

# PARISH UPDATE

Happy Lent everyone!

I must say, I was amazed at how many people participated in our Ash Wednesday services. A big thanks to all who made it happen in a very safe manner. As I previously mentioned, given a recent court decision and decline in the number of Covid cases, the CA Bishops have allowed all Masses, baptisms, funerals, and weddings to be held in the Church, with a limit of 200 people. Faith Formation classes and meetings, etc., must continue to remain outdoors or online.

Here's the latest weekend Mass schedule, Saturday: 5:00 pm Mass in the Church; Sunday: 7:45 am Livestream Mass in the Church, 9:00 am Mass on the field, 10:30 am Spanish Mass on the field, and 5:00 pm Mass in the Church. (There is a limit of 200 people in attendance for Masses in the church.) **Please remember if bad weather prevents us from celebrating Sunday Mass on the field, we'll move into the church with a slight time delay to ensure everything is sanitized.** You can also view our livestream Mass at 7:45 am or drive into the church parking lot at 9:00 am or 10:30 am (Spanish) to listen on 106.9FM. At Communion, approximately 10:00 am and 11:30 am (Spanish), come and receive Communion at the covered lunch table area. Please wear your mask, keep social distancing, and before receiving Communion, please sanitize your hands.

## SUNDAY REFLECTION

The Temple and its surrounding complex on Jerusalem's Temple Mount were the most holy and sacred of sites to the Jewish people. It was here, where God's Holiest of Holy Presence abided. From the time of Solomon, this location had been a place of prayer, pilgrimage and sacrifice. It had undergone multiple attacks, desecrations, destructions, and reconstructions. It was here Mary and Joseph had presented their Son Jesus to the Lord God Almighty. This is the place Mary and Joseph found their twelve-year-old Son Jesus, doing the Father's work, and here, where Jesus preached and prayed. It was truly Holy ground. Since many pilgrims came to this holy site to fulfill prescriptions of the law and offer sacrifice, local merchants thought it an ideal location for doing business, changing money and selling sheep, oxen and birds for ritual sacrifices. In many ways these merchants were disrespecting the sacredness of the Temple for their own gains. Today, to some degree, we see this type of money exchange at our own Christian and Marian Holy sites. Merchants looking to make a buck off the pilgrims.

In today's Gospel, Jesus again returns to Jerusalem and becomes rightfully angry at the sight of such commerce and chaos in and around his Father's house. He drives out the merchants and animals, spills the money and overturns tables. It must have been quite a sight! How had such a holy place been turned into a marketplace, a den of thieves? God's sacred had become desecrated by the evil of the world.

All those merchants and Jewish pilgrims would have been familiar with the Ten Commandments which we heard in today's first reading. The first three go into detail about respect for God the Father.... that there be no other gods, God's name not be taken in vain, and the Sabbath be kept holy as a sacred day of rest. Yet, the sacred commandments were rejected; the Temple was defiled, the poor were ignored, and the Messiah in their midst was condemned to death.

We, too, live in a world in which commandments are broken and the sacred is profaned and disrespected. Right and wrong seems to be blurred at times. Integrity is compromised for personal or political gain; believers ordered to stay home at the exclusion of their freedom to worship in God's house. Finally, the latest action against people of faith contained in the Federal Equality Act as it's currently written. Of course, everyone deserves to be treated with respect and dignity. The Equality Act, which is being voted on in the U.S. Senate soon, in many ways does the opposite and needs to be opposed, as we're encouraged to do so by our Bishop's. Instead of respecting differences in beliefs about marriage and sexuality, the Equality Act would discriminate against people of faith. The sacred is sacrificed.

As believers in Jesus Christ, especially during Lent, each of us are called to look deep into our own lives to see how we've compromised the sacred. To think about ways in which we can draw deep within ourselves and resolve to "turn over tables of our own discrimination and injustice". Where have we turned a blind eye to the sacredness of our faith? Where can we identify our own idolatry in seeking personal gain at the exclusion of others? In the privacy of our thoughts and prayers, how can we cast out the trivial and make room for the sacred? The best place to start is to resolve to begin with prayer, asking for Christ-like wisdom instead of the wisdom of the world.

Everyone deserves to be treated with respect and dignity. The Equality Act, which is being voted on in the U.S. Senate soon, in many ways does the opposite and needs to be opposed. Instead of respecting differences in beliefs about marriage and sexuality, the Equality Act would discriminate against people of faith. The Equality Act would: punish faith-based organizations, such as charities and schools who serve everyone in their communities, simply because of their beliefs; force girls and women to compete against boys and men for limited opportunities in sports, and to share locker rooms and shower spaces with biological males who identify as women; risk mandating taxpayers to fund abortions; force people in everyday life, and especially health care workers, to support gender transition; and expand what the government considers a "public" place, forcing even some parish halls to host functions that conflict with Catholic beliefs.

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops is asking each of us to oppose discrimination against people of faith in the so-called "Equality Act."

## ST. ANGELA MERICI OPERATION RICE BOWL BEGINS.

Cardboard rice bowl distribution begins today. It is a way of supporting the Lenten period of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. The simple bowl is a reminder of our care for each other and the less fortunate in the world. CRS Rice Bowl is the Lenten program of Catholic Relief Services (CRS). Through CRS Rice Bowl, faith communities in dioceses throughout the United States put their faith into action. Lenten alms donated through CRS Rice Bowl support the work of CRS in more than 100 different countries each year. Twenty-five percent of donations to CRS Rice Bowl stay in the local diocese, poverty alleviation efforts. This simple cardboard box is a tool for collecting Lenten alms - and comes with a Lenten calendar guiding families through the 40 days of Lent with activities, reflections, and stories.

More than 40 years ago, Catholics in the United States wanted to respond to famine in Africa. The help came in the form of a small cardboard box, marking the beginning of "Operation Rice Bowl". A tradition for millions of Catholics who employ the Lenten pillars of praying, fasting and almsgiving to change the lives of others while enriching their own. 


