

YEAR OF MERCY**



Reflection

Jesus' words today seem so contradictory from what we are accustomed to hearing: ...*do you think that I have to establish peace ... no I tell you division* (Luke 12). To blur our portrait of "a gentle Jesus" he continues and says: ... *from now on a household of five will be divided ... father will be divided against his son ... a mother against her daughter* (Luke 12). It seems the way the story is presented almost gives the impression that Jesus is not saying this calmly, but with intensive emotion and great passion. What do we suppose the reason we are given a glimpse of what appears "another other side of Jesus?" I think Jesus is trying to reject the notion of trivializing our sense of what it means to say "I believe." Often we think our faith is defined as going to any length to keep the peace, but the truth is, our faith is more than just "getting along with everyone." If we live our faith with depth and embrace what it truly demands, we will discover many times we will find ourselves at odds with certain people as well as our cultural and societal ideologies.


It appears Jesus is saying that the only real unity in life is when we are grounded in truth and very often the truth means that we will not always get along with some people. This may cause a division between family members or those closest to us: ... *five will be divided, three against two and two against three* (Luke 12). We need not look too far before we are confronted with the reality that what the Church invites us to embrace today as the "tenants of our faith" simply grind against much of what our culture and society professes as a way of living. Too often we believe today that the Church needs to be attentive to the "signs of the time," which is what has been the call since the Vatican II Council; however, at the same time the Church never professed the belief that we as a people of faith are invited to simply "blend with everyone else, look like everyone else, and to hold on to what everyone else happens to believe is relevant in regard to the moral compass of our lives." Jesus states very clearly: ...*do you think that I have come to establish peace ... no ... rather division ... I have come to set the earth on fire* (Luke 12). Unfortunately, many of us believe that the role of our faith is to put out fires! Our faith has almost become a "comfort food" in which we gather to feel warm and fuzzy, dodging balls thrown at us rather than to stand firm in what we say we believe even though we may run the risk of being hit!

Too often we favor making sure no one levels any criticism upon us for fear we might be rejected, disliked, or run the risk of losing the embrace of the populace, but it seems what Jesus is saying is this type of thinking only serves to reduce our faith experience to the least common dominator and rejects the notion of "the cross" that sometimes comes when we stand up against the odds of what we believe: ... *for the sake of the joy that lay before him he endured the cross, despising its shame* (Hebrews 12). It seems to me, what Jesus is trying to get us to understand is that our faith is an invitation not to be bystanders on the sidelines, but to courageously and boldly live out what we say we are all about. We are called to ... *ignite a fire* and hard as it may seem, the truth is that there will simply be some notions in life that we cannot compromise which may very well mean that some may turn their backs on us. The question Jesus poses is whether our faith will enable us to be bold enough to take this risk.

The Seventeenth in the Series



Dialogue is essential for experiencing, expressing and fostering love in marriage and family life. Men and women, young people and adults, communicate differently. They speak different languages and they act in different ways. Our way of asking and responding to questions, the tone we use, our timing and any number of other factors condition how well we communicate. We need to develop certain attitudes that express love and encourage authentic dialogue. Take time, quality time. This means being ready to listen patiently and attentively to everything the other person wants to say. It requires the self-discipline of not speaking until the time is right. Instead of offering an opinion or advice, we need to be sure that we have heard everything the other person has to say. This means cultivating an interior silence that makes it possible to listen to the other person without mental or emotional distractions. Do not be rushed, put aside all of your own needs and worries, and make space. Often the other spouse does not need a solution to his or her problems, but simply to be heard, to feel that someone has acknowledged their pain, their disappointment, their fear, their anger, their hopes and their dreams. How often we hear complaints like: "He does not listen to me ... I talk to her and I feel like she can't wait for me to finish ... when I speak the subject is changed or I receive a curt response."

Develop the habit of giving real importance to the other person. This means appreciating them and recognizing their right to exist, to think as they do and to be happy. Never downplay what they say or think, even if you need to express your own point of view. Everyone has something to contribute, because they have their life experiences, they look at things from a different standpoint and they have their own concerns, abilities and insights. We ought to be able to acknowledge the other person's truth, the value of his or her deepest concerns, and what it is that they are trying to communicate, however aggressively. We have to put ourselves in their shoes and try to peer into their hearts, to perceive their deepest concerns and to take them as a point of departure for further dialogue.

Keep an open mind. Don't get bogged down in your own limited ideas and opinions, but be prepared to change or expand them. We need to free ourselves from feeling that we all have to be alike. A certain astuteness is also needed to prevent the appearance of "static" that can interfere with the process of dialogue. For example, if hard feelings start to emerge, they should be dealt with sensitively, lest they interrupt the dynamic of dialogue. The ability to say what one is thinking without offending the other person is important. Words should be carefully chosen so as not to offend, especially when discussing difficult issues. Making a point should never involve venting anger and inflicting hurt. A patronizing tone only serves to hurt, ridicule, accuse and offend others. Many disagreements between couples are not about important things. Mostly they are about trivial matters. What alters the mood, however, is the way things are said or the attitude with which they are said.




Baptism, Confirmation & Eucharist


