

Reflection

Long ago there were lepers ... what just happened to them was unbelievable! These lepers had a hideous disease, they were contagious, rejected by the culture and society of their time, and forced to live in isolation.

Their very ailment banished them from their wives, children, family, and loved ones. If anyone would even dare think of approaching them, their alienation from others became more apparent because they were to shout a warning: "unclean, unclean, unclean!" For these ten however, the burden they bore was lifted and they were all heading home.

The lepers, according to the story, were walking along the border of Samaria and Galilee and they happened to come across Jesus, but because they were not allowed to come near anyone, they were relegated to shouting at him to somehow get his attention: ... have pity on us! (Luke 17), but notice the story does not say that Jesus stopped. It does not give any indication whether he even had a conversation with them nor does it give a hint of whether Jesus felt compassion for them. The story simply says that Jesus told them to: ... go show yourselves to the priests (Luke 17), and it is while they were on their way to see the priests that they discovered they were healed. In Jesus' time, it is prescribed by the law that those who have experienced something miraculous to "show themselves to the priests" as proof that God's hand was behind the healing they experienced. I think, like the lepers who experienced the turn of events in their lives, we too are absorbed by their healing. After all, the gift they received was astounding; their lives were given back to them. They could once again hug their wives and children, visit friends and relatives, and be welcomed in the public square rather than be rejected.

The story however, takes a very interesting turn because it does not end with the healing of the ten lepers. We are told of the ten healed one returned to Jesus and ... fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked him (Luke 17). The other nine did not look back. They were going home and nothing was going to stop them. They had their lives back again. I believe it could be easy for us to presume that the nine were a bit ungrateful or lapsing in etiquette. It is true they seem to be thankless and lacked a depth of gratitude, but their failure to express a "thank you" was not their mistake. It seems to me, it goes deeper than saying "thanks." What the nine failed to realize is that they ran away before Jesus was done with them. The lives of the nine were changed and they "went back to life as they knew it" but Jesus wanted to offer them more. As the story unfolds we discover that only one of the ten, a foreigner, (the twist of the story) returned. The Samaritan knows he was healed. Jesus knows he was made clean, but the foreigner realized the true meaning of his experience was not simply the healing; it was the gift of faith. The healing was only secondary to the real gift, and it is only the foreigner who recognized the gift that was truly being offered which moves him to return and give thanks to God. Perhaps this is the reason Jesus says: ... Ten were cleansed ... where are the other nine (Luke 17)? It was not that the other nine were merely ungrateful, rude or impolite, it was that they did not realize how the deeper gift of faith could have transformed their lives: ...is this foreigner the only one who recognizes what he has been given and has returned to give thanks to God (Luke 17)?

Jesus walked along the border of Samaria and Galilee ready to offer two gifts: The gift of healing and eternal life. Nine only received one of the two gifts. They were so delighted by their healing that they were distracted and focused on their lives alone, which is the reason they come across as "thankless." They did not recognize what was really being offered to them. The foreigner however, believed in Jesus and therefore received not only the gift of healing, but more importantly, the gift of faith! He alone received the gifts that Jesus really wanted to give that day. This very familiar story is a wonderful reminder that sometimes we can miss out on what God truly wants to give us, if we become content only on what we want rather than what God knows what we really need. The lesson: Everything, no matter what the consequence might appear first and foremost with the realization that it is our *faith* that will truly reveal what God actually wants to give to us.



Emergency Awareness

Ministry: Heat Stroke

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), heat stroke occurs when the body is unable to regulate its temperature. The body's temperature rises rapidly, sweating mechanism fails, and the body is unable to cool down. Do you know the signs of heat stroke? While warning signs may vary, symptoms may include:

- An extremely high body temperature (above 103 degrees Fahrenheit)
- Red, hot, and dry skin (no sweating)
- Rapid, strong pulse
- Dizziness.

According to the CDC, if someone experiences signs of a heat stroke, have someone else call for immediate medical assistance while you begin cooling the person by:


- Getting him or her to a shady area
- Immersing the person in a tub of cool water, placing him or her in a cool shower, or spraying the person with cool water from a garden hose.

Be sure to monitor the person's body temperature, and continue cooling efforts until the body temperature drops to 101-102 degrees Fahrenheit. If emergency medical personnel are delayed, call the hospital emergency room for further instructions. Don't give the victim fluids to drink.


If emergency treatment isn't provided, heat stroke can cause death or permanent disability.




1 HAVE AT LEAST ONE PHONE WITH A CORD

Power : Create a power outage plan and decide what you can do before, during and after a power outage to minimize the effect on your household.

Before the power goes out:

- Fill empty space in freezer with containers of water. Frozen water will displace air and keep food cold longer. Remember to leave space in containers for ice to expand.
- Have at least one phone with a handset cord in your home. Many cordless phones will not work in a power outage.
- If you have an automatic garage door opener, learn how to use the manual release and open your garage door manually.
- Try to keep your car's gas tank at least half full. Many gas stations will not be in operation during a power outage. Fill up your tank if a major storm is predicted.
- Make sure you have a car or lighter plug cord for your cell phone.
- If you use special healthcare equipment like oxygen generators or dialysis equipment, notify your power company.

After the power goes out:

- Unplug major appliances and electronics. When the power comes back on, there may be power spikes that can damage large appliances or delicate electronics.
- Do not open refrigerators or freezers any more than necessary. An unopened refrigerator will keep food cold for approximately 4 hours, an unopened freezer will keep food frozen for approximately 24 hours.
- Use a battery-powered radio to stay informed.
