Reflection

“And you shall love your neighbor as yourself.”

When something happens to one of our own, we jump into action. We protect our children, our families, parents, close friends, and property. We are touched strongly by the need to safeguard what is ours. It is personal! But when something happens in our community or world and we are a bit removed from the problem, we are saddened and say a prayer or maybe donate money. It is not so personal. This month we have been focusing on Respect life issues. The Death penalty, elder abuse, right to life. Today I want to speak about human trafficking. Not just across the world, or the US but in our own back yard, in California, Orange County, our neighborhoods, our schools and sometimes our homes.

"Human trafficking is modern-day slavery and involves the use of force, fraud or coercion to obtain some type of labor or commercial sex act; usually involving a person under 18 years of age."

When we hear human trafficking, we usually think of foreign women who are forced into a life of slavery, but 65% of human trafficking in the U.S. are U.S. citizens, The U.S. Department of Justice states that the average age of entry into prostitution which is human trafficking, is 12-14 years old.

- Underage girls are the bulk of victims in the commercial sex markets, which include pornography, stripping, escort services, and prostitution.
- Sixty percent of children exploited are first recruited by peers. That means other students in their own school. Yes, even in Orange County.
- The overwhelming majority of runaway, homeless, abused, and at-risk children are approached by traffickers and drug dealers within 48 hours of landing on the streets.
- The rise of the internet and increased use of technology have led to more children being exploited. Perpetrators use the internet, text messaging, digital and web cameras to set up “dates”. The victim never has to leave the van she is sitting in or the hotel room where she has been placed to be exploited, making her harder to find and harder to save. Some victims are exploited while still living at home and still attending school.

We think that the perpetrator is easy to spot, they look seedy and dangerous but they can be businessmen, trusted members of the community, a neighbor, a family member, an intimate partner, or a classmate. While unknown persons can pose a threat, most children and youth are victimized by someone known to them. In fact, perpetrators often establish or build upon an existing relationship to coerce or manipulate children.


If one of these victims were your child, brother or sister, you would do whatever you could to help them. But they are our children, they are our brothers and sisters in Christ. The first reading warns “You shall not molest or oppress an alien, for you were once aliens yourselves in the land of Egypt.” The second reading tells us that we are imitators of the Lord, we are called to be a model for all the believers. “From you the word of the Lord has sounded forth.”

What can we do, how can we love our neighbor. Let’s first educate ourselves using these or other websites such as Catholic Relief Services.

So what can you do about it?


Walk in to the parish hall **today** and take 45 minutes to donate your blood – the gift of life!

Catholic Social Teaching & the Death Penalty: Solidarity

We are one human family whatever our national, racial, ethnic, economic, and ideological differences, and are called to be our sisters' and brothers' keepers. This means that no matter what wrongs a person may commit or what experiences their lives bring, we are called to live in a pursuit of justice and peace. The death penalty unjustly targets people of color, those with intellectual disability and mental illness; it affects those living in poverty and risks killing innocent life. Our call to solidarity is our call to live out a preferential option for the poor and vulnerable.

The death penalty denies our call to solidarity by ignoring the pain and harm caused by violence. The necessarily long, complex death penalty trial process can force victims' families to re-live their trauma and pain. This costly process diverts money and resources from needed services for victims' families. For many victims' families the loss of another life is not the answer: *"Pursuing the death penalty would not be the way we would want to honor our daughter's life, nor would that decision have helped us deal with the painful reminders of her unfulfilled hopes and dreams,"* (Vicki Schieber, CMN Speaker). As Catholics, we are called to care for these victims' families, to bear witness to their experiences, and allow them to heal from the harm they have experienced, not create more victim's family members with the death penalty.
