long for is God: ... *put to death ... the parts that are earthly ... take off the old self and put on the new self* (Colossians 3).

F.I.R.E. Retreat 2016

Once a year we take our Senior High School Leadership Team, F.I.R.E., on retreat. We challenge them to step outside of their normal routine, to open their hearts and minds to work as a team to better themselves and each other on these three days of reflection. F.I.R.E. learns how to follow directions, think on their feet, solve problems, work with one another, think outside the box, encourage each other, challenge each other, and openly communicate with one another. They set objectives for 2016-2017 on things they would like to accomplish. Each one was given an accountability partner to help them and encourage them through the coming year.

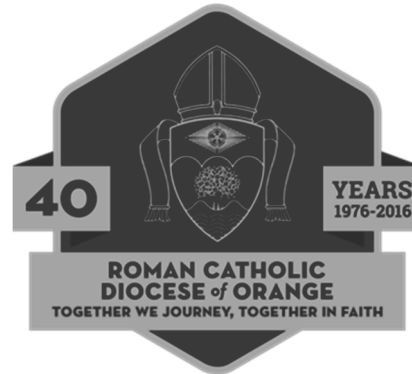

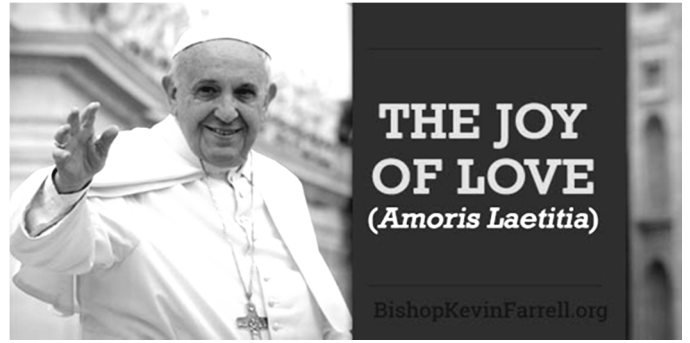

Together we journey. Together in Faith” is an inspiring graphical novel that tells the story of the Catholic Church in Southern California beginning with the Missions founded by Saint Junipero Serra, through the founding and exponential growth of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Orange, to the historic acquisition and renovation of the Christ Cathedral campus. This is a beautifully illustrated story of the dynamic and multifaceted journey of faith for Catholics in Orange County, California. Pope Francis' document: Amoris Laetitia – The Joy of Love will be presented in a series each week during the Year of Mercy. It is an easy-reading document and inspires us to become a People of Mercy. We are presenting The Joy of Love in its original English translation without commentary as an avenue of reflection and prayer during this Liturgical Year of Mercy.



The Sixteenth in the Series

It is not helpful to dream of an idyllic and perfect love needing no stimulus to grow. A celestial notion of earthly love forgets that the best is yet to come, that fine wine matures with age. As the Bishops of Chile have pointed out, “the perfect families proposed by deceptive consumerist propaganda do not exist. In those families, no one grows old, there is no sickness, sorrow or death... It is much healthier to be realistic about our limits, defects and imperfections, and to respond to the call to grow together, to bring love to maturity and to strengthen the union, come what may.

Dialogue is essential for experiencing, expressing and fostering love in marriage and family life, yet it can only be the fruit of a long and demanding apprenticeship. Men and women, young people and adults, communicate differently. They speak different languages and they act in different ways. Our way of asking and responding to questions, the tone we use, our timing and any number of other factors condition how well we communicate. We need to develop certain attitudes that express love and encourage authentic dialogue. Take time, quality time. This means being ready to listen patiently and attentively to everything the other person wants to say. It requires the self-discipline of not speaking until the time is right. Instead of offering an opinion or advice, we need to be sure that we have heard everything the other person has to say. This means cultivating an interior silence that makes it possible to listen to the other person without mental or emotional distractions. Do not be rushed, put aside all of your own needs and worries, and make space. Often the other spouse does not need a solution to his or her problems, but simply to be heard, to feel that someone has acknowledge their pain, their disappointment, their fear, their anger, their hopes and their dreams. How often we hear complaints like: “He does not listen to me.” “Even when you seem to, you are really doing something else.” “I talk to her and I feel like she can’t wait for me to finish.” “When I speak to her, she tries to change the subject, or she gives me curt responses to end the conversation”.

Develop the habit of giving real importance to the other person. This means appreciating them and recognizing their right to exist, to think as they do and to be happy. Never downplay what they say or think, even if you need to express your own point of view. Everyone has something to contribute, because they have their life experiences, they look at things from a different standpoint and they have their own concerns, abilities and insights. We ought to be able to acknowledge the other person’s truth, the value of his or her deepest concerns, and what it is that they are trying to communicate, however aggressively. We have to put ourselves in their shoes and try to peer into their hearts, to perceive their deepest concerns and to take them as a point of departure for further dialogue.
