FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Do you believe in the resurrection of Christ? This is the topic of most of the readings at Mass during the Easter season. These readings have been set for centuries by the Church to encourage the neophytes recently baptized into the Church during the Easter Vigil. The Doubting Thomas episode, for example, has been the Gospel for the Second Sunday of Easter for centuries. It has been read to encourage the newly baptized to understand they are blessed because they have not seen Christ and yet they still believe. For us who have been believers for decades, it is not the question about believing in the resurrection of Christ, but how we could deepen our faith in Christ.

Let us take, for example, this Fourth Sunday of Easter titled Good Shepherd Sunday. As a veteran Christian, we know how good our Lord is and we could easily skip the reflection of the Gospel just like many other familiar gospels during the Easter season. For this reason, I want to turn your attention from the good shepherd to the bad sheep for the sake of deepening our faith.

When we are in an existential crisis, like not sleeping well, stuck in an unfulfilling job, or a manipulated relationship, feeling unhappy all the time etc., we tend to seek help from a psychotherapist. A good psychotherapist would help you to get back on your feet and be emotionally self-sufficient when needed; only if you are willing to change and be sincere about what is going on with your life. Sadly, there are people who seek help who have been trying to manipulate the therapist to their liking and trying to prove to themselves they are smarter than the professionals. We call these people "bad clients," not bad in a moral sense, but in a sense they are in a bad situation of their own making. The best psychotherapist in the world would not be able to help these people because they do not really want to change their life.

Jesus, himself, said he is the Good Shepherd and he would lay down his life for his flock. However, if the sheep do not want to follow him, it does not matter how good the shepherd is, there is nothing he can do. All he can do is, with immense patience and infinite forgiveness, long for us to change. I have simplified some ways for us to reflect as sheep following the shepherd and hope it will be helpful in following the path of the Good Shepherd.

- Self-awareness. Spiritual growth cannot occur without self-knowledge. We hide the truth about ourselves, and we present a false self to others. When we practice our faith, is it for others to see, or does it come from the Lord who is in your heart? One time after Sunday mass, a visitor presented herself to me and asked why our congregation did not kneel during certain times at Mass. As I considered her question, I recalled we, as a congregation, practice what the diocese told us to, with the new guidelines, and I told her I was not sure what she was talking about. It really does not matter if she was right or wrong, but is this all she was worried about at Mass? What was she trying to show? Was she a warm, loving disciple of Christ or here to correct mistakes? To know what path to follow, we must first know where we are on the path.
- Self-acceptance and balance. Physically, when our bodies are well-balanced, it is easy for us to move forward or backward. The same principle applies in the spiritual world. If something is always pulling us out of balance – jealousy, greed, ambition, anger, prejudice, refusal to forgive, lust or other form of self-indulgence – these things will gradually come to rule us, and we won't be able to move forward spiritually. Confession is a way of acknowledging and accepting our negative self. To accept our selfish and destructive self, we must be convinced of Christ's absolute and total love. On the other hand, we must give thanks to God for all the positive things happening in our lives. If we realize all the good things God has given us, especially a Good Shepherd to guide us, there is no need to be jealous or be greedy because we are already content.
- Accountability. How do we know we are following the path of the Good Shepherd? It is our participation in the community life of the church which validates our spiritual growth. We can easily fool ourselves into believing we are spiritually alive because of certain religious practices, but it is the spirit of involvement and generous service to the community which will validate whether our spirit is truly alive and growing in faith.

If we are honest, we may find we have not been following the path of the Good Shepherd but trying to forge our own path in the direction we want to go. If we abide by the teachings of Christ, we will become a guide for others on the path to following the Good Shepherd.

A SERVICE OPPORTUNITY FOR OUR YOUNG ADULTS

In order for us to meet increased needs from the diverse communities served in the Archdiocese, **Hearts to Serve** is providing those looking to help others during the pandemic with the following volunteer opportunities:

- Volunteer to answer calls on the hotline. Training will be provided. Can be done from your own home.
- Volunteer to deliver food and household items to the homebound. Must be under 60 years of age, have a current drivers' license, auto insurance and use of a vehicle.
- Go through your home and collect items to stock parish-based food pantries. In addition to nonperishable food items, fresh produce and bread, meat, and baby items, such as diapers, wipes, and formula are appreciated.
- Volunteer at a parish-based food pantry. Hours to be determined.

Those in need of food or supplies can call the **hotline at (855)423-6780** from 8 am to 5 pm daily. To volunteer, call the same hotline and identify yourself as a potential volunteer. Take some extra time today to serve those who can't leave their homes!

CORONAVIRUS: KNOW HOW IT SPREADS

There is currently no vaccine to prevent coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19). **The best way to prevent illness is to avoid being exposed to this virus.** The virus is thought to spread mainly from person-to-person. Between people who are in close contact with one another (within about 6 feet). Through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs, sneezes or talks. These droplets can land in the mouths or noses of people who are nearby or possibly be inhaled into the lungs. Some recent studies have suggested that COVID-19 may be spread by people who are not showing symptoms.

Clean your hands often

Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds especially after you have been in a public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing. If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry.



- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick
- Stay home as much as possible
- Put distance between yourself and other people.
- Remember that some people without symptoms may be able to spread virus.

Keeping distance from others is especially important for people who are at higher risk of getting very sick.

Cover your mouth and nose with a cloth face cover when around others

- You could spread COVID-19 to others even if you do not feel sick.
- Everyone should wear a cloth face cover when they have to go out in public, for example to the grocery store or to pick up other necessities.
- Cloth face coverings should not be placed on young children under age 2, anyone who has trouble breathing, or is unconscious, incapacitated or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance.
- The cloth face cover is meant to protect other people in case you are infected.
- Do NOT use a facemask meant for a healthcare worker.
- Continue to keep about 6 feet between yourself and others. The cloth face cover is not a substitute for social distancing.



Cover coughs and sneezes

- If you are in a private setting and do not have on your cloth face covering, remember to always cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze or use the inside of your elbow.
- Throw used tissues in the trash.
- Immediately wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not readily available, clean your hands with a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.



Clean and disinfect

- Clean AND disinfect frequently touched surfaces daily. This includes tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, keyboards, toilets, faucets, and sinks.
- If surfaces are dirty, clean them. Use detergent or soap and water prior to disinfection. Then, use a household disinfectant. Most common disinfectants will work.
