FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

REFLECTION FOR PALM SUNDAY

As Christ reclined at the Passover meal and his impending betrayal, I have to imagine at least one of the disciples thought to himself, incredulously and perhaps even indignantly: And you're not going to do anything about it?

So often we expect God to behave like the frantic parent of a teenager, banging down the closed door of a bedroom filled with loud music. We expect him to be overbearing, snooping in our diary and waiting to ground us the minute we break curfew, desperate to keep us within the family fold, ready and willing to use judgment and force to do so.

It's true that God greatly desires us to stay in friendship with him. But to accomplish it, he does not come to us as a meddler or an overlord. He comes in the same way he does on Palm Sunday. He waits for us to make way.

He may not be overbearing, but he is still devoted, and unfailingly patient. As the Palm Sundays of our lives — the moments of our devotion and piety — give way to the Holy Thursdays, when we inevitably deny him, God does not abandon us. The sacrifice on the cross is still there, waiting for us to accept it.

Say to daughter Zion, "Behold, your king comes to you, meek and riding on an ass, and on a colt, the foal of a beast of burden." — Matthew 21:5

REFLEXIÓN PARA DOMINGO DE PALMA

Mientras Cristo se reclinaba en la cena de Pascua y su traición inminente, tengo que imaginar que al menos uno de los discípulos pensó para sí mismo, con incredulidad y tal vez incluso con indignación: ¿Y no vas a hacer nada al respecto?

Muy a menudo esperamos que Dios se comporte como el padre frenético de un adolescente, golpeando la puerta cerrada de un dormitorio lleno de música a todo volumen. Esperamos que sea dominante, husmeando en nuestro diario y esperando castigarnos en el momento en que rompamos nuestro horario límite, desesperado por mantenernos dentro del redil familiar, listo y dispuesto a usar el juicio y la fuerza para hacerlo.

Es cierto que Dios desea mucho que permanezcamos en amistad con él. Pero para lograrlo, no viene a nosotros como un entrometido o un señor supremo. Viene de la misma manera que lo hace el Domingo de Ramos. Él espera que le abramos paso.

Puede que no sea dominante, pero sigue siendo devoto e indefectiblemente paciente. Mientras los Domingos de Ramos de nuestra vida, los momentos de nuestra devoción y piedad, dan paso a los Jueves Santos, cuando inevitablemente lo negamos, Dios no nos abandona. El sacrificio en la cruz todavía está ahí, esperando que lo aceptemos.

DO YOU KNOW...

How to dispose of blessed palms from last year?

Palms received on Palm Sunday are an ordinary object that has been transformed or elevated to a higher purpose that draws us — through their use — closer to Christ (because they have been blessed). As such, they should be treated with dignity and respect rather than simply thrown in the trash.

Therefore, the normal "rule of thumb" is that anything that has been blessed should be burned (and then the ashes buried) or simply buried. This type of disposal honors their sacred purpose and returns them to the earth in a dignified way. If you choose to bury blessed palms, a deep place of burial is not required. A few inches below the earth, where one can be reasonably assured they will not be disturbed until they return back into the earth from whence they came is fine.

¿SABES...

¿Cómo deshacerse de las palmas benditas del año pasado?

Las palmas recibidas el Domingo de Ramos son un objeto ordinario que ha sido transformado o elevado a un propósito superior que nos acerca, a través de su uso, a Cristo (porque han sido bendecidos). Como tales, deben ser tratados con dignidad y respeto en lugar de simplemente tirarlos a la basura.

Por lo tanto, "la regla general" normal es que cualquier cosa que haya sido bendecida debe ser quemada (y luego enterradas las cenizas) o simplemente enterrada. Este tipo de disposición honra su propósito sagrado y los devuelve a la tierra de una manera digna. Si elige enterrar palmas benditas, no se requiere un lugar de entierro profundo. Unas pocas pulgadas debajo de la tierra, donde uno puede estar razonablemente seguro de que no serán perturbados hasta que regresen a la tierra de donde vinieron, está bien.

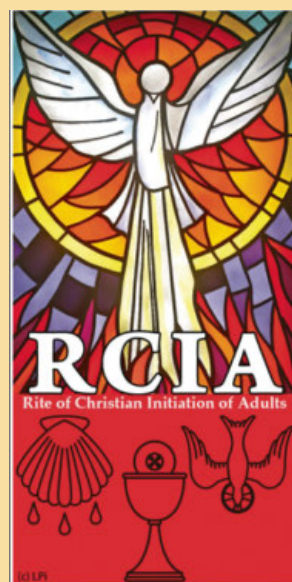

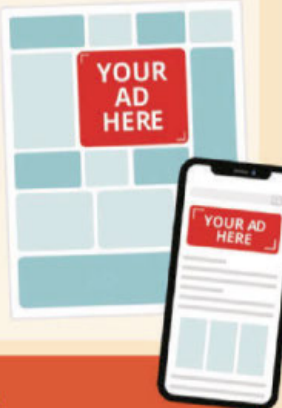

"Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross." — Philippians 2:7-8

Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week, one of the most significant moments of the Church year.

During this week, we journey with Christ from his triumphant entry into Jerusalem to his final meal with his closest friends and ultimately to his death on the cross.

As we walk with Jesus through Holy Week, we call to mind the countless men, women and children who even today carry heavy crosses: crosses of hunger, of homelessness, of a lack of resources or security. In these brothers and sisters we encounter Christ, as he walks that long road to Calvary. In these encounters, it's important not to forget an essential pillar of Lenten spirituality—almsgiving—which allows us to help those who are most in need.

This final week of Lent is also a time to reflect on those words of Saint Paul to the Philippians. Jesus emptied himself for us; how might we empty ourselves for others? Our Lenten prayers, fasting and almsgiving have prepared us to wrestle with this question.

We must always remember that Holy Week gives way to Easter—the fast turns into a feast. God wins the day. As we prepare to celebrate Easter with joy, it is our responsibility as members of God's one human family to share that joy with everyone, near and far.

With little understanding, but with a thirst and need for GOD to be present in the emptiness of my life, I began to spend time in front of the Blessed Sacrament. I frequently came in with tears of disappointment from my strained marriage, my empty womb, and a misplaced consolation in the busyness of my job, family, and volunteer service. I knelt before Jesus; fully present in body, blood, and soul. In sobs, in overwhelm and exhaustion, searching, feeling empty, and hurting both physically and emotionally from childhood trauma, I persisted in hope. Hope in what? In whom? And how, when, and why? I wasn't sure, but it was HIS love, HIS longing for "me" that kept bringing me back. Jesus was patient with me as I sat for weeks in front of the Blessed Sacrament, reading my book, "God, Why Can't I Have a Baby?" It has been over 15 years and I still do not know the answer. This short story may be more powerful, more interesting, maybe even more entertaining, if I told you that my marriage was miraculously saved, that I miraculously got pregnant, that somehow I got healed from past wounds, and that I balanced out my life. Instead, as only God can do, He showed me the miracle of HIS loving Presence in the Blessed Sacrament, day in and day out. My marriage failed; I never had a baby; I worked harder than ever at my job and volunteer services; and I continued to hurt from the childhood trauma of parental molestation. But you see, my suffering now meant something more. I was suffering while in the arms of Jesus, and He began to heal me gently, softly, slowly, and with such loving care. In front of the Blessed Sacrament, Jesus filled me with courage to forgive and surrender all to HIM, to His perfect will. THIS is His amazing grace. He used the 4 ½ years of marital separation to grow and heal both my husband and I. We are now peacefully and joyfully still married and together. He even sent us on a missionary trip to Haiti. Though the adoption of two Haitian boys became impossible, with the Lord's goodness, today we continue to sponsor them, and I communicate with them daily. He sent me the right people to coach me through balancing work and other aspects of life an arduous process when work becomes your choice of distraction to numb the pain. It is Christ who lives in me who equips me to not only forgive my father, but also enables me to be my father's medical advocate, as I care for him in his old age. And we even enjoy some meals together. None of this has been easy, but in Christ all things are possible. In the Lord's Holy Presence, I'm overflowing with His love. I'm now able to share this love with my husband, our Haitian sons, my family, friends, and the many others whom I bring to His feet in prayer. Please, come visit our Lord in the Adoration Chapel. Make a commitment for an hour a week, or more. Jesus listens. Jesus loves you. He knows you, and He waits for you in the Adoration Chapel. Any time, any day. Jesus will equip you with exactly what you need, in His perfect will. Faith, hope, love; His free gifts are for each of you. I hope you'll pray and consider spending time with Jesus in the Adoration Chapel.

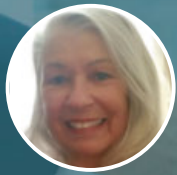
