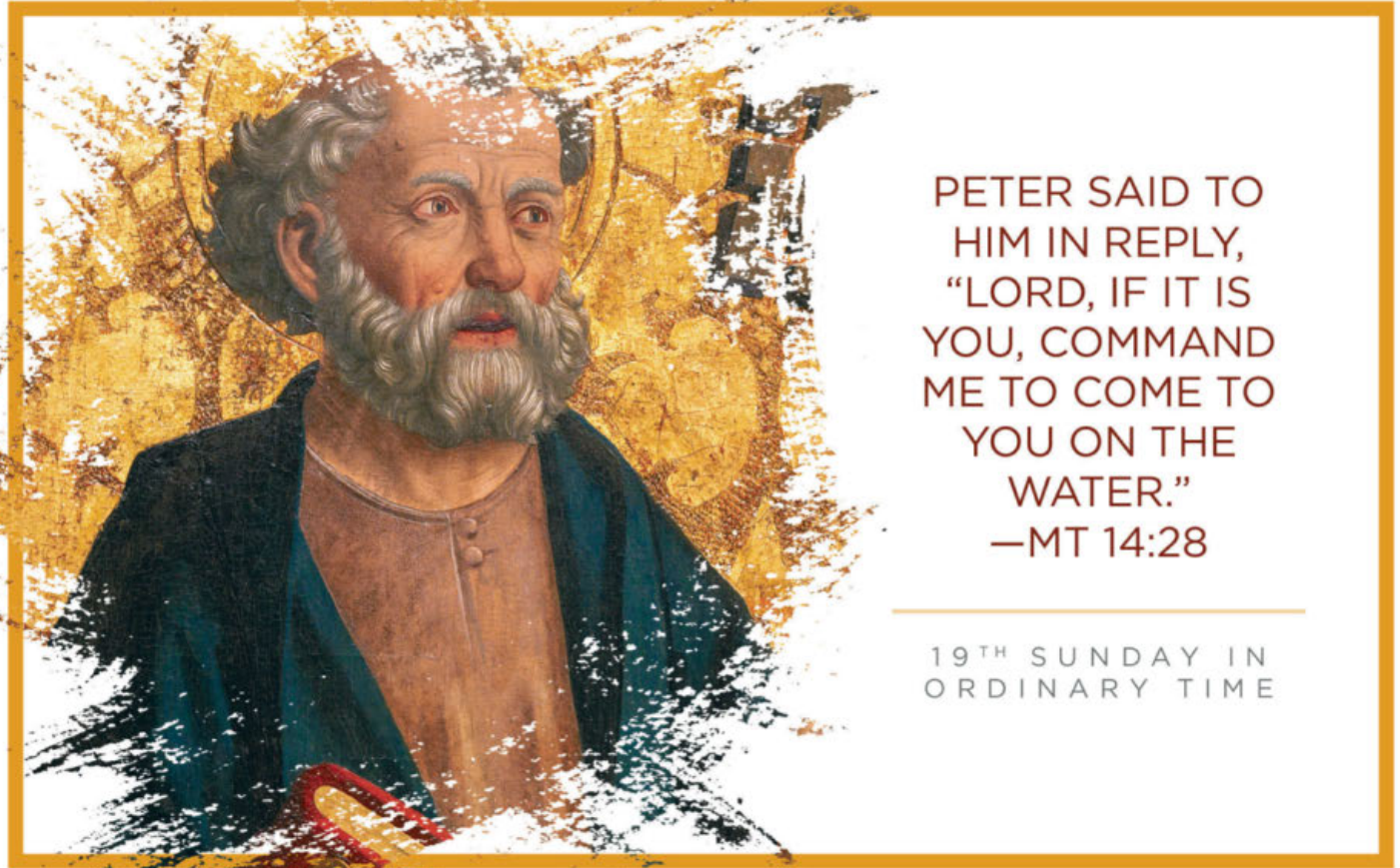

Sunday Reflection and Weekly Readings FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

REFLECTION FOR THE 19TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

A man at my parish was struggling to overcome a habitual sin. He said to me, "Father, I know the chance that I will commit sin again is really high. Why should I keep confessing my sins? Isn't that dishonest?" Anyone who has felt the tyrannical power of sin — and who hasn't? — has pondered this kind of question.

I responded to him, "What was the probability Peter would walk on the stormy water?" After some silence, he said, "Zero. But when Jesus called, he did it." I could tell my penitent friend was re-framing the question from his own weakness to the greatness of the Lord's love for him. The question for us should not be one of human probabilities about our sin, but rather whether or not we will trust the Lord's grace in our lives.

This week the Lord is calling you and me to do the impossible: overcome sin with love. The only way to do that is to trust he is calling, and then to walk with the eyes of faith locked on him. And if we sink, he will raise us up again and again. Of that, we can be 100% sure.

REFLEXIÓN PARA EL 19TH DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

Este pasaje de Mateo nos lleva a reflexionar sobre la importancia de la fe y de cómo la profesamos a lo largo de nuestra vida. Desarrollar la fe es un proceso que da comienzo el día de nuestro bautismo. En ese momento fue plantada la semilla de la fe. Ya de adultos, escuchar la Palabra de Dios nos ayuda a enfrentar las tormentas cotidianas. A veces se tambalea nuestra fe. Pareciera que nada vale la pena y es cuando acudimos al Señor, como Pedro en el Evangelio, y viene el grito de: ¡Sálvame, Señor! de la incertidumbre, del miedo y de la falta de paz en nuestras ciudades, en las familias y en nuestros corazones. A pesar de nuestra poca fe, queremos ser fieles a Jesús y sus enseñanzas. Solo él puede salvarnos.

Aunque vacile a causa de mis debilidades, tómate de tu mano y llévame hacia ti. Porque tú no eres un fantasma, eres el Hijo de Dios. Eres quien me tranquiliza, me da paz y serenidad para discernir, con la ayuda del Espíritu Santo, lo mejor para salvarme, para salvarnos en familia, en comunidad. Para eso tenemos su Palabra y la Iglesia que nos ayuda y guía en todos los tiempos. "Cerca está su salvación de los que le temen y habitará su Gloria en nuestra tierra. La Gracia y la Verdad se han encontrado, la Justicia y la Paz se han abrazado; de la tierra está brotando la verdad, y del cielo se asoma la justicia" (Salmo 85:10-12). La meta de este domingo de fe, es siempre confiar en el Señor y no en nosotros mismos.

DO YOU KNOW...

Assumption Day commemorates the belief that when Mary, the mother of Jesus Christ, died, her body was "assumed" into heaven to be reunited with her soul, instead of going through the natural process of physical decay upon death. On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII defined the Assumption of Mary to be a dogma of faith: "We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma that the immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory." The pope proclaimed this dogma only after a broad consultation of bishops, theologians and laity. What the pope declared was already common belief in the Catholic Church.

¿SABÍAS QUE...

El Día de la Asunción conmemora la creencia de que cuando María, la madre de Jesucristo, murió, su cuerpo fue "asunto" al cielo para reunirse con su alma, en lugar de pasar por el proceso natural de descomposición física al morir.

El 1 de noviembre de 1950, el Papa Pío XII definió la Asunción de María como un dogma de fe: "Pronunciamos, declaramos y definimos como dogma divinamente revelado que la inmaculada Madre de Dios, la siempre Virgen María, habiendo cumplido la curso de su vida terrena, fue asunta en cuerpo y alma a la gloria celestial".

El Papa proclamó este dogma sólo después de una amplia consulta de obispos, teólogos y laicos. Lo que el Papa declaró ya era creencia común en la Iglesia Católica.

10 Things That Happen When You Go To Adoration More Often

1. You develop a sense of awe and wonder. There is nothing like the atmosphere of a quiet chapel or church, the smell of incense and the splendor of the monstrance to help you understand the truth of what is happening in Adoration. We are truly before Jesus Christ, His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. The more you sink into that silence in front of the Host, the more you'll realize the only response is awe and wonder at the greatness of our God.

2. You experience peace in other areas of your life. Jesus said, "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you." (John 14:27) The outward peace we can experience in Adoration (the quiet and the stillness) reaches much deeper. It leads to an inner peace that affects all areas of our lives. It doesn't mean everything in our life will be perfect and without suffering, but Christ's peace means we know the storms of life can't shake us.

3. You begin to look outwardly. Jesus told us to "love one another as I have loved you". (John 13:34) Spending time in Adoration connects us to the whole world – after all, we're spending time with the Creator of all things! More time praising and adoring God means you can look beyond your own concerns and see the needs of others in your life and in the world, we live in.

4. You get bored sometimes. There are going to be times when Adoration can feel anything but glorious. You get distracted, your mind begins to wander, you can hear someone else sniffing next to you. Maybe in the beginning, Adoration was full of wonderful feelings! Regular Adoration is when daily life sets in, and it can make it feel not so special. But that doesn't devalue or take away from the truth of what Adoration is. Our faith is more than feelings and God will still be working in you. This is the beauty of the Incarnation—God made man, coming into all our stresses, fears, problems—and yes, boredom. Know that even if an hour spent in Adoration is a continual returning to Him every few minutes when your mind wanders, you are still giving God the best gift you can—your time and company.

5. But you become excited going to Adoration. The more time you spend in Adoration discovering that God is a God who loves you and wants to spend time with you, the more you begin to actually *want* to go. If Adoration once felt like a chore, you might even find yourself becoming excited to go! Adoration is addictive, not just because of the things we can gain for ourselves, but because we were *created* to adore. As we say in the Mass, it is "*right and just*" that we should give thanks to the Lord! Adoration is imprinted on our hearts and "*our hearts are restless until they find our rest in Him*"! (Thanks, St. Augustine!)

6. Grace enters your life. It's amazing how a simple act of committing to even a short time of regular Adoration makes such a huge difference to the rest of your life. You can carry that moment of being in His presence with you long after you've left the church or chapel. His grace sustains you in every moment, especially in moments of temptation. Temptation becomes easier to resist when you're spending more time in Adoration. Sometimes, it really is that straightforward.

7. You realize how fortunate you are. If it is as simple for you as getting in the car and driving to Adoration at church, or even walking to the chapel nearby, you realize how much you can take it for granted. There are those who would love to spend more time with Jesus in Adoration but who are housebound, sick, or busy parents. Then there are those around the world who risk their lives for the Eucharist, in places where they are persecuted for their faith. When you remember those who walk for hours or days in dangerous situations in order to be present with Jesus, you realize what a gift it is to be able to pray openly, not to mention having a priest to minister the sacraments.

8. You realize God has a sense of humor. The more you are able to sit and let God speak to you (instead of spending all your time filling the silence with talking to Him), you'll find that God has a really good sense of humor. He likes a joke or two, and sometimes these moments are funny enough to make you want to laugh out loud. Surprising, maybe, but don't the best fathers show you their love by affectionate good humor?!?

9. You want to go to Confession more. This might sound scary, but it's not. Confession allows us to experience the mighty boundless ocean that is God's mercy. His mercy swallows up all our sins and gives us a true kind of freedom, a freedom without fear, which allows us to make the leap into His love and goodness, complete with all His perfect plans for our life. Time and time again, going to Confession re-enforces the knowledge that we are jumping into the arms of a Father who loves us very much and "*never tires of forgiving us*." (Pope Francis)

10. You fall in love! Ultimately, you can't help this one! When you spend more time with an open heart in Adoration and just let Christ love you, then you'll fall in love too. That love will define you and allow you to be yourself. "*I came that they may have life, life in all its fullness*." (John 10:10)

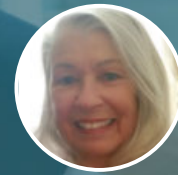

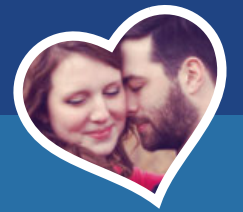
