

Please remember our Sunday 5pm field Mass time will be changed to 4pm effective Sunday, November 1 due to the time change. When we meet the governor's requirements for the next covid tier (orange) then we'll be able to have 200 people in the church.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is officially back! Adoration will be available in the Hall Monday through Friday following the morning Mass from 8:30 to 9:30 AM, before the evening Mass from 5 to 6 PM, and Saturday afternoon from 3:30 to 4:45 PM.


Congratulations everyone! We met our PSA goal of \$104,000. All donations received from this day forward will be used for safety and security upgrades around the campus.

The Diocese recently rejected our request to bring back employees furloughed and strongly encouraged us to find volunteers to take their place. This is where you come in. St Angela's has a great history of volunteerism, people blessing others because they've been blessed. Giving back is a cornerstone of our Catholic identity. You see it in so many of our ministries which are currently handled by volunteers; from our Pastoral Council to ushers, faith formation teachers, Eucharistic Ministry, lectors and the list goes on. Thanks guys, what a blessing each of you are to St Angela's and our youth.

If bad weather (rain, wind etc) occurs, then we will be required to move our Sunday field Masses at 9:00am, 10:30am Spanish and 5:00pm into the church and/or hall (limit 100 people). We're currently working on broadcasting live to cars in the parking lot on the FM dial at 106.9 when the 9:00am, 10:30am Spanish or 5:00pm Masses have been moved into the church/hall. At all times please wear your mask, keep social distancing, and before receiving Communion, please sanitize your hands.

SUNDAY REFLECTION

The past couple weeks have given us good food for thought as we enter into Election Day 2020. In last week's Gospel Jesus says to give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and to God what belongs to God. Jesus recognizes Caesar, or the government, has a legitimate place, duties and responsibilities in our lives and in the world. Jesus then goes on to say "give to God what belongs to God". If we're honest and humble with ourselves we recognize everything belongs to God: our gifts, talents, treasure and "Yes" every breath we breathe. All are gifts from God.

We as Christians are called to be good stewards of all God's gifts, including our freedom to vote. In this regard it's up to us as good faith filled stewards to ensure our government leaders and policies recognize all is gift from God. God is the creator and sustainer of all life. It's therefore up to us to promote life and human dignity by voting for candidates and propositions which have at its basis a moral framework. That moral framework is the 10 Commandments. A healthy moral framework will help build up families, protect life, enhance human dignity, support the practice of religion and ensure all our relationships will flourish.

In this week's Gospel Jesus summarizes the 613 commandments in the Torah into two commandments which are inseparable; "Love God and Love your neighbor as yourself". If you follow this command then God's Kingdom will come to our world, our nation, our state and our families. There will be peace on earth.

Now does this mean we only have to follow the Commandment to love God and love your neighbor as yourself? No, we still need to keep all 10 Commandments like keeping Holy the Sabbath by attending Mass on Sunday or keeping the Commandment "thou shall not murder" by opposing abortion. The Church has said abortion is an intrinsically evil act not just because it breaks God's Commandment "not to murder" but also because it is directly opposed to God's law of love for one another and denies the gift of life we're called to be good stewards of.

In our first reading from the Book of Exodus, the second book of the Torah, the Lord's words give clear examples of how to love our neighbor and keep God's Commands. Our neighbor is not simply someone on our block or someone we see at church; it is the alien among us, for we were all aliens once. It is the widow, the orphan, the impoverished. God's two great commandments are why we work at shelters. It is why we stock food pantries. It is why some of us become foster parents. It is why we invite those living alone on our block to join us for dinner from time to time. Again, these are examples of love which do not exhaust the myriad ways in which we can live out the commandments.

These, and the many ways we love God and neighbor, are concrete proof we are "imitators of the Lord," as Saint Paul articulates today. A way of being a model for all the believers. For Matthew's community, and for us, "loving God and loving our neighbor" is not just a summary of commandments as rules to follow, but a whole new way of living which incorporates our relationship with God into everything we do, including how we vote. Whoever loves me will keep my word, says the Lord, and my Father will love him and we will come to him. There's no greater love than the love of God in Christ Jesus made manifest on the cross. May all of us continue to strive to "Love God and Love your neighbor as yourself" as Christ has loved us. Amen

SUNDAY MASS TIMES

The 7:45am live stream Mass is now open for worship in the Church. Only the first 100 people will be admitted. We still have the 9am field Mass, 10am drive-up Communion, 10:30am Spanish field Mass and a 5:00pm field Mass. Drive up Communion is available from 10:00 to 10:15am. Please bring what you need to be outside, or tune into St Angela's field Masses on the FM dial at 106.9. **The field Masses are broadcast live to cars in the parking lot. Listen to our Mass and come up to receive Holy Communion on the field or at our drive-up communion at 10am.** Please always wear your mask, keep social distance, and please sanitize your hands to receive the Host in your hand; step six feet aside before lifting your mask to consume the consecrated Host.

FUNERAL PLANNING

If you are planning a funeral, please call our Funeral Coordinator, **Denise Bittel at (714) 269-3362**, Denise will help you to schedule the Mass and gravesite service. Funerals will be held in the Church (100 is maximum capacity for the time being).

MASS TIME CHANGE

Beginning November 1 our 5:00pm Sunday evening Mass will be moved to 4:00pm due to the time change. Please make a note of the change and share the information with your friends. Orange County is currently in the "Orange" tier per state guidelines so the 7:45am Mass is still restricted to 100 people. As we move into the yellow tier, we will be able to accommodate more people in the church. We pray for a swift change to the pandemic.
