REFLECTION FOR THE SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

The World Is Pregnant

There is a character, Rose of Sharon, in John Steinbeck's *Grapes of Wrath* who is pregnant with her first child. As her impoverished family migrates from their native Oklahoma to California, Rose of Sharon's all-consuming preoccupation is her unborn child. Everything she eats, every drink she lets pass her lips, every action she takes — none of it is done without thought for the child that is still so small as to make his mother's expectancy barely discernible to the naked eye.

"For Rose of Sharon was pregnant," wrote Steinbeck.

"And the world was pregnant to her."

It is the same for us Christians in the Advent season. We can feel a change coming, and the hope of this change consumes us. It shapes our actions and our plans, we feel it in our hearts and in our souls and in our limbs. From the food we eat to the clothing we wear to the words we use, the unseen Child lives and breathes and works in every small part of this blessed season.

Even the commercial clamor that is the secular "Christmas holiday" cannot fully distract us from the holy sense of anticipation we have. We are baptized, and so it is inside of us, this voice that cries out in the desert.

When we hear it, we cannot help but listen.

The Virgin is pregnant, and the world is pregnant to us.

A medida que su familia empobrecida emigra de su Oklahoma natal a California, la preocupación que todo lo consume de Rose of Sharon es su hijo por nacer. Todo lo que come, cada trago que deja pasar por sus labios, cada acción que

realiza, nada de eso lo hace sin pensar en el niño que todavía es tan pequeño que hace que la expectativa de su madre sea apenas perceptible a simple vista.

"Porque Rose of Sharon estaba embarazada," escribió Steinbeck. "Y el mundo estaba embarazado para ella."

Es lo mismo para nosotros los cristianos en la temporada de Adviento. Podemos sentir que se acerca un cambio, y la esperanza de este cambio nos consume. Da forma a nuestras acciones y nuestros planes, lo sentimos en nuestros corazones y en nuestras almas y en nuestras extremidades. Desde la comida que comemos hasta la ropa que usamos y las palabras que decimos, el Niño invisible vive, respira y trabaja en cada pequeña parte de esta bendita temporada.

Incluso el clamor comercial que es la "fiesta de Navidad" secular no puede distraernos por completo del sentido sagrado de anticipación que tenemos. Somos bautizados, y así, está dentro de nosotros, esta voz que clama en el desierto. Cuando la oímos, no podemos evitar escuchar. La Virgen está embarazada, y el mundo está embarazado para nosotros.

DO YOU KNOW...

What's the story behind the Advent wreath?

During the Advent season, wreaths adorn church sanctuaries and family dining room tables. The Advent wreath is full of symbolism about Christ and His coming at Christmas. The wreath is made of evergreen boughs, reminding us that the life of grace doesn't falter with the changing seasons. It always remains fresh and new. Similarly, a circular wreath reminds us of the eternal, never-ending nature of God's love.

Candles remind us that Christ is the light of the world, the One who "shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." We use four candles to represent each week of Advent. The Purple candles represent penance and sacrifice. On the third Sunday of Advent, Gaudete (meaning "rejoice") Sunday, we light a rose colored candle. Whatever the color and whatever the day, the Advent wreath is a beautiful practice to focus our attention on Christ's coming at Christmas.

¿SABÍAS QUE...

¿Cuál es la historia detrás de la corona de Adviento?

Durante la temporada de Adviento, las coronas adornan los santuarios de las iglesias y las mesas de los comedores familiares. La corona de Adviento está llena de simbolismo sobre Cristo y su venida en Navidad. La corona está hecha de ramas de hoja perenne, lo que nos recuerda que la vida de la gracia no flaquea con el cambio de estaciones. Siempre permanece fresco y nuevo. De manera similar, una corona circular nos recuerda la naturaleza eterna e interminable del amor de Dios.

Las velas nos recuerdan que Cristo es la luz del mundo, Aquel que "brilla en las tinieblas, y las tinieblas no lo vencieron". Usamos cuatro velas para representar cada semana de Adviento. Las velas moradas representan penitencia y sacrificio. El tercer domingo de Adviento, domingo de Gaudete (que significa "alegre"), encendemos una vela de color rosa. Cualquiera que sea el color y el día, la corona de Adviento es una hermosa práctica para centrar nuestra atención en la venida de Cristo en Navidad.

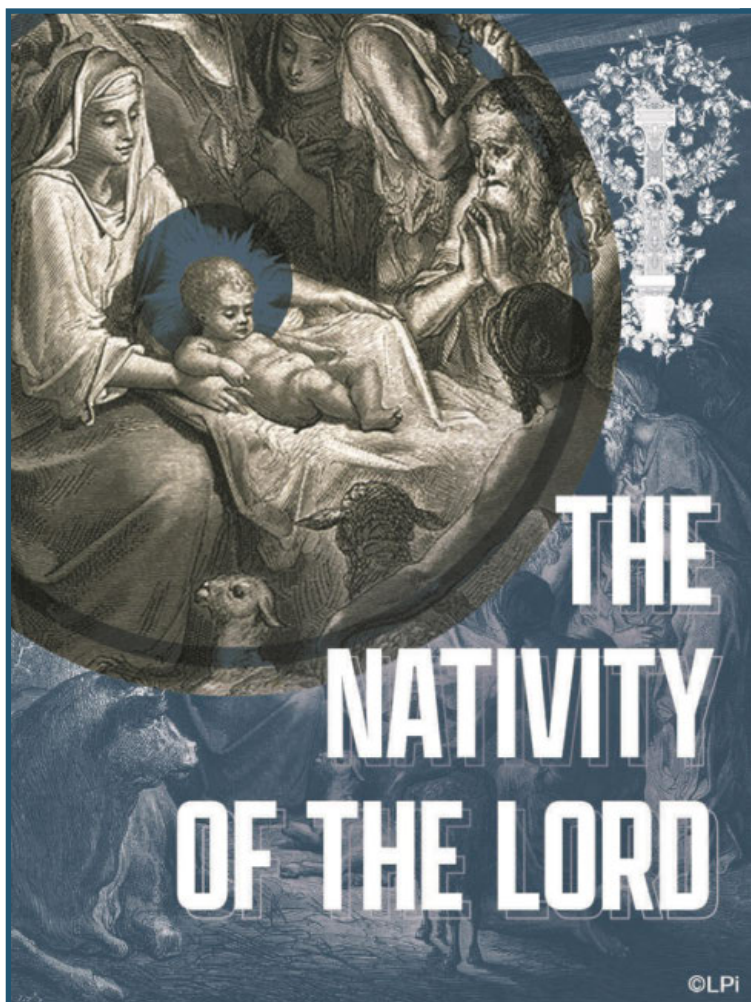

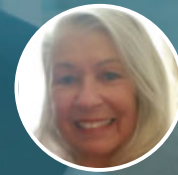

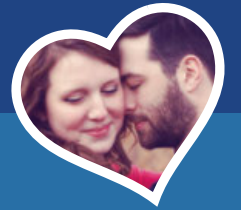
