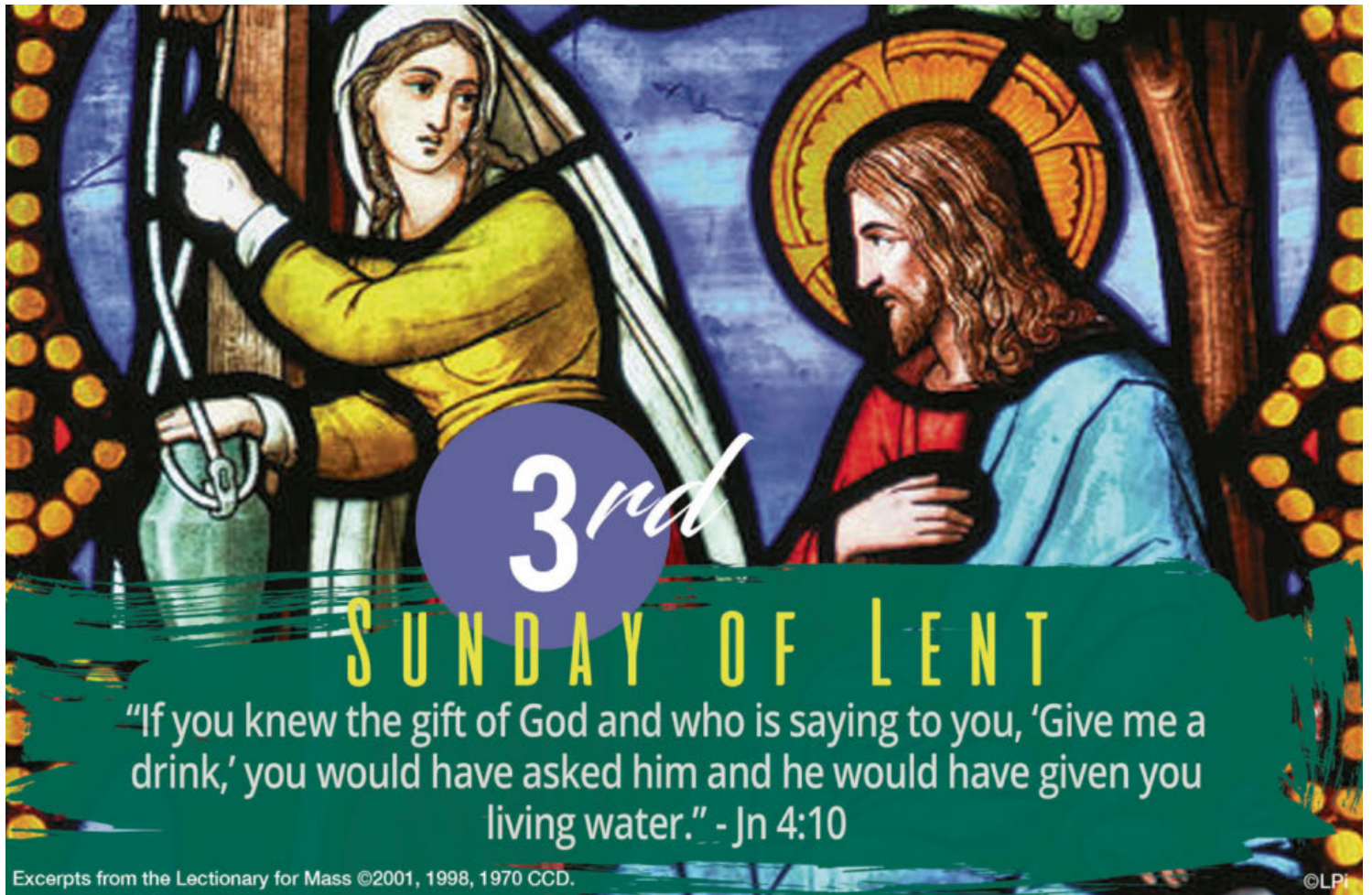

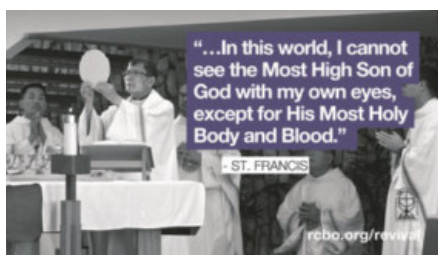

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

REFLECTION FOR THE THIRD SUNDAY IN LENT

If you would have asked me on the morning of my confirmation what the chances were of the Holy Spirit getting into my heart, I would have told you they were about the same as getting water from a stone.

My faith was fragile at this time in my life, primarily because I viewed it as exactly that — my faith.

Something within my possession and subject to my own power. And I hadn't done the things I thought I needed to do in order to be the kind of Christian who knows the truth and lives it. I was waiting to be made stronger. I was waiting to be made more faithful. I was waiting for a transformation.

Little did I know, I was like the woman at the well, standing around talking about the coming of the Messiah, unaware that he was standing right in front of me. She wasn't ready; she was still living in her sin. She was caught so unawares that she left her water jar at the well, rushing out to tell what she had seen.

When I was anointed with the oil it no longer mattered that I wasn't strong enough to break open the stone that I was convinced encased my heart — God's grace gushed forth through the cracks. While I certainly didn't become a perfect Christian — and never will, in this life — I did learn that when God tells you to strike, it's probably best not to second-guess Him.

REFLEXIÓN PARA

EL TERCERA DOMINGO DE CUARESMA

Si me hubieras preguntado en la mañana de mi confirmación cuáles eran las posibilidades de que el Espíritu Santo entrara en mi corazón, te habría dicho que eran casi las mismas que sacar agua de una piedra.

Mi fe era frágil en ese momento de mi vida, principalmente porque la veía exactamente como eso: mi fe. Algo dentro de mi posesión y sujeta a mi propio poder. Y no había hecho las cosas que pensé que tenía que hacer para ser el tipo de cristiana que conoce la verdad y la vive. Estaba esperando a ser más fuerte. Estaba esperando a ser más fiel. Estaba esperando una transformación.

Sin saberlo, yo era como la mujer en el pozo, de pie hablando de la venida del Mesías, sin saber que Él estaba parado justo frente a mí. Ella no estaba lista; todavía estaba viviendo en su pecado. La tomó tan desprevenida que dejó su cántaro de agua en el pozo y salió corriendo a contar lo que había visto. Cuando fui ungida con el aceite, ya no importaba que no fuera lo suficientemente fuerte como para abrir la piedra que estaba convencida encerraba mi corazón: la gracia de Dios brotó a través de las grietas. Si bien ciertamente no me convertí en una cristiana perfecta, y nunca lo haré en esta vida, aprendí que cuando Dios te dice que golpees, probablemente sea mejor no cuestionarlo.

DO YOU KNOW...

Should the Holy Water fonts be emptied during lent?

Despite its popularity in some places, this practice is not permitted, in fact it is prohibited. It has been the Church's practice to empty the holy water fonts during Triduum, but for a different reason. It is not permitted to have them empty through the whole season of Lent. The Congregation for Divine Worship has stated: The removing of Holy Water from the fonts during the season of Lent is not permitted, in particular, for two reasons:

1. The season of Lent, which though truly being a season of penance, is also a season rich in the symbolism of water and baptism, constantly evoked in liturgical texts.
2. The encouragement of the Church that the faithful avail themselves frequently of the sacraments is to be understood to apply also in the season of Lent. The "fast" and "abstinence" which the faithful embrace in this season does not extend to abstaining from the sacraments or sacramentals of the Church. As spoken about previously in a "Do You Know", when we dip our fingers into Holy Water and make the sign of the cross, we are reminding ourselves of our sacrament of baptism.

¿SABES...

¿Se deben vaciar las pilas de agua bendita durante la cuaresma?

A pesar de su popularidad en algunos lugares, esta práctica no está permitida, de hecho está prohibida. Ha sido práctica de la Iglesia vaciar las pilas de agua bendita durante el Triduo, pero por una razón diferente. No está permitido tenerlos vacíos durante todo el tiempo de Cuaresma. La Congregación para el Culto Divino ha declarado: No está permitido sacar el Agua Bendita de las fuentes durante el tiempo de Cuaresma, en particular, por dos motivos:

1. El tiempo de Cuaresma, que es verdaderamente un tiempo de penitencia, es también un tiempo rico en el simbolismo del agua y del bautismo, evocado constantemente en los textos litúrgicos.
2. El estímulo de la Iglesia de que los fieles se aprovechen frecuentemente de los sacramentos debe entenderse que se aplica también en el tiempo de Cuaresma. El "ayuno" y la "abstinencia" que abrazan los fieles en este tiempo no se extiende a la abstención de los sacramentos o sacramentales de la Iglesia. Como se mencionó anteriormente en un "¿Sabes?", cuando sumergimos nuestros dedos en agua bendita y hacemos la señal de la cruz, nos estamos recordando a nosotros mismos de nuestro sacramento del bautismo.

What You Give Up For Lent Changes Lives

St. Angela Merici OPERATION RICE BOWL-2023 Stories of Hope.

Rony lives with his wife Reina and their two sons, Emilson, age 14, and Maynor, age 9, about two hours from Tegucigalpa, the capital of Honduras.

Like many children in Latin America, Emilson loves to play soccer. And when his parents asked him about his future, he didn't hesitate to say he wanted to become a professional soccer player.

"We have to make an effort," Reina told Rony. "I know that with God's help, everything can be done."

So, despite the distance and the expenses involved, Rony took a leap of faith and enrolled Emilson in a soccer academy in Tegucigalpa.

Rony is a farmer who grows corn, beans and bananas. But it's hard to get good harvests working in the Dry Corridor—an area impacted by high temperatures and lack of rain. Droughts have become more frequent and storms stronger.

"Nowadays, we don't know when winter starts or when it ends," explains Rony. Determined to support Emilson's dream, Rony participated in a Catholic Relief Services project, which helped him repair an old reservoir and install a low-cost irrigation system with pipes and hoses that uses very little water to grow his crops. He also learned to let the harvest residue rot—instead of burning the land—because the residue becomes the soil's fertilizer.

Thanks to the watering system and his new skills, Rony can harvest his crops even if it doesn't rain. His produce and income are now enough to feed his family, pay the soccer academy's fees and help people in his community.

Today, Rony has even become an advocate for caring for the environment. And he feels it is his responsibility that others do too.

"I have learned a lot about how to take care of, value and protect the natural resources that the Lord has given us, such as water," he says. "That's the best way to guarantee the lives of our families and the animals."

I've been a parishioner of St. Angela Merici since the early 1960s. Many times, I would listen to the announcements for the Adoration chapel and think, 'Why would I go to the Adoration chapel and ask God for something when I come to church and pray here?'

Then about 5 years ago my mom's health declined, and she was confined to her wheelchair. I was thinking of ways to get her out of the house and help her spiritually. She had always gone to adoration when she was healthy, so I decided to take her (in her wheelchair) each Wednesday night. She loved it and looked forward to it each week.

At first, I would focus on my mom – turning her pages and always making sure she felt secure and comforted.

Then I started to notice the Divine Mercy picture of Jesus looking at me. No matter where I sat - Jesus was still looking me!

Slowly I decided to embrace the idea of praying to the Blessed Sacrament while taking mom – I thought, why not? I brought my holy cards and prayed alongside mom each week. Little did I know this would be one of the most precious memories of my life!

During this time my husband and I were facing a very difficult, life changing decision, that impacted our entire family. Each week I went and prayed for Jesus to guide us and show us his plan. This took some time, but slowly (over the next year) we started receiving direct signs and clear answers to our prayers.

I continued going to adoration to pray and surrender to God's will. Our trials didn't necessarily stop, however the signs, direction and graces kept coming! There is absolutely no doubt my prayers were heard and answered. I experienced many miracles beyond what I had ever imagined. This changed my life.

My mom has since passed. I still go to adoration to pray, seek guidance, and constantly thank God for all my blessings. But most of all, just spending time with the Blessed Sacrament brings me such peace and clarity. I believe this makes me a better person in this world.

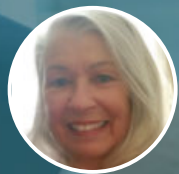
