It's with great sadness I'm writing to inform you, per the Governor's order, all Weekday and Weekend Masses have been suspended until further notice and the Church is closed. Confessions and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament have also been suspended.

You are dispensed of your Sunday obligation, however, I do encourage you to make a holy hour which includes prayer, scripture reading, and a time of reflection. Please pray for an end to the spread of the COVID-19 virus and recovery for those infected.

You're also encouraged to view our website: stangelabreachurch.org for Sunday's Mass, homilies, reflections, and current updates. You can view Mass live via Livestream from St. Edward the Confessor's 8:15 am Mass, Monday - Saturday and 9 am Sunday at stedward.com/stedcast/. Christ Cathedral's daily 6:30 am Mass can be seen at facebook.com/christcathedralca. EWTN T.V. or Relevant Radio AM930 are other options.

PASSION SUNDAY REFLECTION

At the end of World War II, a hundred miles north of Munich, an international military court was set up at Nuremberg to try the leading members of the Nazi regime. They were charged with crimes against humanity. These were the men who killed millions of innocent people, including women and children; the men who made the whole world tremble with fear. One of the observers in the court, on being asked what the accused looked like, replied, "They looked so ordinary, like men who had sat up all night in a third-class railway carriage." In other words, they did not look like devils incarnate; they were people who looked just like us. The people who put Christ to death did not look like people with two horns on their heads either. They were ordinary people like us who belong to the same human family. As we read the gospel on this Passion Sunday, we encounter many different characters, and in each, we glimpse something of ourselves, and of our failings.

A group of characters who consistently confronted Jesus throughout the Gospel and in the Passion are the Pharisees. The Pharisees were religious men who devoted their lives to doing good and to the study of God's Law. They were, however, convinced of their own righteousness and insisted Jesus was wrong, and broke the law to heal those who were in need on the Sabbath. People who are self-righteous are capable of the most appalling evil, as shown throughout history such as: during the Crusades and the Inquisition, the torture of suspects by governments, atrocities committed by guerrillas, and many more. Sometimes we, as human beings, behave a bit like the Pharisees, especially in developing countries. Many men in these countries are dictators at home to their wives and children. Whatever the husband or father says is right and is to be obeyed, otherwise, punishment is incurred. Women and children with no education or income are stuck in this kind of environment because they depend on the income of the man of the house to survive. In more developed countries, many men and women with money and education still act self-righteous. They use their money to influence politicians to make laws in their favor. Even within the church, we hear people criticizing the Pope and their church leaders without knowing the truth.

Another character in the Passion who is familiar to us is Pilate, who was focused on keeping his high position during a time of great unrest. He knew Jesus was innocent, but he feared the religious leaders would give him trouble if he did not give them what they wanted. Like Pilate, most of the time we also know what is right and wrong, but we don't always have the courage to face our boss, the people who are supposed to be reprimanded, or to take the right course no matter what the outcome.

When we read the Gospel for this Sunday, we find many characters with whom we are familiar, and we can identify with them from our own shortcomings, including the Pharisees, Caiaphas, Pilate, Judas, Peter, the soldiers, and the crowd. As we stay at home to try to slow the spread of COVID-19, there is ample time for us to look closely at each character flaw within us. Nevertheless, we must not lose sight of the main character in this Passion Sunday, Jesus himself. He shows us the only way to overcome evil on this earth is by good. As he entered Jerusalem like a king, indeed a king he is, with full power and might of the universe; he was willing to restrain his power to set an example of love. We need to examine ourselves to make sure we are more aligned with Jesus' character so we may bring love and goodness to the world. Likewise, countries and people who have military and economic power should examine their policies in light of this Gospel, so they may also become instruments of truth, justice, peace, and love in the world.

FIVE SIMPLE WAYS TO CELEBRATE HOLY WEEK AT HOME

Create a simple prayer space in your home, and gather there to pray during the week.

Palm Sunday: At your regular Mass time, read the first Palm Sunday Gospel (Mt 21:1-11) and meditate on or discuss what Jesus might be thinking as he enters Jerusalem for the last time.

Holy Thursday: Bake bread for sharing at dinner; make a ritual of stripping the dinner table of all cloths and decorations after dinner.

Good Friday: Pray the Stations of the Cross at 3 p.m.

Holy Saturday: In the morning, read Psalm 64 and break your Good Friday fast solemnly with a simple meal.

Easter Sunday: Dress up the dinner table again. Include candles and crosses, so that the candy baskets aren't the only festive items present. Sing Alleluia and read the Easter Gospel (Matthew 28:1-10) with solemnity and joy.

Look online for other suggestions for celebrating Holy Week at home, to deepen and enrich your experience at this time of social isolation.

Whenever we say the Lord's Prayer we pray, "Thy will be done." But how often do we still take the easy way out? Ever hear someone tell a lie or spread gossip that hurts a person's reputation? We can choose to do nothing (the easy way) or gently reproach the other with a simple question, "What would Jesus do?" When I have a chance to help someone in need, do I tell myself it's none of my business, or do I ask if there is anything I can do? When I am hurt by the death of a loved one, or am injured in an accident, do I get angry at God for letting this happen, or do I say with Jesus, "Not my will, but yours be done"? During this difficult time in our world, it is important we remember God's will, not ours be done. A SERVICE OPPORTUNITY FOR OUR YOUNG ADULTS

To meet increased needs from the diverse communities served in the Archdiocese, **Hearts to Serve** is providing those looking to help others during the pandemic with the following volunteer opportunities:

- Volunteer to answer calls on the hotline. Training will be provided. Can be done from your own home.
- Volunteer to deliver food and household items to the homebound. Must be under 60 years of age, have a current drivers' license, auto insurance and use of a vehicle.
- Collect items to stock parish-based food pantries. In addition to nonperishable food items, fresh produce and bread, meat, and baby items, such as diapers and formula are appreciated.
- Volunteer at a parish-based food pantry. Hours to be determined.

Those in need of food or supplies can call the **hotline at (855)423-6780** from 8 am to 5 pm daily. To volunteer, call the same hotline and identify yourself as a potential volunteer. Take some extra time today to serve those who can't leave their homes!

HOW TO PROVIDE A SAFE SUPPLY OF DRINKING WATER FOR YOUR HOUSEHOLD IN A DISASTER

Water Heater - DO NOT USE if the tank or fixtures have been submerged in floodwater!

- Turn off the gas or electricity to water heater (turn off electricity at the fuse or breaker box, turn off gas by locating the valve supplying the hot water heater and turning the valve handle so it crosses – is not lined up with – the gas line)
- Turn off the water intake valve (should be located near the water heater)
- Open the drain at the bottom of the tank
- Turn on a hot water faucet (water will drain from the tank, not the faucet)

Discard the first few gallons if they contain rust or sediment. Do not turn the gas or electricity back on until the tank is refilled.

Pipes

- Turn off main water valve where the water comes into the house (usually near the water meter if you have city water).
- Let air into the pipes by turning on the highest faucet in your house.
- Get water from the lowest faucet in your house (never get water from faucets that have been submerged in floodwater).
- Ice - If you have freezer space, consider freezing part of your water supply. This has the added advantage of keeping food in the freezer cold longer during a power outage.




