

PARISH UPDATE

In the upcoming weeks we have the opportunity to participate in a new Diocese of Orange survey project named "Called for More". The Called for More Project is an initiative of the Catholic Leadership Institute (CLI). CLI received a grant from the Lilly Endowment to pilot a new process for supporting priests and parishes for thriving in ministry. By gathering information about each priest and each parish, the pilot seeks to give parishioners more awareness about the needs and opportunities of their local community, priests more awareness and support around their ongoing ministerial development, and the diocese better information to consider and discern priestly assignments and parish support.

This survey will help more Catholics to grow in their relationship with Jesus Christ, and become more highly engaged in their parish! The survey tool seeks to provide parishioners with an opportunity to reflect on their individual spiritual growth as well as provide your parish leadership with invaluable insight regarding their parish's strengths and opportunities. We hope this experience provides meaningful input as we set priorities and allocate resources so that the parish is moving parishioners forward on their journey of faith as effectively as possible.

This month we're saying "Good-Bye" to our dear friend, Father Raphael Ddamba. He has been the Chaplain at St. Jude's for over 4 years and is returning to Uganda at the end of this month. Father Raphael has celebrated morning Mass at St. Angela's from time to time and has helped us with our Penance Services. Fr. Raphael will be returning to Uganda to continue his ministry supporting a local poor community develop a farm and establish a solar powered well. His latest project is to purchase a tractor for the farm. If you'd like to contribute to the cause just go to the "Go Fund Me" website and search for "Tractor & Accessories for St. Isidore Foundation".

Currently all Masses, baptisms, funerals, weddings, confessions, Faith Formation classes, etc., can only occur **outdoors**. Sunday Masses are on the field at 9:00 am, 10:30 am in Spanish, and 4:00 pm. Our live stream Mass is Sunday at 7:45 am (closed to the public). **If bad weather (rain, wind, etc.) prevents us from celebrating Sunday Mass on the field**, please view our live stream Mass at 7:45 am or drive into the church parking lot at 9 am or 10:30 am (Spanish) and listen to Mass on the FM dial at 106.9. At Communion time, approximately 9:45 and 11:15 am (Spanish) come up and receive Communion at the covered lunch table area. At all times, please wear your mask, keep social distancing, and before receiving Communion, please sanitize your hands. **The Sacrament of Reconciliation** is available on Saturdays from 3:30 to 4:40 pm in the plaza. **Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament** is available in the Church Monday to Friday from 8:30 to 9:30 am, following the 8 am Mass, before the 6 pm Mass from 5 to 6 PM and Saturday afternoon from 3:30 to 4:45 pm.

SUNDAY REFLECTION

"Then the fever left her, and she waited on them."

For the past year, you and I have been experiencing a life we could never imagine. This pandemic has brought consequences no one would have thought possible. Businesses are closing down, people are losing their jobs, and most importantly, people are getting sick and many are dying. Families are not even allowed to say goodbye to their family members or good friends.

The vaccines cannot get to us soon enough. We are like the people in the village of Capernaum. These people were very poor; they had no medicine; their water was dirty, and many were seriously ill. They hear about this preacher who healed people. So, they came to Jesus. Whether they had faith or not, I don't know and really, it's not for us to judge. The fact is Jesus healed them and preached to them because this is what he came to do. Jesus came to preach the Kingdom of Heaven, to heal the sick, to give light to the blind, to give shelter to the homeless, and to set captives free. He wants us, no, He expects us to do the same if we are to follow him.

This pandemic is making captives of us all. We are captive to our fears of getting sick, we are captive to the bad news we hear daily about violence and hatred; and we are captive because we are weak and broken in many ways. Yet, in all this captivity, in all this brokenness, we are called to heal the sick and give comfort to the oppressed.

Every time we come to Mass, we need to remember our God loves us so much, so intensely, so tenderly, he sent his son to save us. Jesus heals us, forgives our sins, binds our brokenness, and sends us out to do what? Just like Simon-Peter's mother-in-law, who Jesus cured from a fever, she was healed and she began to serve all who were there. Unless we serve all people we meet who are ill in one way or another, unless we preach the Good News of the Kingdom, unless we love one another, we cannot claim to be a follower of Jesus Christ.

How can we be a better Christian and preach the Kingdom of Heaven when we are at home most of the time? How can we reach out to people when we can't even come close to anyone unless they live in our own house? I have some suggestions:

- ❖ We can go online to Amazon and order some blankets and socks and send them to the Catholic Worker here in Orange County. <http://www.occatholicworker.org> They have a terrific section on what is needed, a whole list of items that include blankets and socks and much more. If you don't want to send items there, give them to our Act Office and they will distribute them.
- ❖ If you have a lot of family members or belong to a club of people who you are unable to visit, choose a rest home or skilled nursing facility and get as many family members and friends to send one or two cards to people who live in these facilities. I bet you most of these individuals never hear from anyone and a simple card telling them you care and are praying for them will work wonders.

Lastly, take Jesus' example and spend some quite time with the Lord. Pick a nice park, take a beach chair, and sit by yourself, listen, and be with the Lord.

Lent is coming pretty fast; in 10 days. Let's listen to what our Lord is calling us to do, be creative , and always love tenderly.




ST. ANGELA MERICI OPERATION RICE BOWL BEGINS.

Cardboard rice bowl distribution begins today. It is a way of supporting the Lenten period of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. The simple bowl is a reminder of our care for each other and the less fortunate in the world. CRS Rice Bowl is the Lenten program of Catholic Relief Services (CRS). Through CRS Rice Bowl, faith communities in dioceses throughout the United States put their faith into action. Lenten alms donated through CRS Rice Bowl support the work of CRS in more than 100 different countries each year. Twenty-five percent of donations to CRS Rice Bowl stay in the local diocese, poverty alleviation efforts. This simple cardboard box is a tool for collecting Lenten alms - and comes with a Lenten calendar guiding families through the 40 days of Lent with activities, reflections, and stories.

More than 40 years ago, Catholics in the United States wanted to respond to famine in Africa. The help came in the form of a small cardboard box, marking the beginning of "Operation Rice Bowl". A tradition for millions of Catholics who employ the Lenten pillars of praying, fasting and almsgiving to change the lives of others while enriching their own. Operation Rice Bowl at St. Angela's is sponsored by the Knights of Columbus council and PALS. Look for distribution of cardboard bowls after Mass.


Bill McMillan


