Sunday Reflection and Weekly Readings FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

REFLECTION FOR

THE FIFTH SUNDAY IN LENT Of all Jesus' miracles, the most unsettling might be

three times when he did so: a girl, a young man, and

when he made a dead person alive. We know of

Lazarus. The miracle teaches us he has the power of life and death. He anticipates his resurrection. Sin hurts us. Some sin kills us, spiritually. The three miracles reveal to us that no matter our circumstances, Jesus can give life to us. The three miracles are instructive of the three ways we feel dead. The little dead girl symbolizes sin before it has time to mature. She's in bed and, once alive, gets right back to her life. The young man is lying in his casket in a funeral procession. This is sin allowed to fester, to grow and become somewhat normalized. Once raised, he has a short walk back home. Lazarus, a full-grown dead man, lies wrapped in burial bands in the tomb. Once he is raised, much needs to be

done. He'll need to remove those bands, find new clothes, and travel all the way back home. That is sin allowed to go all the way, unchecked for months or years. It's the most spectacular of the three and reveals Jesus' glory more than the others. What hope that should give us, for us and those whom we love! Jesus knows our sin hurts us and can even kill us spiritually. No matter the extent of the damage, he is always ready for the miracle of making the dead fully alive.

"El que está vivo y cree en mí, dice el Señor, no morirá para siempre" (Juan 11,26). Este es el séptimo y último milagro de Jesús en el Evangelio de Juan; como pasó con la samaritana, el diálogo se ve truncado a cada momento porque Jesús retoma las palabras dándoles un significado diferente (Comentario Biblia Latinoamérica edición revisada 2005). Martha y María, amigas de Jesús, estaban muy tristes por la muerte de su hermano Lázaro. Ellas pensaban que, si Jesús hubiese estado presente, él no habría muerto. Sin embargo, Lázaro murió para que el Hijo de Dios fuera glorificado. ¿Crees esto? ¿Qué piensas exactamente de la resurrección?

La respuesta de Jesús sobre la vida y la muerte va más allá y afirma: "Yo soy la resurrección y la vida. El que cree en mí, aunque muera, vivirá. El que vive, el que cree en mí, no morirá para siempre" (Juan 11,25). Que más claridad se puede tener, la convicción de la vida eterna es cuestión de fe no de convencimientos. Ahora, ya se acerca la pasión del Señor, que lo llevará a la muerte en la cruz, y se prepara para su gloriosa resurrección. Terminaremos la Cuaresma con la esperanza que todas las acciones buenas durante ese tiempo hayan sido realizadas con amor hacia cada miembro de la familia y comunidad. Que no sea una Cuaresma más, sino que se salga fuera de las tumbas del egoísmo y se luche incansablemente por una sociedad mejor. **©LP**

DO YOU KNOW...

How to dispose of blessed palms from last year?

Palms received on Palm Sunday are an ordinary object that has been transformed or elevated to a higher purpose that draws us — through their use — closer to Christ (because they have been blessed). As such, they should be treated with dignity and respect rather than simply thrown in the trash.

Therefore, the normal "rule of thumb" is that anything that has been blessed should be burned (and then the ashes buried) or simply buried. This type of disposal honors their sacred purpose and returns them to the earth in a dignified way. If you choose to bury blessed palms, a deep place of burial is not required. A few inches below the earth, where one can be reasonably be assured they will not be disturbed until they return back into the earth from whence they came is fine.

¿SABES...

¿Cómo deshacerse de las palmas benditas del año pasado?

Las palmas recibidas el Domingo de Ramos son un objeto ordinario que ha sido transformado o elevado a un propósito superior que nos acerca, a través de su uso, a Cristo (porque han sido bendecidos). Como tales, deben ser tratados con dignidad y respeto en lugar de simplemente tirarlos a la basura.

Por lo tanto, "la regla general" normal es que cualquier cosa que haya sido bendecida debe ser quemada (y luego enterradas las cenizas) o simplemente enterrada. Este tipo de disposición honra su propósito sagrado y los devuelve a la tierra de una manera digna. Si elige enterrar palmas benditas, no se requiere un lugar de entierro profundo. Unas pocas pulgadas debajo de la tierra, donde uno puede estar razonablemente seguro de que no serán perturbados hasta que regresen a la tierra de donde vinieron, está bien.

Turkana, Kenya is very hot and dry. Temperatures reach the mid-90s year-round. Most people in this area raise livestock such as goats and camels, and a few are farmers. But the climate makes this work difficult—and climate change is making it even harder.

Rebecca and her husband. Lotiang, have farmed



Rebecca and her husband, Lotiang, have farmed and raised goats for years. They rely on rain and river water to irrigate their crops and feed their animals. But it is raining less and less in Turkana, and—when it does rain—it can be unpredictable and intense, leading to floods that wash away the seeds.

"We struggled to water our farms," Rebecca says.

Rebecca and Luting have worked hard so their family can thrive. Their determination—and hope for their children's futures—helped them overcome the challenges they faced.

They participated in a Catholic Relief Services program that installed a water well in their village and trained them in new farming techniques. With the well and solar-powered pump, they can irrigate their fields regularly and take care of their goats. Their children love to help with the goats!

Lotiang learned to grow kale, which provides nutrition for his family and can be sold for a high price at the market. Rebecca is grateful that her children can eat healthy food every day. She is also happy that she can send them to school using money from the produce Lotiang sells at the market.

Rebecca and Lotiang have become leaders in their community and teach others what they learned so that everyone can benefit.

"I learned much in CRS' program," Rebecca says. "It is a program that has changed my life. I am trying to show my community what I am able to do so that they can emulate it for a better future. Through that I will change my community."

Adoration Chapel

I've been a parishioner of St. Angela Merici since the early 1960s. Many times, I would listen to the announcements for the Adoration chapel and think, 'Why would I go to the Adoration chapel and ask God for something when I come to church and pray here?'

Then about 5 years ago my mom's health declined, and she was confined to her wheelchair. I was thinking of ways to get her out of the house and help her spiritually. She had always gone to adoration when she was healthy, so I decided to take her (in her wheelchair) each Wednesday night. She loved it and looked forward to it each week.

At first, I would focus on my mom – turning her pages and always making sure she felt secure and comforted.

Then I started to notice the Devine Mercy picture of Jesus looking at me. No matter where I sat - Jesus was still looking me!

Slowly I decided to embrace the idea of praying to the Blessed Sacrament while taking mom —I thought, why not? I brought my holy cards and prayed alongside mom each week. Little did I know this would be one of the most precious memories of my life!

During this time my husband and I were facing a very difficult, life changing decision, that impacted our entire family. Each week I went and prayed for Jesus to guide us and show us his plan. This took some time, but slowly (over the next year) we started receiving direct signs and clear answers to our prayers.

I continued going to adoration to pray and surrender to God's will. Our trials didn't necessarily stop, however the signs, direction and graces kept coming! There is absolutely no doubt my prayers were heard and answered. I experienced many miracles beyond what I had ever imagined. This changed my life.

My mom has since passed. I still go to adoration to pray, seek guidance, and constantly thank God for all my blessings. But most of all, just spending time with the Blessed Sacrament brings me such peace and clarity. I believe this makes me a better person in this world.
