FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK


REFLECTION FOR THE SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIS

Today we celebrate the feast of the body and blood of Christ, and remember the gestures and words of Jesus at the last supper. We remember the shared tables of Jesus with his disciples. This feast sums up the entire existence of the Lord. We celebrate the memory of an existence donated to the service of others until death. The feast of Corpus Christi, as it is popularly known in some countries, is one of the main solemnities of the liturgical year because it synthesizes what the life of the disciples of Jesus is about, lives given out of love for the transformation of the world.

We remember the Memorial of the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus in such a unique sacrament. Now it reminds us of today's crucified people with whom Jesus the Redeemer is suffering. We are invited to follow the redemptive path that saves us from selfishness and indifference. Since ancient times, or rather, forever, sharing a table and food has been something sacred, not only because a basic need is satisfied, but also because those who share also share. The narration of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes foreshadows the gift Jesus himself will share until his death on the cross. The evangelist Luke says it is Jesus, after having spoken of the kingdom and healed the sick on their foreheads, invites his disciples to renounce the individualistic mentality, instead disturbing the solidarity among all to share and share. A proposal that surprises and puts to the test the faith in Jesus' project that they are just beginning to make their own. The great miracle of Jesus is not in multiplying "loaves" and fishes, but in generating donations from one to another. Jesus prioritizes the needs of his people, awakening concern in the face of the insensitivity and mercantilist mentality of his followers. For Jesus, the interest of caring for those who are hungry was not a matter of charitable assistance, but to show, if we stop hoarding the goods of creation, they reach and exceed.

Which Eucharistic tradition have we inherited? I hope we do not reduce our participation in the Eucharist to an empty rite, to an intimate experience that calms our conscience, but does not change us internally. The sacramental symbol of the body and blood of Christ invites me to transform myself into the Eucharist, food of life for my family, my community, society in general, be bread broken and shared with others. Amen Blessings to you and your whole family.

REFLEXIÓN PARA SANTÍSIMO CUERPO Y SANGRE DE CRISTO

Hoy celebramos la fiesta del cuerpo y sangre de Cristo, memoria de los gestos y de las palabras de Jesús en la última cena. Memoria de las mesas compartidas de Jesús con sus discípulos. Fiesta que resume toda la existencia del señor. Celebramos la memoria de una existencia donada al servicio de los demás hasta la muerte. La fiesta del Corpus Christi, como popularmente se conoce en algunos países, es una de las principales solemnidades del año litúrgico porque sintetiza aquello de qué ser la vida de los discípulos y discípulas de Jesús, vidas entregadas por amor para la transformación del mundo.

Recordamos el Memorial de la pasión, muerte y resurrección de Jesús en tan singular sacramento. Memorial que, al actualizar lo, nos remite a las personas crucificadas de hoy en quienes se encuentran hoy sufriendo Jesus redentor. En esos rostros estamos invitados a seguir el camino redentor que nos salve del egoísmo y la indiferencia.

Desde antiguo o, mejor dicho, desde siempre, compartir la mesa y los alimentos ha sido algo sagrado, no sólo porque se satisface una necesidad básica sino porque quien comparte se comparte asimismo. La narración de la multiplicación de los panes y de los peces pre saya el don decí mismo que Jesús compartirá hasta la muerte de cruz. El evangelista Lucas dice que es Jesús, después de haber hablado del reino y sanado a los enfermos sus frentes, invita a sus discípulos a renunciar a la mentalidad individualista, vez perturbando la solidaridad entre todos para compartir y compartirse. Propuesta que sorprende y pone a prueba la fe en el proyecto de Jesús que apenas empiezan a hacer suyo. Acaso Jesús Fermenta el paternalismo? O crees que se trata de un compartir justo? El gran milagro de Jesús no está en multiplicar "panes" y peces si no en generar la donación de unos para con otros. Jesús prioriza la necesidad que tiene su pueblo, despertando inquietud frente a la insensibilidad y mentalidad mercantilista de sus seguidores. Para Jesús interés de interesarse por quienes tienen hambre no era un asunto de caridad así asistencialista, sino demostrar que, si dejamos de acaparar los bienes de la creación alcanzan y sobran. ? Cuál tradición eucarística hemos heredado ojalá que no reduzcamos nuestra participación en la eucaristía a un rito vacío, a una experiencia intimista, que me tranquiliza la conciencia, pero no me cambia interiormente. El símbolo sacramental del cuerpo y sangre de Cristo me invita a transformarme en eucaristía, alimento de vida para mi familia, mi comunidad, la sociedad en general, se pan partido y compartido con otros Amén Bendiciones para ti y tu toda tu familia.

LEADING OTHERS TO CATHOLICISM

Question:

My neighbor is just beginning to explore the Catholic faith but was raised agnostic. I grew up believing in God, praying, and attending Mass. How does one start from scratch as an adult to develop a relationship with God?

Answer:

Start on a personal level! How did you and your neighbor become friends? How did you begin to discuss such a personal topic as faith? Communication, spending time together, and getting to know each other are essential to forming the bonds of a relationship. Personal prayer is essential to our relationship with God. We can't be close to someone we don't know! Invite your friend to explore the stories of Jesus in the Bible. Introduce them to the lives of the saints, especially ones you think they might be interested in.

Your neighbor might also have questions about the Catholic faith that you don't know how to answer. If your friend hasn't yet enrolled in RCIA classes, invite them to Mass at your parish. Introduce your friend to the faith formation director to make a connection. Personal support can be helpful as well, especially if few of your neighbor's current friends are practicing their faith. Connect your neighbor to other people in your parish living their faith well. The good examples of other faithful people could help your neighbor to feel welcomed and supported. 
