PARISH UPDATE

Happy Palm Sunday!

It's great to see the number of Covid vaccinations going up and the number of Covid cases coming down. For this reason, we'll slowly, cautiously, and safely open for more activities. Our church office will be open for an additional hour in the morning, from 8 to 11 am and after Easter we're hoping to expand office hours to include evenings from 4 to 7 pm. I must say, I'm so very proud and must commend all of you on how well you've followed all the Covid safety protocols. I even had a parishioner from a nearby church say they've decided to make St. Angela's their new church home because of our commitment to Covid safety.

As you start to make plans for Easter Sunday, please recognize we have our first Easter Sunrise Mass on the field at 6:30 am and an additional 12 noon Mass in the church.

It's time to kick off our PSA drive. Through the Pastoral Services Appeal we are supporting the mission of the Diocese of Orange as well as our own Parish goals. PSA provides an opportunity for us to join together as one Diocese of Orange church family in our support of many diverse ministries like; Catholic Education, Clergy Formation and Support, Outreach ministries to the poor and needy, and Parish and Diocesan Development. These ministries and services benefit our own parish as well as parishes and people all over Orange County. With funds from PSA we will be able to address some significant needs here at St. Angela Merici Church. This year we have chosen to focus on refurbishing/replacing our church pews. Now that we've replaced our lighting system we can now see how our pews and kneelers have fallen into disrepair. In the weeks ahead we will hear how we can respond to this call to carry on the work of Christ in our community. Please prayerfully consider how you will be able to support this important appeal.

You can also view our 7:45 am livestream Mass on line at <https://stangelabreachurch.org/> or drive into the church parking lot at 9:00 am or 10:30 am (Spanish) and listen to Mass on the FM dial at 106.9. At Communion time, approximately 10:00 am and 11:30 am (Spanish) come up and receive Communion at the covered lunch table area. At all times, please wear your mask, keep social distancing, and before receiving Communion, please sanitize your hands. **Week day Masses** are at 8 am and 6 pm and Sat. 8am. **Adoration** will be in the Church Monday thru Friday from 8:30-9:30 am, 5:00-6:00 pm and Sat. 3:30-4:45 pm. **Confessions** are on Saturday's in the plaza from 3:30 to 4:30 pm.

I want to Thank everyone who participated in the Diocese program "Called for More". This survey will help more Catholics to grow in relationship with Jesus Christ and become more engaged in their parish! The results of the survey will soon be made available and will assist St Angela's in becoming an even more flourishing Parish.

SUNDAY REFLECTION

CHALLENGES AND TRIUMPHS: A PASSION OF MORAL REFLECTION!

Though my Holy Land Pilgrimage was in early October of 2015, my thoughts, visions, and memories are still fresh in my mind, especially during Lent and Holy Week. I kept a journal during our 10-day journey. St. Mark's Gospel on this Passion/Palm Sunday reminds me of the depth of God's love for His creation as He returns to Jerusalem for the last time to give us life everlasting through His death and Resurrection.

Two brief journal entries I wrote gave me an insight into the loneliness Jesus must have felt after He was arrested, brought to trial, and crucified on the cross. The first was where Christ was dragged before Caiaphas to be tried: *Jesus was lowered into a pit that served as His prison before being taken to Pilate. In a corner was a lectern with a book opened to Psalm 88 from which I read aloud to my fellow sojourners, tears running down my cheeks as I read verses 7 through 9. I have never felt so desolate in my life.*

The second journal entry followed a quiet 4 am walk of the Via Delarosa in which prayerful readings from scripture were read along with a song almost whispered of *Were You There*. It was about the 11th Station where Jesus was nailed to the cross that I wrote: *As Deacon Doug Cook read our prayer for the 11th Station, he cried and I too felt overcome with Jesus' grief. After putting my arm into the hole where His cross was hammered into the ground, I went to a single kneeler in the back of the area where I prayed head down asking God's forgiveness for times I abandoned Him in my sins.*

Imagine, if you can, what Jesus felt like from the time He triumphantly enters into Jerusalem after raising Lazarus from the dead to His death on a wooden cross, condemned for sharing God's truth to all who would listen. As the Son of God, the Father, He has all the power to command everyone to follow His lead in preaching, teaching, and healing. Yet, in His obedience to the will of His Father, He does not "regard equality with God, something to be grasped." He instead suffers all the indignities of a human so He could fulfill His promise to die for our sins, end death, and provide us with everlasting life.

Christ's acceptance of His passion and crucifixion is a witness to God's love for humanity. Yet, from the time He spent on earth until present day, there is always a question: Why? Why would God, who is capable of doing anything, take such a painful route to accomplish His plan? Why attempt to convince humanity this is the correct journey to being saved?

The quickest answer is humanity, with their free will, refused acceptance of earlier covenants as not fitting their personal needs from their own perspective. Their expectation was not met without difficulty on humanity's side. This seems to question God's unconditional love without a buy-in by us. In other words, their perception was unfulfilled in people's minds because they couldn't accept God's plan as a joint effort. Their response is that a gift should not have to be reciprocal, even if it is only a thank you by living a moral life.

If we are to understand and receive a full picture of God's love, mercy, and forgiveness for us, we need to participate just as Jesus did as a human who walked among us. Doing so often brings pain. Read about any person who was canonized as a saint; their journey involved an adjustment to embrace a moral compass of God's grace.

Our Lenten journey is meant to bring us to a place in our lives looking deeply into our heart, mind, soul, and strength for an answer of how to become a better person. Jesus did by facing life's challenges with a positive approach that helped people believe they are loved and capable of sharing love with others.

With four days left until the end of Lent and beginning of the Triduum, let us define what we have discovered about our relationship with God. We might find the challenges of life bring us triumphs, at least in small ways, to be Jesus' best representative of bringing faith, hope, and love to God's creation. It seems a small price to pay for all God has done for us.



Lord, when did we see you? —Matthew 25:38

The season of Lent gives us a wonderful opportunity to reflect and make room in our hearts to welcome the stranger. Through our **prayer**, we encounter Jesus, who is present in the face of every member of our human family. When we **fast**, we encounter the obstacles that stop us from fully loving God and our neighbor. When we **give alms**, we share what we have with others. We have been using our rice bowls so far during Lent to share ourselves and save our treasure (alms) for those in need.

This Lent CRS Rice Bowl has taken us to three countries, Madagascar, El Salvador, and Timor-Leste. Hunger and malnutrition, which happens when we don't get the right amount of nutrients, are challenges that too many families face each day. One out of every 10 people worldwide don't have enough to eat. Sometimes this is caused by natural disasters like floods and droughts. Other times, families don't have enough money to buy the food they need, or the food they can get doesn't have all the vitamins and minerals they need to stay healthy. Our donations to CRS rice bowl help find solutions for these people.

As our Lenten sacrifices transition to our Easter Joy we will collect your rice bowl donations [between 4/6/21 and 4/15/21]. Look for collection boxes at the Masses on **Sunday April 11th** (Divine Mercy Sunday). Use the collection boxes at Mass or drop your rice bowl donations by the parish office. You can add up the bowl contents and write a check for that amount to **Catholic Relief Services (CRS)** or if you prefer turn in the bowl cash. Don't forget to pray for those who benefit from your support.

A CLOSER LOOK AT ST. JOSEPH, HUSBAND OF MARY

I often think about St. Joseph — what he looked like, how his voice sounded. Was he a large, powerfully built man? Was he outgoing or more reserved? How did people feel when they were with him?

This much I believe is true: Joseph must have possessed a soul so beautiful that God chose him to be the foster father of Jesus and husband of Mary. Think about that for a moment. God, Creator of all things, looked at Joseph among all men and regarded him so highly, that God trusted him to be the provider and protector of the Holy Family.

What did God see when He looked at Joseph? I picture him to look like the statues and pictures we have in our churches, but I think that God saw past his physical appearance, to a man of prayer and humility who believed he could serve God best with his skills as a carpenter. I would imagine that God saw beyond the ordinary to a man with an extraordinary capacity for trust and faith. A man so skilled at listening, he heard the messages of angels and acted on them.

When told by an angel to take Mary and Jesus and leave Bethlehem immediately because of the danger, “Joseph rose and took the child and his mother by night and departed for Egypt” (Matthew 2:14). His obedience and total faith in God are remarkable, leaving whatever comfort and security the family had to travel to a distant and strange land.

Imagine Joseph speaking this urgent news to Mary. I think that in this latest upheaval of their lives, Mary remembered that Joseph was the man God had chosen to care for and protect her and Jesus. She must have felt safe and trusted that somehow they would be alright. Imagine them leaving most of their belongings behind, packing what they could in haste and setting out along unknown roads toward an unknown future. By Joseph's obedience, we have a sense of how deeply he trusted the care and providence of God.

Though he knew that Jesus was the son of God, Joseph assumed the role of father, raising Jesus as his son in his culture and faith and passing on his trade as a carpenter. When he worked with the wooden timbers and boards, did Joseph know of the unimaginable death Jesus would suffer on the same wood that provided their livelihood?

Whenever our lives are disrupted or in turmoil we can turn to Joseph. He understands the pain, suffering, and dangers that we face because he experienced them in his own life. As St. Teresa of Avila has said, “Would that I could persuade all men to be devoted to this glorious St. Joseph, for I know by long experience what blessings he can obtain for us from God.”

I daily turn with confidence to St. Joseph for his guidance and protection. The Litany of St. Joseph is a prayer that lists the many titles given to this powerful saint, like “Watchful defender of Christ,” “Joseph most valiant,” “Model of workman,” “Pillar of families,” and “Protector of Holy Church.” I read the list and imagine how St. Joseph fulfilled each of these roles. One of my favorites is “Terror of Demons,” which St. Joseph must have been to protect the holy family during all of its travails. Whatever your need or intention may be, take it to St. Joseph and ask for his help. St. Joseph, Head of the Holy Family, Terror of Demons, pray for us.
