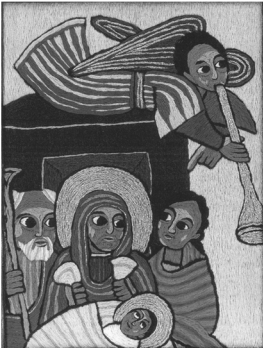

# Reflection

God enters our lives so we can enter into the life of God. What a wonderful exchange! On this day we recognize the breaking through of hope into every human heart, exactly the way we are with all that is good in us and what is yet to be. On this day, God makes no distinction; he comes and finds his way into the poverty and the loneliness in our lives. Shepherds watching their flock by night came at an angel's beckoning, and became God's first house guests, so we would know that even in those moments when we feel no one recognizes us,

God sends these first visitors over and over again in our lives in the guise of shepherds tending us as the sheep of his flock. In the crib a baby lays, no different from so many other infants. Whether we reminisce with fond memories of our own childhood or if we are a "forgotten child," we can see how on this day God turns our world upside down, and we discover to our amazement that God comes to us as a helpless and dependent child. We wait for someone we can rely upon, to trust, to believe in, to be there for us, and we end up with a God who reveals how much he depends on us. He needed a mother to suckle him. He needed a father to watch over him. He needed a roof over his head and arms to rock him to sleep. He needed love and tenderness. What a surprise and unexpected turn of events to discover that the God who fills our poverty and our aloneness, recognizes and remembers us when we feel we are forgotten, and breaks into our lives as the one who is born not as a "mighty warrior," but a little child needing us. Truly, our God is a God of surprises! Our faith is in the one who actually enters into our human experience and becomes dependent on us and it is in this turn-about and topsy-turvy understanding of God that he fulfills and satisfies our deepest hopes.

It is precisely because God comes to us weak and defenseless in such a humble and very human circumstance that we are sustained in the midst of life's challenges, difficulties, hardships, and heartbreaks. Our God is one who makes sure we know that he identifies with what is most human ... *comforting his people* (Isaiah 52) and whose ... *light shines in the darkness* (John 1) because he himself was born in the coldness and the shadows of life. We are the ... *people who once walked in darkness* (Isaiah 52) ... *but today have seen a great light ... and upon those who dwell in the land of gloom a light has shown* (Isaiah 9) because our God has traveled through the night of a very hard journey to a place " ... *where the star came to rest* (Matthew 2). God infuses himself into our human experience and has ... *broken the yoke that burdens us and has smashed the rod of the taskmaster* (Isaiah 9). Christmas is that very simple reminder that God offers us the very best: God's own self, and it is in this very unorthodox way of coming into our lives that God helps us to do the impossible in situations and places where we are tempted to give up or feel we have lost our way. He rekindles the warmth in those places in our hearts where we have grown cold, and he brings hope where we have become disillusioned and cynical, and invites us to believe once again when our doubt gets the best of us. We are reminded on this day, that the world has never been the same since that moment when God entered into our lived experience, not with any fanfare, but humbly, quietly, and without pretense, God comes to us as a little baby, so we will know the depth and the desire of God to be one with us: ... *see the Lord proclaims to the ends of the earth ... your savior comes ... for a child is born to us, a son is given us ... they name him Wonder-Counselor, God-Hero, Father Forever, Prince of Peace* (Isaiah 9).

May the spirit of Christmas ride in its branches, reminding us that God is here in this moment, and it is he who has brought to our memories those we hold dear not only in this season, but in all the seasons of our lives. With great reverence we dedicate this tree to your care, and entrust the lives that are represented to the one who is born among us Jesus Christ, Emmanuel, God who is with us forever and ever. 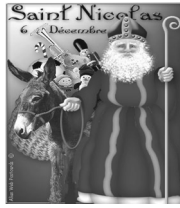


# Parish Life

## SAINT NICHOLAS WONDER WORKER OF MYRA

Little is known about the life of Saint Nicholas, but for 1700 years the generosity and kindness of this good bishop from Asia Minor has been kept alive through countless stories and legends, as well as plays, hymns, processions and parades, icons, shrines and festivals. Although he is the patron saint of several countries, including Greece and Russia, as well as the patron of pawnbrokers, sailors, merchants and women who wish to marry, he is especially remembered as the patron of children, most of the world knows him today as Santa Clause.

Children delight in the traditional custom of putting their shoes outside the bedroom door on the eve of his feast, and on awakening find the shoes filled with nuts, fruits, coins and cookies presents from the saint. *Keeping this custom in Advent gives parents a wonderful opportunity to talk with children about Santa Clause that he was a real person who lived many years ago and that he was a very holy man who especially loved children.*

## Feast of the Epiphany Ritual Remembrance of Those Who Have Lost a Child



This year, the Feast of the Holy Innocents is celebrated on Wednesday, December 28<sup>th</sup> and the Feast of the Holy Family is celebrated on Friday, December 30<sup>th</sup>. It has been the tradition at Saint Angela to remember those individuals and families who have lost a child at one of these two feast days. Since the Feasts of the Holy Innocents and the Holy Family occur on a weekday, we will recall the *Feast of the Holy Innocents* on the *Feast of the Epiphany, January 8<sup>th</sup> at all the Eucharists*. We will once again honor the memory of those individuals and families that have experienced the loss of a child. Small vigil candles will be placed near the Baptismal Font. Following the homily, individuals and families who have experienced the loss of a child, will be invited to ritually place a candle by the infant Jesus in the Crèche, as we recall, pray, and entrust to God what is sometimes very hard to express in words. May God heal any family memories we have experienced through the loss of a child. This Christmas Season, no child, whether they have died or are no longer with us is ever forgotten.
