SUNDAY REFLECTION

Most of my early life I spent looking for where I belonged. Attending multiple elementary schools, due to problems between my mom and dad, made it difficult to focus on where I was headed in life. I had to adjust to each scenario, not because the classes were so different, but the schools and people in them had specific goals that conflicted with what was used to.

My security during those times and afterwards was my ability to adapt. In many cases it was easy, and I was looked upon as someone who was smart, a team player, and a reliable person. On the opposite side, I was seen as a problem child, a loner and someone to be avoided. I spent more time in the principal's office or in detention and was "talked to" by adults who were trying to help me fall into line with their way of thinking. The last elementary school I attended was St. Mary of the Lake Catholic School, on the north side Chicago. I was there from fourth through eighth grades and split my behavior between Mr. Hyde for the first half and Dr. Jekyll for the other half. I was introduced to another philosophy where we take care of one another. It provided a good direction for my life. Following graduation I entered Quigley Preparatory Seminary to become a priest. My grandmother on my dad's side was proud of the time she took to teach me about Catholicism which was starting to pay off; at least for the two years I attended.

What does this personal history have to do with our Gospel and readings today? It helped me to begin focusing on what was really important in my life: Other people and their needs. In my nine years of elementary school, I was primarily looking into a mirror at myself and feeling discouraged because I wasn't finding answers to my questions about who I was and where should I be. St. Mary's and Quigley began to change my focus from my wants and needs to God being the center of my life and how I can serve all of His creation. This perspective replaced the self-centeredness I had been consumed with for so many years. My initial attitude was similar to the Apostles James and John in St. Mark's Gospel today. They believed they were superior to those not in the inner circle with Jesus, and deserved more by being honored above and beyond everyone else. This convoluted thinking is often arrived at because we are taught to be self-centered if we want to maintain a lifestyle that gives us everything we want or believe we need. By doing so, we lose sight of how most people live and become callused to reality. This causes upheaval in the masses. What is left is chaos where no one is at peace or receiving joy.

As Christians, we are taught by Jesus to reach out to those in need, if we want to change a world that seems to have lost its focus on what is right for everyone. The last sentence of the Gospel succinctly defines the purpose for why we are called as disciples: "For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give His life as a ransom for many." Jesus teaches us, as his disciples, true greatness lies not in what we have, or in what we get from others but in what we can give of ourselves in humble service to others. Jesus invites us to take our ambition for greatness and turn that energy into service.

In the study guide entitled *At Home with the Word* published by Liturgy Training Publications, there is an insert on the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time that references the Greenleaf Center at Seton Hall University, South Orange, New Jersey. They offer a leadership style being adopted by companies and organizations to enrich lives and build a society focused on compassion and justice. We all want to be somebody. Today's readings contrast celebrity with service. To be the person God has created us to be, let us take this week to perform three acts of service no one will see or know about. By doing so we will hopefully better understand the sacrifice Jesus made for us through His suffering and death on the cross and we can carry on His work as the true disciples we have been called to be.

La mayor parte de mi vida temprana la pasé buscando a dónde pertenecía. Asistir a varias escuelas primarias debido a problemas personales entre mi mamá y mi papá hizo que fuera difícil concentrarme en hacia dónde me dirigía en la vida. Tuve que adaptarme a cada escenario, no porque las clases fueran muy diferentes, sino porque las escuelas y las personas en ellas tenían objetivos específicos que a menudo estaban en conflicto con lo que me familiarizaba en situaciones anteriores.

Mi seguridad durante esos tiempos y después durante muchos años fue mi capacidad de adaptación. En muchos casos fue fácil y me consideraron como alguien inteligente, un jugador de equipo y una persona confiable. En el lado opuesto, me veían como un niño problemático, un solitario y alguien a evitar. Pasé más tiempo en la oficina del director o en detención y más adultos que intentaban ayudarme a alinearme con su forma de pensar me hablaron "conmigo". La última escuela primaria a la que asistí fue St. Mary of the Lake Catholic School en el lado norte de Chicago. Estuve allí de cuarto a octavo grado y dividí mi comportamiento entre el Sr. Hyde durante la primera mitad y el Dr. Jekyll para la otra mitad. Me abrió a otra filosofía en la que nos cuidamos unos a otros. Proporcionó una buena dirección para mi vida. Después de graduarme, ingresé al Seminario Preparatorio quigley para convertirme en sacerdote. Mi abuela por parte de mi padre estaba orgullosa de que todo el tiempo que se tomaba para enseñarme sobre el catolicismo empezaba a dar sus frutos; al menos durante los dos años que asistí.

Entonces, ¿qué tiene que ver toda esta historia personal con nuestro Evangelio y las lecturas de hoy? Me ayudó a comenzar a centrarme en lo que era realmente importante en mi vida: otras personas y sus necesidades. En mis nueve años de escuela primaria, principalmente me miraba en un espejo y me sentía desanimada porque no estaba encontrando respuestas a todas mis preguntas sobre quién era y dónde debería estar. St. Mary's y Quigley comenzaron a cambiar mi enfoque de mis deseos y necesidades a que Dios sea el centro de mi vida y cómo puedo servir a toda Su creación. Esta perspectiva reemplazó el egocentrismo con el que había estado consumido durante tantos años. Mi actitud inicial fue similar a la de los apóstoles Santiago y Juan en el Evangelio de San Marcos de hoy, quienes creían que eran superiores a aquellos que no estaban en el círculo interno con Jesús y merecían más al ser honrados por encima y más allá de todos los demás.

A menudo se llega a este pensamiento enrevesado porque se nos enseña a ser egocéntricos si queremos mantener un estilo de vida que nos brinde todo lo que queremos o creemos que necesitamos. Al hacerlo, perdemos de vista cómo la mayoría de las personas viven y se vuelven callosas a la realidad. Esto causa agitación en las masas y lo que queda es el caos para que nadie esté en paz o recibiendo alegría. Como cristianos, Jesús nos enseña a llegar a los necesitados, si queremos cambiar un mundo que parece haber perdido su enfoque en lo que es correcto para todos. La última oración del Evangelio define sucintamente el propósito de por qué somos llamados como discípulos: "Porque el Hijo del Hombre no vino a ser servido, sino a servir y dar su vida como rescate por muchos".

Jesús nos enseña, como sus discípulos, que la verdadera grandeza no radica en lo que tenemos, o en lo que podemos obtener de los demás, sino en lo que podemos dar de nosotros mismos en el servicio humilde a los demás. Jesús nos invita a tomar nuestra ambición de grandeza y convertir esa energía en servicio. En la guía de estudio titulada *En casa con la palabra* publicada por Liturgy Training Publications, hay un inserto el 29º domingo en el Tiempo Ordinario que hace referencia al Centro Greenleaf en la Universidad seton Hall, South Orange, Nueva Jersey. Ofrecen un estilo de liderazgo adoptado por empresas y organizaciones para enriquecer vidas y construir una sociedad centrada en la compasión y la justicia.

Todos queremos ser alguien. Las lecturas de hoy contrastan la celebridad con el servicio. Para ser la persona que Dios nos ha creado para ser, tomemos esta semana para realizar tres actos de servicio que nadie verá o conocerá. Al hacerlo, esperamos comprender mejor el sacrificio que Jesús hizo por nosotros a través de Su sufrimiento y muerte en la cruz para que podamos continuar Su obra como los verdaderos discípulos que hemos sido llamados a ser.

This past September 24, our own John Lee and 21 other classmates stood in front of the Altar of Christ Cathedral and were officially accepted by Bishop Kevin Vann as Candidates for, God willing, for ordination to the Diaconate. John and Maggie Lee have been involved in a process of diaconate formation: attending classes several nights a week in subjects such as Old and New Testament Studies, Moral Theology, and learning how to pray the Liturgy of the Hours. They have also participated in one Sunday a month of spiritual formation days, and an annual retreat for the past two and a half years.



Their spiritual formation has centered around whether God is calling them, and specifically John, to service as an ordained deacon for the Diocese of Orange, and again, God willing, for our parish. As candidates, they will continue in a more intense process of discernment of the Holy Spirit. Their classes and formation will continue, and if they are called by the bishop, will be ordained in October, 2023.

John and his wife Maggie have been parishioners of St. Angela since they were married here in 1988. John grew up in Malaysia; Maggie grew up in New Jersey. They met at a Beach Mass here in Southern California. They have been involved in various ministries over the years: Music, Marriage Encounter, Lector, Eucharistic Minister, Bread of Angels, Religious Ed, and RCIA. They are both retired (John was a Family Physician; Maggie was a Software Engineer). They have lived in Fullerton for most of their married life. John enjoys gardening, cooking, and eating; Maggie enjoys reading, baking, and eating; they both love to travel.






