Reflection

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus cautions his listeners to stay awake, *for you know neither the day nor the hour.* He warns them not to be like the foolish bridesmaids who were unprepared.

They assumed they could always get more oil for their torches whenever they needed it, and the door of the house would be opened for them even if they arrived late. The foolish bridesmaids were shocked to discover that, at the **decisive** hour, because they were unprepared, they were excluded. Until then, there seemed to be no difference between the wise and foolish bridesmaids. *They all became drowsy and fell asleep,* Jesus tells us. But the midnight call to action finds the wise prepared and welcomed, and the foolish unprepared and left out.

We do not want you to be unaware, brothers and sisters, about those who have fallen asleep. These words from our second reading direct our attention to a subject we mostly try to avoid: death. The Church puts death front and center during the month of November. It begins with All Saints' Day, which is immediately followed by All Souls' Day, when we pray in a special way for our departed loved ones. Paul tells the Thessalonians that when the Lord Jesus returns in glory, those who have already died *will rise first. Then we who are alive ... will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air.*

How then, can we best prepare to meet the Lord? Our first reading may have the key. Wisdom can be found by those who seek her. And the wisdom we seek – to be prepared to meet the Lord – is found in what Jesus teaches his disciples. His message is about how we are to live in the kingdom of God here on earth, so as to live with God after our death. His lessons are about forgiving others generously, being grateful for the generosity of others, following through on our word, and not expecting reward for doing the right thing. Most important, he teaches that loving God with all our mind, heart and soul, and humbly loving our neighbor as ourselves, are the greatest commandments.

The lessons Jesus taught his listeners as he prepared for his death provide us all the wisdom we need for being prepared for our own deaths. Let us stay awake in seeking to live in the wisdom he shares. Let us grow in wisdom by finding ways to grow in our love for God and in our love for our neighbors. In doing so, Scripture tells us we will not be disappointed. As we gain this wisdom, we will also grow in gratitude for God's kindness, and in certainty of the hope we have for being joined with the Lord and those who have gone before us.

**California Catholic Bishops Urge
Immigration Reform
for DACA Youth and Their Families**

Bishops Pledge Abiding Solidarity with Immigrants; Denounce the Administration's End of Program Offering Hope.

The Catholic Bishops of California released the following statement today in anticipation of a Trump Administration announcement on Tuesday terminating the DACA Program in six months. DACA (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals) is a program to temporarily suspend deportation proceedings in the case of undocumented young person's brought to the United States as minors, many of whom have no memory of being raised in any other country but the United States. It is estimated that 800,000 people are covered under this program, 200,000 of them in California alone.

The Catholic Bishops of California believe, along with many of our fellow Californians, that immigrant youth and their families are a critical part of California's future vitality. We will continue to believe in them, pray for them, and work with them for a society where all God's children may enjoy life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. We invite all those who share this dream to join us as sentinels of hope for the hundreds of thousands of young people who have registered or are eligible for the DACA program. While the decision of the Administration may eclipse our common aspirations for them, we should not let our confidence be diminished. We have faith that this momentary shadow will pass and our hopeful light will continue to burn brightly.

DACA students are not the so-called "bad hombres," an insidious label used to instill fear in others and feed the racism and nativism that unfortunately is rearing its ugly head in our cities. Far from it, DACA eligible youth are high school graduates, in school or working on their GED. Many are now in college. They may be honorably discharged members of the armed services. No one convicted of a felony or serious misdemeanor (or three misdemeanors) can apply for DACA. These young people are working in businesses and professional jobs, harvesting our fields, building our homes, and providing many of the services of hospitality we take for granted. They have placed their lives on the line to defend our liberty and freedom. Most importantly, they are giving back to the only nation they have ever known. They are the hard working good neighbors America needs to compete in the global economy of today.

Catholics – both in our parishes and larger service organizations such as Catholic Charities and the Catholic Legal Immigration Network (CLINIC) – will remain steadfast in offering assistance to immigrants. As Bishops, every day we see the impact of the failure of a political leadership that washes its hands while immigrants suffer. We choose to continue to serve, comfort, and protect our brothers and sisters. We will not protect serious and violent criminals and we will work with authorities in advancing security and other legitimate requirements. We will, however, not allow reckless rhetoric to bully us from the course of compassion and basic decency.

We are encouraged by the fatherly admonition of Pope Francis: "[C]hildren are a sign. They are a sign of hope, a sign of life, but also a "diagnostic" sign, a marker indicating the health of families, society and the entire world. Wherever children are accepted, loved, cared for and protected, the family is healthy, society is healthier and the world is more human."
