Reflection

Zacchaeus was a member of the Hebrew Community; however, he was in the business of collecting taxes for Rome, a foreign power that occupied their land, which put him at odds with everyone, and yet what is interesting about Zacchaeus' character in today's Gospel story, is that he nevertheless makes an attempt to catch a glimpse of Jesus who was passing through the town. Zacchaeus was small in stature. He could not easily glance at him, so he climbs a tree! What makes this scenario more enticing is that Jesus noticed Zacchaeus bobbing and hopping through the crowd and then finally took note that he climbs on a limb just to get a glimpse of him. Jesus stops and looks up at the sycamore tree and says: ... *Zacchaeus, come down quickly, for today I must stay at your house* (Luke 19). The crowd begins to murmur, but Zacchaeus is incredulous to all the criticism and responds: ... *behold half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone, I shall repay it four times over* (Luke 19). Jesus further infuriates the crowd when he says: ... *This man too is a descendant of Abraham. For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost* (Luke 19).

Often we debate the differences between mercy and justice, but in today's story we are given a glimpse of how these two concepts enmesh: Zacchaeus takes responsibility for his behavior by giving to the poor and by returning any money he has defrauded from others and Jesus mercifully says to Zacchaeus: ... *Today salvation has come to his house* (Luke 19). Mercy is sometimes thought of as "letting someone get away with something ... letting them off-the-hook", but that is not what is at the heart of mercy. Zacchaeus was not absolved of the crimes he committed (Jesus makes no reference to Zacchaeus' past), rather God's mercy moved Zacchaeus to accept the consequences of his embezzlement, to face himself and others, and as a result he receives something far more valuable than any money he gained from defrauding others: A relationship with Jesus.

Facing ourselves is not easy. Most of us would rather not climb a tree, but that sycamore is ever before us and Jesus is always just down the road moving toward us. So, when was the last time we faced the wrongs we have done to others by our way of thinking, attitudes, or behavior and have turned it around to make it right? When was the last time that we put out the energy and effort, like climbing a tree in order to have a face-to-face encounter with Jesus? It is hard not to love Zacchaeus, this little guy in the tree who everyone "gangs-up on." I think his appeal lays in the truth that despite his shortcomings he gives us hope. It is Zacchaeus who reminds us that even though we have failed others who depend on us and even if we have cheated or betrayed others, God can still surprise us! It is in our believing, faith and our willingness to face ourselves that despite everything, Zacchaeus becomes a wonderful reminder that if we are willing to climb that tree, we will discover God will reach out to us and to our great wonder hear him say to us: ... *I want to come and stay at your house* (Luke 19). It is precisely in that moment, in that instant, in that face-to-face, extra-ordinary encounter with Jesus, we will realize, like Zacchaeus, that our lives will never be same again!

Remembrance of Our Beloved Deceased /

Día de Los Muertos



Any death, whether someone dies young or dies after experiencing the fullness of life or is killed or dies accidentally or dies surrounded by family and friends is a tragedy. It is a tragedy because when someone we love dies it leaves us empty. Something is missing. There is a void. Nothing is the same again. Death pushes us up against the reality of our humanness: Death is a part of life.


No words can ever capture our experience of death. Grief is often beyond human expression. This is precisely the reason we dedicate one month a year to remember our beloved dead. Together we embrace our common grief and memories. We pray and remind each other that what lies ahead is forged in life and not in the loss of death. It is not easy to pick up again after a death, but that's where the Risen Lord joins our journey. It is the Risen Christ who reminds us that both the living and dead are moving forward. Life is all about this constant movement. It is only in grasping this very notion that we will come to experience that life is made new. The Day of the Dead and the Month of November is the reminder that no death is ever forgotten. Life does move on from one stage to another, from one movement to another, from one task to another from one kind of presence to another. The *Day of the Dead, Día de los Muertos, simply is the reminder that one way of life does end so another life can begin.*

During the Month of November, we invite our parishioners to place a picture or memento on our Altar of Remembrance and write the names of their beloved dead on our All Soul's Envelopes. Eucharist will be celebrated for our beloved dead every day during the Month of November: ... it is a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead II Maccabeus 12, 46).

Día de Los Muertos is celebrated in the cities and countryside of central and southern Mexico during the chilly days of November 1st and 2nd, which coincides with the All Saints and All Soul's Days. The indigenous people have combined this holiday with their own ancient beliefs of honoring their deceased loved ones. They believe the gates of heaven are opened at midnight on October 31st and the spirits of all the deceased children (angelitos) are allowed to reunite with their families for twenty-four hours. On November 2nd, the spirits of the adults come down to enjoy the festivals prepared for them.

In most villages, beautiful altars (*ofrendas*) are made in each home. They are decorated with candles, buckets of flowers (wild marigolds call cempasuchil and bright red rooster combs) mounds of fruit, peanuts, plates of turkey mole, stacks of tortillas and big loaves of bread called *pan de muertos*. The deceased spirits require lots of food, bottles of soda, hot cocoa and water for their weary spirits. Toys and candies are left for the *angelitos* and on November 2nd, cigarettes and shots of *mezcal* are offered to adult spirits. Little folk art skeletons and skulls purchased at open-air markets provide the final touches. Many spend over two months income to honor their dead relatives. They believe that happy spirits will provide protection, good luck, and wisdom to their families. On the afternoon of November 2nd, the festivities are taken to the cemetery. Families clean tombs, play cards, listen to the village band and reminisce about their loved ones. This keeps the village families close. It is a way to celebrate and honor the beloved dead.

An Expanding Fruifulness

Some couples are unable to have children. We know that this can be a cause of real suffering for them. At the same time, we know that "marriage was not instituted solely for the procreation of children. Even in cases where, despite the intense desire of the spouses, there are no children, and marriage still retains its character of being a whole manner and communion of life, and preserves its value and indissolubility." So too, "motherhood is not a solely biological reality, but is expressed in diverse ways." Adoption is a very generous way to become parents. I encourage those who cannot have children to expand their marital love to embrace those who lack a proper family situation. They will never regret having been generous. Adopting a child is an act of love, offering the gift of a family to someone who has none. Those who accept the challenge of adopting and accepting someone unconditionally and gratuitously become channels of God's love. For he says, "Even if your mother forgets you, I will not forget you" (*Is 49:15*).


"The choice of adoption and foster care expresses a particular kind of fruitfulness in the marriage experience, and not only in cases of infertility. In the light of those situations where a child is desired at any cost, as a right for one's self-fulfillment, adoption and foster care, correctly understood, manifest an important aspect of parenting and the raising of children. They make people aware that children, whether natural, adoptive or taken in foster care, are persons in their own right who need to be accepted, loved and cared for, and not just brought into this world. The best interests of the child should always underlie any decision in adoption and foster care." On the other hand, "the trafficking of children between countries and continents needs to be prevented by appropriate legislative action and state control."

We also do well to remember that procreation and adoption are not the only ways of experiencing the fruitfulness of love. Even large families are called to make their mark on society, finding other expressions of fruitfulness that in some way prolong the love that sustains them. Christian families should never forget that "faith does not remove us from the world, but draws us more deeply into it... Each of us, in fact, has a special role in preparing for the coming of God's kingdom in our world." Families should not see themselves as a refuge from society, but instead go forth from their homes in a spirit of solidarity with others. In this way, they become a hub for integrating persons into society and a point of contact between the public and private spheres. Married couples should have a clear awareness of their social obligations. With this, their affection does not diminish but is flooded with new light.
